Tree Root Killer

The have purchased some foaming tree root killer for use by anyone in phase 1 who has had tree roots removed from their sewer line. The crystals are free and can be picked up at the BC Mart at the top of Redwood Dr. on Wednesday and Saturday mornings, 10am to noon. During the summer the BC Mart may be closed on Saturdays. If you cannot make the pickup on Wednesday morning, please contact me to get a bottle.

To use this product, it can be placed in the sewer line cleanout, provided you have easy access to the cleanout, or in a toilet. If the chemicals were put into a toilet, it should be flushed 3 times. If the cleanout was used, then any toilet can be flushed three times to move the chemicals towards the tree roots. The instructions do state that no additional water, from sinks, showers, bathtubs, or toilets be used or sent down the drain for the next 10 to 12 hours. Prepare ahead of time by asking one or more of your neighbors if you can use their facilities during this time or take a mini, one day, vacation.



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

It's still a busy time for us here in the Park, as we continue with projects that are ongoing and proposed. The dumpster has been delivered for the upcoming remodel of our bathrooms, and we will begin the demolition soon. Please remember, the dumpster is only for materials that are being re-

soon. Please remember, the dumpster is only for materials that are being removed from the bathrooms. No other dumping is allowed.

The outside doors of the Clubhouse, exercise room, Shuffleboard sheds, garage door, and Bazaar shed have been painted, thanks to the help of Amber Oliverio. It took us 4 days to complete the project, and by the time this issue of the Bugle comes out the inside doors will be painted.

The tiles around the pool have been scrubbed with the help of Amber Oliverio, and Gisele Chabot. The dark ring around the pool was a result of suntan lotion and oils, and this is the reason we ask that you shower before entering the pool and hot tub. Even if you've had a shower before coming to the pool, it is important to get all oils and lotions off of your body before entering the water.

A new Pool/Hot Tub service company has been hired, and started work on the 10 th of May. This new company is more knowledgeable of our specific needs, and the equipment that we have.

Finally, as it looks to be another hot summer, please remember to keep hydrated by drinking plenty of water.

It's important to remember we are chartered under Florida Statute Chapter 718 as a "Condominium Community". Many people think of a condominium as a traditional tower like building. Increasingly, more mobile home parks are adopting this chartered approach. What this means is that many of the rules we must follow were not developed by Briar Creek. They were developed by federal, state or local legislators and enacted into law. Being a Condominium Community means BC is not legally comprised of single family homes nor are we chartered as a Home Owner's Association (HOA)". That is a different animal with a different set of state statutes and regulations. Often Condo and HOA laws and restrictions do not overlap and can be quite different. It is also important for long-time and newer owners to remember that our

Association, like other condo associations, must comply not just with our own legal documents, but that those documents must comply first with numerous legal requirements as well. As owners, we agree at the time of purchase to abide by and live within the boundaries of those documents. While some of the issues a Board must deal with may seem petty or unreasonable, they are often enforced to ensure compliance with outside regulatory requirements. When problems occur, such as non-compliance with an Alterations Forms request, failure to address Home Inspection deficiencies or over-night street parking violations, they are noted and owners are informed and expected to correct them. Actions to address issues are taken, often behind the scenes, to protect the privacy and confidentiality of our friends and neighbors. One should not assume that just because they don't know what is happening to address an issue that the Board is not taking action. It's quite the opposite but unfortunately, sometimes corrective action takes longer than anticipated or anyone wants due to legal requirements outside a board's control.

Even though we as residents (including board members) don't always like the rules, enforcing rules and restrictions can be very beneficial to our community. The many advantages of rule enforcement include protecting and enhancing home values, preserving the aesthetics of the area, community pride of ownership in BCII, maintaining common area property and that of its owners, and a reputation of compliance with federal, state, local requirements and the community's governing documents.

Living in a condominium community is not for everyone, and may not be for those that have come from areas where there were no zoning or property restrictions and now question, "what are all these rules?". Conversely, if one wants to own in a community like Briar Creek, seeking out and becoming familiar with its Documents, Bylaw and Restrictions prior to buying is critically important. That is one reason why prospective buyers are interviewed by Board Members in advance of the purchase to ensure they are aware of what is involved in living in BCII and what is expected once the closing occurs.

So, please, take time to become familiar with their contents, follow the rules and help us work together to continue making BCII a premier community in which to live.

Philip Chabot - Director Phase II - Garage, Lawns, Ponds and RV Lot

Just a reminder to those who have chosen not to have their property maintained by TLC, our lawn care company. It is your responsibility to prepare your property with "flags" indicating the area you would like to prevent any maintenance service. Flags must be installed the evening before or by 7:45 am the morning of servicing. All flags must be removed the same day that servicing has been completed. This same rule applies for those who choose not to have their carport area blown out after service.

This is your responsibility to properly contain the area you do not want the blowing done. Any device(s) used to cordon off the area, like flags, must be removed the same day servicing has been completed. If appropriate measures have been taken and there is an issue you may contact Philip Chabot, Director of Lawns.

Now for those of you who have chosen to remove your block squirting and install vinyl squirting, which I have done myself, you need to make sure you have some type of barrier between the squirting and the grass. TLC is not responsible for any damage to vinyl squirting. Again, make sure you have some type of barrier between your squirting and your lawn. You also want to remember that any alteration to your landscaping requires an alteration request which details your plans. This is mandatory so we can ensure that TLC, our lawn mowing company, doesn't get bogged down doing their job because of how someone landscaped their property. We want to keep the cost as low as possible for this service and by maintaining a property that is mower friendly it will help not only the lawn mowing company, but our bottom line and our pockets.

Lastly, due to the security breach we experienced a few weeks ago at the RV Parking Area, this is a reminder to residents who utilize the RV Parking Area and have been entrusted with the combination to enter said lot. This information is for RV Parking Area residents only. If someone needs to enter the RV Parking Area, on your behalf, it is your responsibility to unlock the gate and secure the gate once completed. At no time should you ever give out the lock information to anyone who is not authorized to enter the RV Parking Area. Unauthorized entry will result in removal from the RV Parking Area. We truly appreciate your cooperation.

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
