May 1st is May Day, the return of Summer. May 1st was originally referred to as International Workers Day and Labor Day. This happened because on the first of May 1886 workers around the world went on strike demanding better working conditions and an eight-hour workday. Since then, we in the US and Canada celebrate Labor Day on the first Monday of September, and May Day is celebrated in the European fashion of Raising the May Pole and dancing around to celebrate the beginning of summer.

May 5th is Cinco de Mayo ("The Fifth of May"). This day celebrates the victory of the Mexican army over the French army at The Battle of Puebla in 1862. Now we celebrate it by eating Mexican Food and drinking Tequila.

May 28 is Armed Forces Day, which honors those who serve in all branches of the United States military.



Resident will then get a reply asking them to respond with their name and lot number, and once done, the registration is complete.

Parking Rules

his is a reminder RE: the parking rules as well as a few changes to occur effective Jan 1st.

Each home is allowed TWO cars per home, any extras must be removed from the property right away.

You will be towed for the following:

- 1. Parking in any space around the clubhouse, office or mailboxes between the hours of 8 am and 10 pm, unless you are using the amenities. (900-530 for the office)
- 2. Parking in any space around the clubhouse, office or mailboxes between the hours of 10 pm and 8 am without a RED hang tag or a YELLOW dated guest pass. (530-900 for the office) You can register for either at the office.



- 3. Parking on the street anytime between 1 am and 6 am.
- 4. Parking anywhere on the property without a general parking sticker.
- 5. Parking a commercial vehicle, anywhere on property. This would be any vehicle with any advertising on it. Or any vehicle that is used for commercial rather than personal use.

- No pet enclosures, including, but not limited to dog houses, are allowed. Pets must be kept inside RESIDENT'S manufactured home if unattended.
- Excessive noise is not allowed, and pets must not annoy RESIDENT'S neighbors. Pets must not be left alone if they bark, cry or whine when by themselves.
- No pets are allowed in the COMMUNITY recreation areas at any time.
- Guests' pets are not permitted in the COMMUNITY.



Reminder on Trash Policies

The dump will be open 8-3 on Tues and Friday, and 8-11 on Saturday. We are going to try this to see if we can keep the illegal dumping under control but still giving you all access. A reminder/the rule, if it wont fit in a large size trash can, it does not belong in the dump area. No furniture, chemicals of any kind, propane tanks, paint, electronics, construction debris, grills, etc...ever.

The compactor is for your regular bagged up household trash, the big dumpster is for yard waste and the blue container is for recyclables. ANYTHING ELSE IS THE RESIDENTS RESPONSIBILITY TO HAVE HAULED OFF THE PROPERTY because Valet Living won't pick it up either. If you are caught dumping anything else, that is actually a crime, you will be fined by the county, get a violation letter from us, and we will close the area back up. (we don't want that)

Beginning 8/22, the maintenance staff will no longer be going around to pick up trash or yard waste. Valet Living will still pick up your trash, but all of the same policies above apply pertaining to what is allowed in the dump area and what they will and won't pick up. Everything bagged in trash bags and boxes broken down should be it. It doesn't make sense to have them go back and do the

same thing we already pay a vendor for and use up man hours when there are so many other things that need attention on the property. This does include yard waste, you will have to take that to the dumpster because Valet Living does not pick that up. I have faith that this will be a smooth transition, if you have any questions, please call us at (727) 531-9105. Thank you.

Boxes MUST be broken down and put into the Recycling container. • No bags whatsoever should be placed in the roll off container. This container is for unbagged yard waste, and other household trash. If you have bagged yard waste, you can put it into the compactor or open the

bag and dump the contents into the roll off. • The roll off container is not for bulky furniture or construction material...if it doesn't fit into an outside type of garbage can, it does not belong in the dump area. Just as the park is not responsible for you getting to work on time, paying your cell phone bill, or getting your oil changed, we must follow Pinellas County Solid Waste Ordinances and are not responsible for taking your old mattresses, tires, appliances, TVs, large bulky furniture, paint, batteries, solvents, construction debris, etc. Again, the roll off and compactor is for "household" trash only. Therefore, you will need to arrange to have prohibited items hauled away or you can take it to the landfill which we believe costs approximately \$11 for a load. The Pinellas County Solid Waste landfill is located at 3095 114th Ave. N., St. Petersburg, FL 33716, about 10 miles away. Their phone number is 727-464-7500. There are several junk removal companies, and we know of one junk hauler, Tampa Bay Junk Pros, who may be offering \$50 off for junk/furniture/ appliance removal. s you are aware, <u>all</u> residents and occupants must have a background check done prior to living in our communities. We have been made aware of a few unauthorized residents/occupants and were able to remedy the situation. If someone is living on property and you suspect that they have not been properly screened, please check with us. More often than not, most have undergone a background check. If in doubt, please call the

office. Although privacy laws prohibit us from giving out residents'/occupants' names, we can confirm if a background check was conducted.



Although mentioned a few months ago, we need to restate that guests <u>may not</u> bring their pets on property. Only pets registered with the office, showing that shots are current, are allowed in the park. Again, no visiting of pets or pet sitting of unregistered pets is permitted. Further, all pets must be on a leash when outside of the home and they may not be left unattended or tethered outside.



The after-hours Emergency number for staff is 727-638-4844. To identify true emergencies, apply the "blood, flood or fire" test. Any issue that involves blood or injury, flood or fire should be treated as an emergency; all other matters can likely wait until the next business day. EXTERIOR COMPLIANCE

To maintain the integrity of the community, we have stepped up our efforts to ensure that the exterior of homes is in compliance with the community standards as laid out in the prospectus.

It is what every resident signed up for when approved to live in this community. The original charm that initially brought many people into the community should be reestablished.

Below is what we look at when conducting our 360° inspections. CURB APPEAL IS KEY:

- Exterior of the home is mildew-free and clean (pressure washed and repainted if required). This includes skirting, trim, awnings, shutters, etc.
- Bushes/shrubs are trimmed, and garden beds are free of weeds (recommend installing new or refreshed mulch*/stones/shells).

AFAFAFAFAFAFAFAFAFAF

- Fences and/or enclosures are removed (unless previously approved by management).
- Driveway is clean (pressure washed and repainted if necessary).
- Gutters are clean and free of weeds.
- Screens and/or window treatments are not torn or broken.
- Skirting, windows, shutters, awnings, trim, etc. are not broken or in disarray.
- Items stored around the home are removed.
- Obstacles in the yard, preventing landscapers' passage, are removed.
- Satellite dishes are out of street view.
- Cars must be operable, have current registration and not leaking fluids on the ground/ driveway.
- Registration sticker is current and affixed for visibility.
- House numbers are visible.
- No hot tubs, fire pits, trampolines, etc.

*Free mulch is available at the Pinellas County Recycling center on Starkey Road

All violations must be cured before a home is sold since violations cannot transfer to new owners. We ask that you be proactive and take a critical look at the exterior of your homes and address issues noted above.

For those on a budget, the Pinellas County Solid Waste Department has a Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) program. From that, they have created a "Swap Shop," for household chemical products such as paint, cleaners, and automotive fluids. It is free for Pinellas County residents. Availability can change, and quantities may be limited. Despite the name, there is no need to swap. When using the Swap Shop, your government-issued ID will be required. Visit: https://pinellas.gov/household-hazardous-waste-hhw-collection/ for more information.

Another source for inexpensive paint may be at the Habitat for Humanity Re-Store on the corner of Ulmerton Road and 49th Street. Contractors have been known to bring in excess paint and the savings may be substantial.

Please be advised that if you will be changing the color of your home, you must first submit an Architectural Modification Request form. Forms are available through the office or can be emailed upon request.

For window screen or vinyl window film repairs or replacement, you may want to check with Ace Hardware.

If you need assistance with some tasks, we have names of residents who may be able to assist with pressure washing, gutter cleaning, weeding, reseating of skirting, and painting. Please give the office a call at 727-531-9105 if you would like their contact information or if you would like to be added to our list of resources. Thank you.
