Use the Park is quiet these days the business end of things keeps rolling along. Here's a quick update on what's happening.

Sewer Project

Rowland was contracted to clean and camera our sewer system They have been documenting areas that need repair. We will need repairs made to the

system in several areas. There is a meeting scheduled for June 7 to review specifically what needs to be repaired and a synopsis of that meeting will be available next month.

One issue that was found by Rowland required special equipment to clear the blockage, it was found to be a build-up of cooking grease. We are asking all residents not to dump cooking grease into the sink. A good way to get rid of cooking grease is to freeze it and then throw it in the trash on trash day.

Pool lighting

The adult pool passed inspection on June 6th by the Project Engineer. He will now submit paperwork to the health department and when that is cleared, the pool will be reopened. The inspection for the family pool will be done June 7th

Brightview

The Board is aware of the problems we are having with Brightview. A meeting was held on June 6 and every issue that had been brought forth by the residents was addressed with the management team at Brightview.

We will be monitoring the service closely for the next month so it is important that you keep the office informed of any complaints.

The office staff **do not have access to our CC Facebook page**, so posting on Facebook doesn't help keep them in the loop of areas of concern. It's important that you report directly to the office.

Shuffleboard

The new shuffleboard table has been installed in the clubhouse. Please note the table is for adult use only.

Pool Repair

Our pool repair on the adult pool was scheduled to begin on June 3rd. The contracted firm Pool Works, is unable to meet that start date. A new start date of November or April was offered. The April start was chosen because we did not want to have three months of pool closure during our busiest part of the year. Should we have any issues with the pool in the interim, Pool works has committed to making any required repairs free of charge because of this delay.

We continue striving to work with the new Vantaca system. Resource still has not worked out all the bugs. Bobbi has been working tirelessly on straightening out individual resident issues.

Level Engineering Phase III Updates

ood morning, everyone,

Hope y'all had a nice and relaxing Memorial Day weekend and are enjoying the onset of summer weather!

Just wanted to send out a few quick updates. We've been able to finish the material quantity take-off list that we can now use to assist in our contractor bidding process. I am currently in the process of identifying some local contractors who are interested in the project, can begin and complete this project in a reasonable timeline (meaning they don't have a long project queue), and are priced competitively. In the next few weeks, I am planning on scheduling a site day where I will bring along at least 2, hopefully 3 contractors to walk the site and to submit a formal proposal for work. I will keep you informed on when this site day will occur.

Our goal is to have the rest of the permitting and construction documents ready for publishing and submission by the end of June. Between now and then, finding a trusted contractor is vital so that we can move into the next phase (construction) sooner than later.



I'll provide another update here in the next week or so once I have identified 2-3 contractors. In the meantime, let me know if there are any issues or concerns.



Romance scams occur when a criminal adopts a fake online identity to gain a victim's affection and trust. The scammer then uses the illusion of a romantic or close relationship to manipulate and/or steal from the victim.

The scammer's intention is to establish a relationship as quickly as possible, endear himself to the victim, and gain trust. Scammers may propose marriage and make plans to meet in person, but that will never happen. Eventually, they will ask for money.

If some one you meet online needs your bank account information to deposit money, they are most likely using your account to carry out other theft and fraud schemes.

Tips for Avoiding Romance Scams:

- Be careful what you post and make public online. Scammers can use details shared on social media and dating sites to better understand and target you.
- Research the person's photo and profile using online searches to see if the image, name, or details have been used elsewhere.
- Go slowly and ask lots of questions.
 Beware if the individual seems too perfect or quickly asks you to
- leave a dating service or social media site to communicate directly. • Beware if the individual attempts to isolate you from friends and family or requests inappropriate photos or financial information that could later be used to extort you.
- Beware if the individual promises to meet in person but then always comes up with an excuse why he or she can't. If you haven't met the person after a few months, for whatever reason, you have good reason to be suspicious.
- Never send money to anyone you have only communicated with online or by phone. ReportFraud.ftc.gov

Editor's note: As of today, June 12, the winners of the 2024 Stanley Cup has not been determined.

The Stanley Cup, notably the oldest trophy competed for by professional athletes in North America, was donated in 1892 by Sir Frederick Arthur Stanley, Lord Stanley of Preston and son of the Earl of Derby. He purchased the trophy for 10 Guineas (\$50.00 at that time) to be presented to "the championship hockey club of the Dominion of Canada." The first team



ever awarded the Stanley Cup was the Montreal Amateur Athletic Association in 1893.

Since 1910, when the National Hockey Association took possession of the Stanley Cup, the trophy has been symbolic of professional hockey supremacy. Beginning in 1926, only NHL teams have competed for this prized trophy.

The Montreal Canadiens have won a record 23 Stanley Cups since the formation of the NHL (they also won in 1916), with Toronto a distant second at 13. The Habs also hold the record for most consecutive championships with five, accomplished between the years 1956 and 1960 inclusive.

There have been numerous alterations to the Cup structure. In its infancy, tiered rings were added periodically to the bottom of the bowl. This was followed by long narrow bands in 1927 which were later replaced by uneven bands in 1947. Because the Cup is the only professional sports trophy where the name of every member of the winning team is inscribed, bands are often retired to make room for new champions. Retired bands, along with the original Stanley Cup bowl, are proudly displayed in Lord Stanley's Vault in the Esso Great Hall. Currently the Cup consists of a bowl, three tiered bands, a collar, and five barrel or uniform bands. The trophy stands at 35.25 inches and weighs 34.5 pounds. (complete measurement and inscription breakdown).

Each year upon presentation of the trophy to the championship team, a summer of celebration begins, as each of the organization's players and staff enjoy 24 hours with the Cup - a tradition which has no rival in any sport. In its many years of existence, the Stanley Cup has traveled around the world, including stays in Russia, Japan, and Switzerland as well as atop mountain peaks through the Rockies and inside igloos in Canada's newest territory, Nunavut.

Overshadowing all other championship trophies in sports, the legend and glory of the Stanley Cup continues to live in the dreams of hockey players and fans alike.


