

O24-25 Dial Directories are here! Pick yours up at the Main Office on Commerce Drive or from Barb at the Aloha Clubhouse rent collection office when the office is open.

Correct me if I'm wrong, but let's talk about Parking Passes for the first time. What are they for? When can you get one? How long are they good for? Here we go.

The parking pass is for guests whose vehicle cannot fit in your carport with your car(s). The parking pass says Guest Parking on it. You will need to contact the Main Office, as this is the only place to pick up the pass. We will ask for your name, Teakwood address, why you need the pass and when it will be used. A parking pass is under the same time constraints as guests. No more than 15 consecutive days, and remember you will need to register your guest at Teakwood Village Sales office if they will be in the community for more than 5 days. Having said this, there may be a few exceptions done on a case by case basis for other people than guests. Please call the Main Office (727-584-8684) for the parking pass.

One other thing that I want to go over again is where/how to pay your lot rent. You may set up ACH (automatic) payment with Teakwood, wherein we will withdraw the monies from your bank account. You may set up a bill payor through your bank, wherein you set it up, make all changes as needed and your bank will send Teakwood a check on your behalf. You may pay by check, money order, cashier's check or cash at the Main Office on Commerce Drive or at the rent collection office in the Aloha clubhouse (1st thru 15th of each month). You may mail the lot rent to Teakwood Village using the address of P O Box 838, Largo, FL 33779-0838 – or – 531 Commerce Drive, Largo, FL 33770.

Finally, Teakwood will no longer have the small dumpsters available for delivery.

UPDATED PINELLAS COUNTY WATER RESTRICTIONS & EXEMPTIONS



- ue to Drought Conditions in Pinellas County, Stage 1 Water Restrictions will continue through JULY 1st.
- Wasteful and Unnecessary Use of Water Is Prohibited. This includes:
- Leaving a hose on unattended without a shut-off nozzle).
- Use of a sprinkler system or hand-watering a lawn or garden area on a restricted day or more than once a day.
- Hosing down a driveway, solid surface or structure when another method could be used. (such as a broom or leaf blower)
- Not fixing an irrigation or plumbing issue, like broken sprinkler heads or outdoor faucets, after receiving a verbal or written notice.

APAPAPAPAPAPAPAPAPAPAP

- Watering during or after rainfall. It is required for irrigation systems to have an operating rain sensor or soil moisture sensing device installed. This system allows you to bypass irrigation cycles when your lawn is watered sufficiently.
- You are allowed to wash your vehicle if necessary on any day or time; however, you must use a shut-off nozzle or water-efficient device.

Proof of new lawn material must be faxed to (727) 464-3717. New lawn & landscaping plants exemption period:

- From Day 1 to Day 30, new plants may be watered any day of the week.
- From Day 31 to Day 60, new plants may be watered three days a week.
- o Even addresses only on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday
- o Odd addresses only on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday
- You may only water in the new lawn or plant area during authorized hours.
- Exemption begins on the day of installation. New turf grass or plants can be watered one time outside of watering times on installation day.
- You can only use an entire irrigation system zone if it waters an area with at least 50% new plant material.
- Partial zone and dispersed plantings like trees, plants and shrubs must be watered by another, more targeted, irrigation method.

Potted plants may be watered as needed, but low-watering methods should be used.

NOTES FROM THE SOCIAL CLUB PRO-TEM PRESIDENT

want to remind everyone that the last Social Club Members Business Meeting of the 2023-2024 season will be held after coffee on Tuesday May14th. In the past few meetings there has been excellent interaction between the members and the Board about suggestions for activities and also about concerns that may affect our activities in the future.

At last month's meeting we discussed the problem of people who are no longer Teakwood residents coming to the park and attending weekly activities or buying tickets to Social Club sponsored events and using facilities such as the shuffleboard and bocce courts and the swimming pool, which we help to maintain through our monthly rent. This problem could possibly increase as rentals are no longer allowed.

Our Social Club activities are open to all Teakwood residents even if they are not Social Club members. One example is Tuesday coffee (where we loose money every week because we only charge \$3 per person). There are other free events that the Social Club provides food and/or music for. It is not fair to Teakwood residents that the Social Club foot the bill for non-Teakwood residents. There is also an issue of liability should an outsider who is not an invited guest have an accident.

Only Teakwood residents, whether they are Social Club members or not, may purchase tickets to

any Social Club activity or event for themselves and their guests. This also includes all weekly activities at Tiki and Aloha Clubhouses and the outside amenities. Going forward, we ask all members to bring their membership cards with them when purchasing tickets. For Teakwood West Social Club members, we ask that they wear their name card lanyard. We know some will forget and the people selling tickets won't know every Teakwood resident, whether they are a member or not, by sight. If that is the case you may be asked to give your house number and street to be verified against our residents' book and/or show your driver's license or state ID as proof of address. This applies to both east and west residents.

Teakwood is a wonderful place to live with so many things going on. We want everyone to have a good time with neighbors, family and special friends, without the over crowding of outsiders who have no right to take advantage of the low cost or free activities we provide.







iveters Tampa; 2301 North Dale Mabry Hwy, Tampa; 813-559-1450

Mon–Wed 11 am-12 am; Thurs 11 am–2 am; Fri & Sat 11 am–3 am; Sun 11am–11pm One of the first sights you lay your eyes on at Riveters is the torpedoes.

Then you spy the guy relaxed in his Vietnam era uniform. Head to the restrooms and hold it, you have to check out Rosie the Riveter – the poster, and the real gals. The gals are in their 80's and known to frequent the place. Here you will experience the significance of an era that transformed the role of women in the workplace.

Riveters has craft beer and specialty drinks that fit in with the restaurant's theme.

Prime Rib is on the menu all the time in the form of a sandwich, sliders, and an entre in the evening. The only man in our party had "Warhawk Chili" (\$6 cup/\$8 bowl). Others ordered the "Kram It Prime Rib Sandwich" & a side (\$18.99), a "Catalina Chicken" dinner (\$20.50) and a huge salad. When in a restaurant for the first time, I often go whole hog, or in this case – cow. I had a drink (\$6.99) and "Prime Rib Sliders" - I thought there were two but there were actually three good sized sliders (\$14.99), and wait for it..... truffle fries \$10! I only ate one slider and maybe a third of the fries, so guess what Marty had for dinner that evening? There was little discussion as we enjoyed the food. Both of us liked that the prime rib was not rare but also not overdone nor tough. There was a tiny bit of well done meat at the edge and hardly any fat. The truffle fries were really garlicky with parmesan and scallions, a bit of crisp to the outside with moist and soft insides. OMGosh. The fries can be ordered as an upgrade to your dinner. One woman asked how the truffles got on the fries. LOL.

Make sure you walk up and tell the guy in the uniform, "Hello." He will be waiting for you. Riveters was easy to find at 2301B North Dale Mabry HWY, Tampa. Right off the exit, you go a very short distance before turning left.




