Hurricane Season preparedness.

ords many of us have heard for the years we have lived in Florida. Recently if you have been to the Clubhouse (located on table outside the Business Office), you may have picked up a copy of the Pinellas County Hurricane Guide for 2024. Pick up a copy of this booklet and keep it handy, make sure you read it carefully. There is a tremendous amount



of information in this booklet. We will review some of the information and update you on the status of Lincolnshire regarding being prepared for a Hurricane. At the end of the article, we will give you phone#'s that can help you get prepared or sites you can access for questions you may need answered. If the booklets run out, we will reach out to the County to get additional copies. Everyone in Lincolnshire should have one to review.

- It has been a long time (about one hundred years) since our area has taken a direct hit from a hurricane. Many hurricanes have been close to our coast and caused flooding, beach erosion and wind damage. We have been very blessed.
- Living in a manufactured home we are automatically in an evacuation situation. For any of our new residents, our clubhouse is not an evacuation option. The clubhouse is secured during any forecasted storm making impact on Pinellas County. As the storm approaches the Largo Police will enter the park and make a loudspeaker announcement that we need to evacuate. We should be ready to leave quickly.
- Where will I go? There are shelters located within Pinellas County, list is available. Check the website listed or phone Pinellas County for shelters. Announcements are made by local news as to when the shelters will be open for evacuees.
- If you are physically leaving Pinellas County to avoid having to go to a shelter, do not wait till the last minute to get on the road. Gas stations, roads, bridges all become extremely congested. Decide where you will travel to and make a reservation for a hotel well in advance of the evacuation. Make sure the hotel will take pets if you have one.
- Know the location of your nearest County shelter if you are staying in the area. Shelters fill up quickly. If you need special care i.e. electricity for oxygen supply or wheelchair access, or transportation. Please know the location of a "special" needs shelter. They will make a reservation with you in advance. You can do this throughout the year. Do not wait till a hurricane is headed our way, make that reservation today. Special needs shelters do not allow pets. When you make your reservation for a special needs shelter tell them you have a pet that will need to be cared for. You can plan to have your pet cared for by Pinellas County Animal Services at a separate shelter till after the storm passes.
- Preparing to leave. With the start of hurricane season, we should all have a "to go" bag ready to put in our vehicles in the event of an evacuation order. That bag should contain clothes for several days, important documents, (i.e., insurance policies, passports, birth certificates etc.), medicines you need to take, contact information, battery, or solar powered back up device

for your cell phone, water, non-perishable food to sustain yourself for several days. Plan to have cash on hand. Remember power could be off for days/weeks and ATM machines will not be available for use. If you are evacuating to a county shelter you must bring your own food & water. See Hurricane booklet for list of basic emergency supplies they recommend you take with you when you evacuate. Many pharmacies will fill prescription refills earlier with the threat of a storm.

- If you are evacuating with your pet do not forget to pack a bag for them. Food you will need while you are evacuated, and any medications your pet may be taking. If your pet has a chronic medical condition pet shelters cannot take them.
- If you are evacuating to a regular shelter the only pets that are welcome are service animals. Bring the required paperwork to show the animal's status as an authorized service animal.
- Preparing your home before you leave. If there is anything "good" about a hurricane it is that we usually are given advance warning. Make sure you have any objects that are on the outside of your house, potted plants, lawn ornaments, flags, etc. removed to an inside location. High winds can take exceptionally large planters and move them like they were a small potted plant. Turn off your water before you leave. It is also recommended that you shut off your electricity as well.

- Emergency weather radios WUSF 89.7 FM (Public Radio), WFLA 970AM (news).

This scheduled time and day <u>may require shutoff of the well water (non-potable) from</u> <u>9:00AM to 11:00AM</u>. They may not be required to shut down the well water (non-potable) just serves as notice in advance that well water may be shut off on this day and time.

This pre-scheduled maintenance is not turning off the Fresh Water to your home.

News and Updates:

Tips on successful community living in Lincolnshire:

 \succ The compactor replaced the single dumpster bins several years ago leading to the trash fee homeowners pay in our rent statements. The Park owner completely remodeled the area for the compactor to safely sit behind the enclosure.

> The compactor accommodates <u>garbage and light trash only</u>. Placing large bulk items in the compactor leads to breakdowns and unnecessary repairs.

> The bi-monthly large roll-off open dumpster is for large bulk items excluding TV's, refrigerators, or other restricted items. The Voice's center calendar has the Tuesdays this dumpster is available for usually for a day. Being early means you do not have to take the item back home.

> The re-cycle bins are for exactly that. Please take the boxes down so they are flat and do not place items like pizza boxes or food cans that are not clean. Those items can contaminate the whole bin.

- The Board formed the yearly financial audit committee from volunteer Members. Florida and LHOA bylaws.



Maj. Larry Moores has been awarded the Silver Star, the na-tion's third-highest award for acts of valor. "Mr. Moores, I personally salute you for your tenacity, your toughness in a crucible combat, and your commitment to our Army, and your fellow soldiers," Gen. Gary Brito, commanding general of U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command, said while presenting the award. "Your actions in Somalia were for them, your brothers in arms, and are a living tribute to the Ranger Creed, which I know that you hold dearly."

Immortalized by the 2001 blockbuster movie "Black Hawk Down," the real battle between U.S. troops and Somali militiamen occurred from Oct. 3 to Oct. 4, 1993. Moores was assigned to Task Force Ranger, which had been deployed that summer to capture Somali warlord Mohamed Farrah Aidid and included Rangers, special operations troops and aviators. What started as an overnight firefight between militiamen and U.S. forces quickly went south when two U.S. Black Hawk helicopters were shot down while conducting a raid aimed at capturing two of Farrah Aidid's lieutenants.

According to retired Army Col. Larry Perino, a fellow Ranger platoon leader who served along-side Moores during the battle, Moores played an active role in saving other service members' lives that night. "Larry deserves it because he chose to go back to that street to try and break us out," Perino said at the ceremony, according to a statement from the Army. "Despite going out there and getting riddled with bullets time and time again and losing Rangers, he had the intestinal for-titude to lead his men to help us." Moores recalled the battle at the ceremony, saying, "We lost 18 soldiers in battle and had more than 70 Rangers wounded. That was a tough experience be-cause we were overwhelmed, with the odds against us. But it was amazing to watch the young Rangers still executed under very difficult circumstances."

For his service, Moores was inducted as a distinguished member of the 75th Ranger Regiment in 2005 and into the U.S. Army Ranger Hall of Fame in 2017. In 2021, the Army upgraded 60 awards for troops injured and killed in the battle, including 58 Silver Stars and two Distin-guished Flying Crosses for heroism displayed during "aerial flight." Sgt. 1st Class Randall Shughart and Master Sgt. Gary Gordon, both Delta operators, were posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor for attempting to protect one of the downed Black Hawk pilots, Chief War-rant Officer Michael Durant, as Somalis closed in around them.



Although more than 30 years has passed since the infamous battle, the U.S. has maintained a tumultuous presence in Somalia. Between 2019 and 2021, the U.S. drew back its physical presence in the African country. The following year, then-U.S. Africa Command commanding officer Gen. Stephen Townsend told lawmakers that the drawdown was a mistake, citing the need for a continued counterterrorism force, which the U.S. maintains to this day.

"In East Africa, al-Qaida's al-Shabab remains the greatest threat to U.S. persons and interests in the region as well as the homeland, while undermining peace, security and political progress in Somalia," Townsend told the Senate Armed Services Committee in a 2022 hearing. "If left un-checked, al-Shabab will soon expand beyond Somalia's borders and become an even greater threat to regional stability and American interests."

Most recently, Rep. Matt Gaetz, R-Fla., introduced a resolution in April 2023 to the House floor that would have required the U.S. withdraw entirely from its counterterrorism efforts in Somalia. The resolution was shot down in a 102-321 vote. Just shy of five hundred troops -- mostly special operations personnel -- made up the U.S. military's remaining presence in Somalia as of June 2023.




Why pay attention even if we have physical challenges?









