

Hello-Neighbors!

We are Wayne & Karen Jewell... We bought #263 in WW-II.in-2018 when Karen's mom's dementia required more support and visits from family. Her parents, neat & Stan-Qagtags, were one of the original share owners--moving across Alt-19 from their.Bay. View.home.into.the.coach.at.#450... They loved it here!-

While-our-first-few-years-were-busy-with-their-care, (while-managing-full-time-jobs), r last-year-showed-us-how-wonderful-life-in-WW-II-could-be!

We have four adult children and seven grandchildren ranging in ages from 3.—12.1 Our family is spread out among Rochester Hills and <u>Ludington</u>, MI, Chesapeake, VA1 and Pinellas Park, FL.1

Wayne has worked in building safety, building code development and construction codes enforcement for 44 years. He is best known in the industry for Means of Egress (including high-rise) and window safety. He was called to the White House for help with means of egress following the bombing in the underground garage of the World Trade-Center w

#### Wayne moderates international code

Changes made as a result of adaptations made by the Port Authority in the Twin Towers saved thousands of lives on 9/11. Wayne advocated for 10 years to improve window safety in high rise apartment buildings. Children were falling out of windows - causing serious injury or even death because screens aren't safety devices.

My "career" had much more variety. We licensed our home for childcare, which allowed me to stay home while our children were young. I started a DJ business named "Jewell Productions" and specialized in weddings, family reunions and, unbelievably, became the DJ of choice at our children's high school. (Imagine having YOUR mom DJing your Senior Prom!)

I worked various other jobs, all in nonprofit. I worked with organizations whose missions I supported; hoping to help make these organizations more effective and better equipped for their important work.

I "retired" in Oct. of 2020. It was a hard adjustment for me, but timely as my mom's health declined. I was able to be in Florida for months at

a time, doing "window visits" during covid and providing what support I could for the management at the facility where mom lived. Mom (Pat) passed in Feb. 2021. Dad (Stan) had passed in Jan. 2019.

Wayne is currently working his way toward retirement. He really enjoys his work. He's finding ways to share his experience and knowledge - through serving in our local communities.

We both enjoy our family - especially our grandchildren. Last summer, we hosted our first annual "Grandparents' Camp" sharing 13 days of adventure with our oldest 5, with the youngest two (and parents) joining us for the last 4 days over the 4th of July holiday. We visited museums, playgrounds, splash parks... We rented paddle boats, went fishing, tubing on the Rifle River, and had epic nerf battles in our backyard! For Christmas this year, each family received a picture book full of memories from our 2023 Camp. It was fun watching the kids re-live those memories!

We hope to do more of that, both for ourselves and our children and Grands. Wayne and I love to fish – especially fly-fishing. There are many rivers we'd like to visit around the country!

We're both excited to learn more about our American history – especially the parts left-out of our high school and college courses. The middle tile counts as the start of a player's multiple tile train.







