Co-op Updates

After the recommendation of our infrastructure committee, our maintenance group is modifying the design and placement of our speed bumps over the next several weeks. The changes will ease the impact on our golf carts while adding speed control to streets that haven't had any control. Safety and security are constant concerns regarding our residents so: speeding, stopping at intersections, parking issues, the use of FOBs at the clubhouse, trip hazards and other safety risks are prioritized. Please report any safety concerns you may see to the office.

Please prepare for Hurricane season. Make it a planned event, not a surprise. We hope the recent presentation at the HOA meeting was helpful in your preparation.

The Co-Op has been trying to ensure all residents are informed regarding all the issues and events happening at Paradise Island. We use the Monthly Media, direct emails to shareholders and/or leaseholders, the Paradise Island website (https://www.paradiseislandlargo.com/) which has an abundance of information, we also use the Paradise Island Facebook site (Paradise Island Largo) and the One Call system for more immediate notifications / announcements (please update your preferences). We have signs at the entrance that help advertise events. We have Informational bulletin boards and a suggestion box at the clubhouse to for communicating and you have the ability to come to the office to update your status or to leave concern forms and maintenance requests. Please utilize these methods for our mutual benefit, we are listening.



The Co-Op management doesn't monitor other Facebook sites, so you aren't doing anyone any good expressing your concern or solution there. The new Vantaca system by Resource Property Management is still being properly structured for us and will be fully available soon for your account information and other documents and information. If you still have any questions or concerns, please call or visit the Co-Op office for assistance.

Paradise Island works because it is a team effort and we feel we are doing our part managing the community and we need everyone to continue or start doing their part. Please partner with the community by reporting issues, take care of your homes, follow the rules and this will increase your safety and enjoyment of this great unique community, that we have here.



ne Call is the primary notification system the Co-Op utilizes for immediate communication. Messages can be received in several ways; a phone call, text message, or email. You can also choose to receive messages in a combination of ways; either phone call & email or texts & email. Please note; that when you sign up for text messages, you will not receive phone calls. If you are not already signed up to receive these messages or want to change how you receive them, please do so as soon as possible so you don't miss important notices. Complete an updated Contact Information Form available at the Office or on the PI Website https://paradiseislandlargo.com under "Resident Information".

The completed form should be returned to the office in person, by mail, or by email.

For those of you who change from phone call to text take the actions documented below:

In the US, Text the word Alert to 22300. In Canada, Text the word Resume to 1-833-827-0085. In any other country: Text the word Resume to +447937947401.

Then add 22300 to your contacts as PI One Call so you will recognize who the text is from.

There are so many services available to us such as ID Bracelets, Tracker Bracelets, Security Assessments with a lock box, Senior Assessment and assistance, Hurricane Preparedness information, Shelter Information etc. Just go into the Largo Police website. Call 727-587-6730 and ask for Officer Bowling or Joel Quattlebaum for details.

Community Flea Market

he Paradise Island Community Flea Market will happen once again on Saturday, October 12, 2024 from 9 am – 2 pm. The format will be different than the traditional Flea Market – we are giving the big room to YOU, our residents, to sell your own things (no craft items please – those are reserved for the Craft Fair). This will essentially be a giant community yard sale. Residents who want to sell items must complete an application and submit payment by September 12th. Space will be available on a first come, first served basis until all tables are rented.

To reserve one or more tables, you MUST come to the Club House on a Monday night between 6-7 pm starting August 5th. If that's not possible, you can also mail your application and check to Tiffani Neu, Lot 597. Applications will be posted on PIFAN and Paradise Island Largo, for you to print, towards the end of July. We will also put some at the Club House on the bulletin board.

Each table is 6 feet and will be \$15, with tables along the walls renting for \$20 (electricity is only available at the wall spaces). If you are going to sell things on a clothes rack, you can rent an additional 3 foot space next to your table for half of the table fee. We ask that any resident who will be participating, be available to set up their tables on Friday, Oct 11th from 6-9 pm. There will be no set-ups on Saturday morning due to the early start.

So please come by the Club House on Monday nights from 6-7 pm starting August 5th to ask any questions you have, pick up an application, submit your application with your check, and pick your table(s)! We will have information sheets with much more detail to give you when you stop by. All proceeds benefit the Paradise Island Social Committee.

Romance scams occur when a criminal adopts a fake online identity to gain a victim's affection and trust. The scammer then uses the illusion of a romantic or close relationship to manipulate and/or steal from the victim.

The scammer's intention is to establish a relationship as quickly as possible, endear himself to the victim, and gain trust. Scammers may propose marriage and make plans to meet in person, but that will never happen. Eventually, they will ask for money.

If someone you meet online needs your bank account information to deposit money, they are most likely using your account to carry out other theft and fraud schemes.

Tips for Avoiding Romance Scams:

- Be careful what you post and make public online. Scammers can use details shared on social media and dating sites to better understand and target you.
- Research the person's photo and profile using online searches to see if the image, name, or details have been used elsewhere.
- · Go slowly and ask lots of questions.
- Beware if the individual seems too perfect or quickly asks you to leave a dating service or social media site to communicate directly.
- Beware if the individual attempts to isolate you from friends and family or requests inappropriate photos or financial information that could later be used to extort you.
- Beware if the individual promises to meet in person but then always comes up with an excuse why he or she can't. If you haven't met the person after a few months, for whatever reason, you have good reason to be suspicious.
- Never send money to anyone you have only communicated with online or by phone.

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

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

VETERAN'S CORNER

Taps began as a revision to the signal for (Extinguish Lights) or (Lights out) a bugle call that was used as the final call of the day and as the name implies. It was a signal to extinguish all lights and fires. Up until the Civil War, the infantry calls for Extinguish Lights was one set down in Silas Casey's (1801-1882) Tactics, which had been borrowed from the French. The music for Taps was adapted by Union General Daniel Butterfield for his brigade in July 1862.

As the story goes, General Butterfield was not pleased with the call for Extinguished Lights, feeling that the call was too formal to signal the days end and with the help of the brigade bugler, Oliver Wilcox Norton, wrote Taps to honor his men while in camp Harrison's Landing, Virginia, following the Seven Day Battle. These battles took place during the Peninsular Campaign of 1862. The new call, sounded that night in July,1862, soon spread to other units of the Union Army and was reportedly also used by the Confederates. Taps was made the official bugle call after the war.

Why the name Taps? The most likely explanation is that the name was borrowed from a drummer's beat. The beating of a bedtime roll-call called Tattoo by the drum corps would be followed by the Drummer of the Guard beating three distinct drum taps at four count intervals, this was known as the "Drum Taps" or in common usage of soldiers "The Taps" or "Taps." As soon as Taps was sounded that night in July 1862, words were put to music. The first were, "Go to Sleep, Go to Sleep." As the years went on many more versions were created. There are no official words to the music but many popular verses exist today.

It is not clear how or why Taps became associated with funerals. However, it's official reference for use at military funeral ceremonies is found in the U.S. Army Infantry Drill Regulations for 1891.

How many of you knew that the National Defense Authorization Act of 2008 contained an amendment to allow uniformed service members, military retirees and veterans to render a hand salute during the hoisting, lowering, or passing of the U.S. Flag.

A later amendment was included in the Defense Authorization Act of 2009 that authorized the hand salute for the national anthem by out-of-uniformed military personnel and veterans. You should also always remove your hats. Veterans can also salute at military funerals when the flag covered coffin passes by and when Taps are played again removing your colors.
