On a Civic note. Pinellas County Elections office just published their new Voter Handbook tri-fold regarding election information. If you are new Full- Time resident of Florida or have never registered and would like to. 2024 Elections dates are:

March 19th, 2024 Presidential Preference Primary & Municipal Elections. Registration deadline February 20th, 2024. Early Voting March 9th – 17th, 2024.

August 20th, 2024 Primary Election. Registration deadline July 22nd, 2024. Early Voting **August 10th** – 18th, 2024.

November 5th, 2024 General Election. Registration deadline October 7th, 2024. Early Voting October 21st – November 3rd, 2024.

If you had set yourself up to be a "Mail-in" ballot in previous years please make sure that process is still in place. New rules have gone into effect and the "mail-in" ballots will no longer be in effect indefinitely. You will need to call or log into the Pinellas Election Office and check to see if you are still set up for "mail-in" ballots. You should see a Valid through date listed if you use the Website. Make sure the mail in ballot is still in place. If the date shows expired you will need to re-set the mail-ballot back up. I believe it will be in effect for approximately *Continued on page 6*

The next few months will see much road work being done at Lincolnshire. If you have not already signed up to receive e-mails from Paul our Property Manager, please do so by going L to Lincolnshsire-estates.com and completing the information needed in the box provided on the lower right side of the page OR stop by the Business Office and ask them to get you set up to receive any e-mails and the monthly electronic newsletter from Paul. Paul is utilizing e-mail to notify us of important dates for road closures, water shutoffs (potable & non-potable) as well as any other important notifications.

We have also seen an addition of Residents liking our FYI Lincolnshire page. February Voice listed a total of 280 members as of this article writing, we are now up to 317 members. Many of our residents have been posting the notifications they receive from Paul on Facebook as well.

If you are "connected" to one or both these sources of information for Lincolnshire and know of a neighbor that is not, please reach out to them and let them know of anything that is of importance and may affect their day. We are still utilizing our Block Captains to reach out to residents when they are notified by Management of any "potable" water interruptions.

Don't forget the bulletin boards in the Mail/Laundry Room. Especially if you are not "connected" to any electronic notifications. Approximately half of our community gets their mail delivered directly to their homes. Because of this they do not necessarily visit the Mail/Laundry room on a Continued on page 11



efense Department Expands ID Card Renewals by Mail to US-Based Retirees, Dependents - Military retirees and their dependents based in the U.S. may now renew their military ID cards online and receive them by mail, relieving them



of a trip to the on-base ID card office. The Defense Department announced Tuesday that it's expanding a pilot program that began in 2023 and initially allowed certain dependents' Uniformed Services Identification cards, or USID, to be renewed by mail, this is the Retirees card!

Portions of the renewal process have previously been available online. However, the pilot program allows online ordering from start to finish. While in the past the renewed card had to be retrieved in person at a local ID card facility, it will instead be delivered by mail under the pilot program. After first offering the renewals by mail to dependents whose sponsors held a Common Access Card -- generally active-duty dependents -- the DoD will now allow the renewals for additional USID holders, who include U.S.-based retirees, their dependents and reservists. Out of the 4.5 million IDs of all types that the department issues every year, about one million are the USIDs of people based in the U.S., according to the news release announcing the pilot program expansion. The opportunity is only for people who already have a USID and need to renew it. Those applying for the first time will still need to go to an on-base office of the Real-Time Automated Personnel Identification System, or RAPIDS. Sponsors and cardholders may request renewals at the ID Card Office Online website. At the site, the sponsor must verify the dependent's identifying information and digitally sign a new Form DD 1172-2 to receive the renewed ID by mail.

Eligibility requirements:

The USID card being renewed is active (not expired), The card recipient has a photo in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) taken in the last 12 years, The card recipient has an email address saved in DEERS for communication, The card recipient has a physical address (not a post office box) saved in DEERS in the continental U.S., Alaska or Hawaii.

The Defense Manpower Data Center will create and mail the new card, emailing both the sponsor and cardholder when it has done so. An email will also be sent if the online renewal was not successful. Once the card arrives, the sponsor must log back into the ID Card Office Online website to acknowledge receiving it. Since military ID cards are considered government property, users are asked to return their old, replaced ID cards either by dropping them off at a local ID card office or by mailing them to:

A Nurse's Self Care Toolbox

There are considerable advertisements often disguised as proven information both on social media and television advertising on the newest weight loss medications along with value for diabetics. As a former diabetic and nutrition

education nurse, I see both the pros and cons. Seems the cons are in the fine detail so I will if from recognized diabetic and weight loss resources. They can be remarkably effective when used for the right reasons, for the right patient and prescribed by a monitoring medical provider. Both for diabetic control and non-diabetic weight loss (often leading to diabetes.)

Let us start with a stark reminder that about 40% of adults in the United States are obese, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates. Close to 40% of people fifty-five and older in Florida are obese. Seems moving here is not a cure though the weather can make it easier to reduce the percentage. Let us get outside as cannot slip on the ice.

There are current medications that stimulate our pancreas to produce more insulin and/or help the insulin increase the sugar getting into all our body cells, even fat cells. The sugar load comes from eating and drinking (other than water.) And newer oral medications that alter how the sugar from food breaks down in our small intestine. Injectable insulin is simply providing that essential hormone for those who do not make any or others who need that boost.

The newest injectables we see advertised are providing a more immediate and dramatic process of reducing the breakdown of food into sugar which is absorbed into our blood system. The results can be remarkable. Less sugar in the blood and our bodies own regulating system (why we stayed alive during famines) begins to breakdown body fat in to sugar (storage to market and use by our cells.) Often blood sugar levels including A1C's decline plus loss of weight!

For Type 2 Diabetics these new injectables can reduce sugar breakdown and absorption and provide helpful weight loss. However, there are always obstacles (cost), lack of a medical provider to monitor, limited supply for long term use, sham online marketeers of non-regulated or FDA approved suppliers (extreme risk), other and little guidance on weaning off these medications and continuing the other Diabetic care routines of proper eating and movement.

Next month I will try to explain more about the difficulties of their use. My first warning until then is do not order these online unless you have <u>gotten</u> a prescription from your physician and then only from an actual pharmacy. Until then chew well.
