MANAGERS CORNER JUNE 2024

There are several Residents that are putting out Garbage in plastic bags the evening before collection instead of having the trash in a tightly covered garbage container. This allows birds and animals to break open the bags causing a mess that needs to be cleaned up. Article XI of the Rules & Regulations below addresses this problem.

Article XI Trash: of the Rules & Regulations states:

1 "All household garbage and refuse must be securely tied in plastic trash bags <u>AND stored</u> in clean, tightly covered garbage containers. The intention of this provision is to avoid mess and spoilage and to prevent animals from getting into the garbage".

2 All garbage will be picked up on designated days and should be placed on the grass adjacent to, but not on the sidewalk before 8 a.m. on that day. Any Resident's garbage strewn around the street or sidewalk will be the responsibility of the Resident for cleanup. Do not overfill garbage bags (30 lbs.) Maximum weight).

Did You Know?

You may have noticed a new section of the media last month called Did You Know? This is a new monthly article that will include things that you might not know about or realize. The Co-op BOD is using this as a way to help keep residents and their guests up to date on everyday items throughout Paradise Island.

Did you know that golf carts are allowed to be parked in your carport ONLY if it leaves enough room for you to properly park your vehicles?

Otherwise, your golf cart must be parked on a pre-approved pad.

Golf carts are not allowed to be parked on the sidewalk, the front lawn or in the grass area at the clubhouse. Carts displaying a handicap sticker may park in those specified spaces. All others should be parked in marked golf cart parking spots.

Licensed children 16-18 are allowed to operate/drive a golf cart in Paradise Island with an adult on the cart with them Also, no one under the age of 16 is allowed to operate/drive a golf cart anywhere in the community at any time. Golf carts should follow rules of the road within Paradise Island, including stopping at all stop signs. Golf carts should NOT be driven on the sidewalks at any time.

Home assessments with lock box installations are being done and we have not been given a stop date by LPD for appointments. Not only are these great for Emergency Services to have access if you can't answer, but I recently locked myself out!

Pool information and Safety. Please make your guests aware of pool hours. The pool does not open until 10AM. Children's hours are 11-2 and 5-7. If you were not aware, at the pool, that RED BOX by the entrance into the clubhouse contains a phone with direct access to 911. So, if you have an emergency, you don't have to scramble for your cell AND try to see it in the sun. Also, if you don't frequent the clubhouse, there is an AED MACHINE, an automated external defibrillator, designed to deliver an electric shock to victims with an absent or very weak heartbeat. Directions are very simple, written and audio. It evaluates before shocking. PLEASE do not take the machine down and open packages. Practice is not done or needed. Some of you may have been to our LPD event where one was opened and you could hear the instructions.

Hurricane season is now here so please prepare. As you should all know, manufactured homes, aka, trailers, are automatically in an evacuation zone. Flood zones are irrelevant. As a survivor of Hurricane Michael 2018 in Mexico Beach FL we are familiar with manufactured home damage and the trauma of staying during a direct hit hurricane! Think now where you would stay. Friends, family, pet friendly motel or lastly a shelter. Just make sure it is not another manufactured home and not in an evacuation zone. Prepare your documents to take with you should you need to leave. HAVE A PLAN. SEE disasterpinellas.gov. STAY SAFE!

101 -year-old WWII Veteran Pilot Gets Birthday Wish to Fly Again - A World War II veteran who flew 32 combat missions in Europe had a wish for his 101st birthday to fly once again in a small plane. Donald Stern fulfilled his dream Thursday at Central Jersey Regional Airport, sitting in the front passenger's seat for a 40-minute flight aboard a Cessna Skyhawk that soared above the Statue of Liberty and other landmarks before returning to Manville. Upon exiting the plane just before 12:30 p.m., Stern was guided toward a small building near the runway, where friends and family were waiting with his birthday

cake. He took a seat on the couch and gave a salute and a gentle wave, before blowing out the candles. "Thank you," he said to the small crowd.

Glenn Sinibaldi, a retired Air Force major, piloted the flight, officials said. Russell Stern, the younger of Donald Stern's two sons, was in the back passenger's seat for the flight. The 101-year-old's other son, Howard Stern, was waiting on the ground. Russell Stern, 63, said his father was "mesmerized" at the sights as they gazed down at the New Jersey Turnpike, Rutgers University and the Manhattan skyline. "He seemed comfortable and almost at home, almost like he was mesmerized and he was looking back," said Stern, who lives in Madison. "It was good. He liked it. He was quiet during most of the trip," Russell Stern said.

Donald Stern was born in New York City on April 25, 1923, according to an overview provided by officials who organized the event. He lives at Brandywine Princeton Senior Living Community in South Brunswick. He was 21 when he was assigned to the U.S. Army Air Corps 483rd Bombardment Group. He flew 32 combat missions in a B-17 Flying Fortress between January and April 1945, serving as a bombardier and navigator. His final combat mission was April 24, the day before his 22nd birthday. After returning from the war, Stern received a degree in architecture from Cooper Union. He and his wife, Barbara, had two sons, settling in 1960 in the Kendall Park section of South Brunswick. She died 20 years ago. He worked as an architect for New Jersey's division of building and construction, retiring in the late 1980s.

He was a "bureaucrat with a heart," his family said. In retirement, he wrote a book on the 483rd Bombardment Group. He frequently discussed his World War II experiences at middle schools, high schools, senior clubs, veterans' groups and other civic organizations, his family said. "His World War II experiences as a bombardier navigator in combat has been so important to him, has been such a cornerstone of his life," said his older son, Howard Stern. Leading up to his 101st birthday, he made a request: "To fly in a small plane again," his family said. A ceremony was held before the plane took off. He was seated as friends and family sang happy birthday, then he was taken to the plane.

Howard Stern, 66, stood in wait for his father and the plane to return. "He's enjoying it today," said Howard Stern, who lives in Plainsboro. When his father emerged from the plane, his son was ready with a joke, saying, "You didn't even have to wear a parachute." Once inside, Donald Stern made a point of counting everyone in the room to celebrate his 101st birthday. He stopped when he reached 30. He was handed a slice of pizza. "He's 101. He's frailer than he used to be, but Dad is an amazing guy," Howard Stern said. "He never ceases to amaze me; how sturdy he is and how he has bounced back. The guy is stoic, even in his old age," Stern said.




