June 6 is D-Day

-Day is the largest invasion ever It was assembled, before or since, landed 156,000 Allied troops by sea and air on five beachheads in Normandy, France. It was the start of Allied operations which would ultimately liberate Western Europe, defeat Nazi Germany and



end WWII. 73,000 American Troops, 23,500 on Utah Beach, 34,250 on Omaha Beach, 15,500 airborne troops. 83,115 British and Canadian (61,175 of them British) with 24,970 on Gold Beach, 21,400 on Juno Beach, 28,845 on Sward Beach and a7,900 airborne troops. Other Countries that participated in D-Day and the Battle of Normandy were Australia, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, Greece, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway and Poland.

By the end of June 11, 1944, D+5, 326,547 troops, 54,186 vehicles and 104 tons of supplies had been landed on the beaches. 11,900 Allied aircraft were available to support the landings. Operation Neptune (Allied ships), including D-Day, involved huge naval forces including 6,939 vessels. Over 100,000 Allied and German troops were killed during the Battle of Normandy, as well as around 200,000 French civilians, many as a result of Allied bombings.

Why is the term 'D-Day' used? When a military operation is being planned, its actual date and time was not always known. Therefore, the term is used to mean the day of which operations would begin, whatever date that was. The day before D-Day is known as D-1, while the day after D –Day was D+1, and so on. June 14 is Flag Day

lag Day is celebrated in America on June 14, commemorating the day the first flag resolution was passed. On June 14, 1777, less than one year after Betsy Ross had received the order from General Washington to make the first flag, the Second Continental Congress passed a flag resolution stating: Resolved, That the flag of the



United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a glue field, representing a new Constellation.

The first national observance of Flag Day was on June 14, 1877; 100 years after the flag resolution was adopted by the Continental Congress. In the late 19th century, schoolteachers all over the United States began conducting patriotic ceremonies commemorating Flag Day as a way to teach children about history. One such schoolteacher, Bernard J. Cigrand, is often referred to as the "Father of Flag Day". He lobbied Congress for many years for Flag Day to be officially observed.

Other patriotic groups, including the Colonial Dames and the Sons of the American Revolution, also spent years trying to convince Congress to make Flag Day official. In 1916, ...continued on page 18



President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation stating that June 14 shall be national Flag day, and in 1949, it was made official by an Act of Congress.

On June 14, 1891, the Betsy Ross house (located at 239 Arch Street, Old City, Philadelphia) began publicly celebrating Flag Day, and has been celebrating Flay Day every year since 1911. Since 2008, the Betsy Ross house has revived the patriotic zeal of the earliest celebrations with Flag Fest – an all day, old-fashioned, family fund street fair with games, live entertainment, a patriotic pet contest, shopping and more, celebrated on the Saturday before Flag Day. our femur can support 30 times the weight of your body. Bridges and airplanes are built with redundancies. The human body also has a few over-engineered parts just to be safe. Nowhere is this more obvious than the femur, the body's largest bone, located between the hip and knee. Named from the Latin for "thigh", the femur has many important functions beyond just holding your weight. The femur stabilizes you as you walk, connects muscles and tendons from your hips and knees to the rest of your body, and also plays a vital role in blood

Seven Body Parts That Are More of Less Useless

he human body contains around 600 muscles, more than 200 bones, and all sorts of tendons fascia and organs – but some of them are pretty much useless.

circulation via the femoral vein. The human body's smallest bone is in the hand.

- 1. Appendix, a small pouch attached to the large intestine, doing little except occasionally getting infected. It serves as a safe house for beneficial gut bacteria, storing it to replenish it in the rest of the gut if it gets wiped out by illness.
- 2. Tailbone, also known as coccyxes, consists of three to five vertebrae that aren't connected to the spine. The coccyx is not a functional tail, but it is woven in with the ligaments, tendons, and muscles in that area.
- 3. Wisdom teeth, a third set of molars, usually start emerging between the ages of 17 and 21. Many people don't get them. Often, there's not room in the jaw and the teeth end up trapped and then they need to be surgically extracted. Occasionally they grow in without incident and just become extra teeth. Our ancestors ate hard to chew things and needed them as backup teeth.
- 4. External Ear-Orienting System humans have muscles that move/twitch at sudden grabbing sounds like crying babies and footsteps. Some humans can still wiggle their ears.
- 5. Goosebump Muscles Human ancestors were much furrier than us, and sometimes needed to fluff up their hair for warmth or to look bigger and move fearsome. They had tiny muscles attached to their hair follicles, called arrector pili muscles, that would shift each hair up into a vertical position. Those muscles give us goosebumps, known as goose pimples, when we get chilly, scared or excited. But as far as basic survival goes, the arrectores pilorum are pretty much useless.
- 6. Third Eyelid Most animals have a third eyelid, also called nictitating membrane, which

serves as a kind of windshield wiper that distributes tears and clears debris from the eye. This trait evolved out of human being and some apes, but we still have a tiny vestigial remnant in the inner corners of our eyes. It's a bit of eye tissue just inside the fleshy pink eye bump. Humans can have a more developed nictitating membrane that covers a larger portion of the eye. So why did we lose ours? One theory is that, unlike animals that still have them, we're not typically sticking our faces directly into bushes or other animals to forge for food, so we have less debris to push out of our eyes.

7. Palmaris Longus Muscle – is a muscle stretching the length of our forearm that's evolving away before our very eyes, because it's visible when you hold your hand and wrist a certain way...you can actually tell whether you still have yours on sight. It's disappearance in anywhere between 1.5% and 63.9% of people. The muscle helps with wrist flexion, but it's getting progressively weaker as other muscles take over its duties. It is pretty useful as a donor tendon for plastic surgery.

Italian food wasn't nearly as well known and beloved as it is today. In fact, Chef Boyardee has been credited with helping to popularize the cuisine in America. "Bolardi" was difficult for Americans to pronounce, so his products were sold under the phonetic name of Chef Boy-Ar-Dee. He helped with the war effort during WWII by producing Army rations, which required keeping his factory in Milton, PA, open 24 hours a day. By then, the company had become too big for Bolardi and his family to manage alone, so they sold it to the conglomerate Conagra in 1946. According to Bolardi's niece, it was the only way to make sure everyone still had jobs after the war. Bolardi continued appearing in commercials until 1978, and died in 1985.

Animal Eyes

The 45-foot long colossal squid's eye has been measured 11" in diameter making it the largest such organ in the animal kingdom and land dwelling creatures. The ostrich tops the pack with an eye that measures around 2" from the cornia to the retina.

What bird sees colors humans can't see?

Lummingbirds can see colors that humans can't. Colorblindness is relative. Just as we can perceive hues that dogs can't, humming birds can see colors that humans can't. Whereas the three types of colorsensitive cone cells in our eyes allow us to see red, green, and blue light, hummingbirds (and most other birds) have a fourth type of cone attuned to ultraviolet light. In addition to UV light, birds may even be able to see combination colors like ultraviolet+green and ultraviolet+red.. Having four types of cones cells, known as tetrachromacy, is also common in fish and reptiles, and researchers believe that dinosaurs possessed it as well. Some very special humans also seem to have a fourth type of cone — about 1% of the population.

Being able to see this way is especially useful for hummingbirds, whose endless quest for sugar is aided by their ability to discern different-colored flowers — including "nonspectral" colors that combine hues from widely different parts of the color spectrum. Purple is the only nonspectral color we humans can perceive (it involves both blue and red, or both short and long wavelengths of light), but some birds might see as many as five: purple, ultraviolet+red, ultraviolet+green, ultraviolet+yellow, and ultraviolet+purple. That certainly sounds worth singing about.

What is the smallest bird?

he Cuban bee hummingbird is the smallest bird in the world. Found in Cuba, it measures a mere 2 ½ inches. Its wings go at 80 per second, sucks nectar from 1000 flowers a day, and the nest is about the size of a golf ball. The female, not as colorful as the male, lays one or two eggs the size of a coffee bean, and in about 18 days the youngster is ready for flight. The bee hummingbird can live as long as 7 years. Its prey are snakes, birds and spiders. I know as a fact that the bee hummingbirds are in DE because I've seen it on my butterfly bush flower and petunia flowers.



Why do Birds have hollow bones?

If you were already aware that birds have hollow bones, you might have also heard that it's because that makes them lighter. However studies Lhave shown that bird skeletons aren't any lighter than mammal skeletons of the same size. The actual reason birds bones aren't just hollow but



pneumatized (full of space for air) is because flying requires so much oxygen that birds' lungs actually extend into their bones. As baby bird grows, the air sacs of its lungs create a series of small hollows in it bones that give it extra space for taking in oxygen both while inhaling and exhaling, which help keep them aloft even longer.




