





## LINCOLNSHIRE "FROM THE BEGINNING"

From: Booklet published 1997 - Lincolnshire Residents' Club.

#### **Introduction**

Park is now, or soon will be, in its 25th year of existence. This interesting anecdote has stuck in my mind and, since that day, I often wondered about such things as; 1). What was Lincolnshire and surrounding area like in those days of the early 1970's? (Roads, drainage, trees etc.). 2). How big was the park initially? (Streets, coaches, people etc.). 3). Activities for park residents? (Entertainment, dances, sports, etc.).

With this in mind, and armed with pencil/pen, notepaper and tape recorder, I set out to find and interview some of our park "pioneers". Initially, three such persons were found. Interviews were conducted and recorded. Newspaper clippings, historical documentation and other related items were made available to me by these people as an incentive to pursue the idea of gathering enough material and information for publication in booklet form. In essence, the compilation of a 25th Anniversary booklet outlining Lincolnshire history and living then to now.

Further interviews, material-gathering, library/newspaper research, etc. was conducted over a period of several months. The fruits of these efforts will be found in the ensuing pages of this booklet.

Unfortunately, the passage of time has taken its toll as some of those persons whom I had hoped to interview have since passed away or have moved back north.

The accuracy and authenticity of the material contained in this publication is solely reliant on the recollections and memories of those persons interviewed and from material borrowed from library/newspaper sources. Largo municipal office and Largo historical society records.

My heartfelt gratitude is expressed to all those kind persons and organizations that assisted me in any way in making this publication a reality.

Finally, I hope and trust that your interest and reading of this booklet will be both enjoyable and enlightening.



## ATTENTION ALL LINCOLNSHIRE RESIDENTS WHO USE THE COMPACTOR AND RECYCLE BINS!!!

When looking on-line for the proper use of a compactor, the following information was found: What can go into a compactor is waxed cartons (like cardboard/wax cartons that milk and broth come in), general waste such as plastic, food scraps and packing material.

Surprisingly, that is all that was found on several different sites. However, what CANNOT go into the compactors is:

No picture frames, glass or mirrors. No large pieces of wood. No small appliances. No ceiling fans. No electronic devices such as microwaves, laptops and phones. No hazardous materials such as paint, pesticides and batteries. No medical waste. No soil and dirt. No plastic bins. ....continued on page 32

#### **News and Updates:**

- ❖ Tips on safe and successful community living in Lincolnshire:
- > Stormwater and home, resident, and vehicle safety:
  - During and shortly after rain squalls where intense amounts of rain can fall in a
    noticeably short amount of time the park drives will tend to flood around the drains
    especially those on corners and end of the drives.
  - Our park drives are also graded to drain. Over time the drives do have areas that collect water due to aging of the pavement foundation like many regular city streets.
  - From the deluge of a hurricane with sustained rain in our summer rainy season squalls
    it does take time for neighborhoods in central Pinellas to drain to the bay or coast.
    Water will find its way out. Eventually.
  - Stormwater drainage can take minutes to longer times as the water moves away down
    drains into other tributaries, retention ponds or to the bay or gulf. Lincolnshire does
    have other neighborhoods who may drain first or with us. Often a water traffic jam.
  - As a result, standing water creates hazards for residents walking, with or without a pet, homes where water surges from fast moving vehicles sending waves of water up the driveways into their front drive screen rooms. Residents from other parts of the park simply must drive slowly in standing water. Be Respectful.
  - Seems little success trying to slow down vendors with trucks sitting high over the pavement and water appreciating the damage that can be caused.
- > Stormwater and home/resident safety:
  - Avoid walking with or without a pet in a flooded street or yard.
  - Ensure the downspouts on the coach do not drain straight down or rainwater will pool under the coach. Purchase inexpensive cement splash pans, they do not blow

lmost 80 Years Later, Audie Murphy's Medal of Honor Action Is Still Like Something Out of a Movie: Audie Murphy's Lone-man fight against the Nazis in Europe might seem like something straight out of a modern action movie, but his movie was actually made a decade after the battle ended -- and it still stands up today.



In January 1945, Allied victory in Europe was anything but assured. The German military launched a major offensive in December 1944 that had pushed Allied lines back into Belgium and France, but the resulting Battle of the Bulge forced the Nazis into a retreat. They were far from finished, however: on New Year's Eve, Nazi Germany launched what would be its last major offensive on the Western Front. Operation Northwind was an attempt to bolster its forces in the Bulge and destroy two Allied armies. American and French forces would fight for more than a month to not only prevent a German advance, but to push the Nazi Wehrmacht back into Germany. Though they finally succeeded, a powerful force of some 30,000 or more Germans were centered around the city of Colmar, forming a pocket of resistance in Eastern France that American troops would have to retake. Not only was it the last major Nazi foothold on French soil, but control of Colmar also allowed freedom of movement into Germany itself. One day late that January, near the village of Holtzwihr, northeast of Colmar, German forces struck out at advancing American

infantry. This is where Lt. Murphy would single-handedly hold the strategically important forest outside the town, despite being outmanned and outgunned by a veteran German Army.

It is safe to say Murphy knew his way around a battlefield and had a reliable intuition when it came to taking risks. By the time the U.S. Army advanced on the Colmar Pocket, Audie Leon Murphy had already received the Distinguished Service Cross, two Silver Stars and two Bronze Stars. He had enlisted at the tender age of sixteen, joining the Army in 1942 because it was the only branch that would accept his underweight frame. He was first sent to North Africa, then landed at Sicily, mainland Italy and eventually southern France. He then fought his way across Europe, earning a battlefield commission in October 1944. The danger the Colmar Pocket posed to the Allied advance into Germany was real. If the Nazis broke out, they could have routed the overstretched Seventh Army and then hit the advancing Third Army in the rear, potentially destroying it, too. From there, the Wehrmacht could have retaken the port of Antwerp and pushed the Allies back into the English Channel. That was the reason the Allies could not just hole up such a powerful pocket of enemy troops and armor. Something had to be done.

On Jan. 23, 1945, the U.S. 3rd Infantry Division's 30th Infantry Regiment advanced through the Bois de Riedwihr, a forest near Holtzwihr, when it was suddenly attacked by a large force of enemy tanks, tank destroyers and infantry. The 30th was caught in an open ground and was unable to dig into the frozen earth, ending up mangled by the attacking Germans and ordered to withdraw. To fill the gap, the Americans ordered the 15th Infantry to take its place. The very next day, on the southern edge of the woods, German tanks and infantry hit the regiment's Company B hard, wounding 102 of its 120 enlisted men and killing all its officers except one: Lt. Audie Murphy. That same day, Murphy led what was left of his company into the woods, where they, too, were unable to dig any kind of foxhole. They worked through the night but could not make any progress in the snow and cold. The next morning, Murphy was reinforced with two tank destroyers from the 601st Tank Destroyer Battalion and used them, along with five armored vehicles, to form a defensive position. It was better but it was still weak, and they could see the heavily defended village of Holtzwihr from this spot. It was now Jan. 26, 1945. Murphy had made the most of what was available but was informed that his reinforcements had not yet arrived -- and they would not make it that day. At 2 p.m. that day, six tanks and 250 elite German mountain troops moved out of the village toward their position. Murphy only had time to get to a phone and call for artillery before the shooting started. It turns out the road to a German victory in the Colmar Pocket ran right through the road his company was holding. The American tank destroyers opened on the oncoming German tanks immediately, but their fire was ineffective. They were taken out either by enemy tank rounds or poor maneuvering, which scattered surviving anti-tank troops into the forest. The only silver lining was the M10 tank destroyers' mounted guns, which tore into the German infantry, but even that did not last long. Company B's machine gun crew was hit next. Murphy knew his unit could not hold this vital stretch and ordered his men to fall back into the forest. He would cover their retreat while directing artillery fire.

With the Germans advancing and his carbine out of ammunition, Murphy spied a burning tank destroyer and its remaining .50-caliber gun. Instead of going back into the forest, he climbed aboard the turret and began pouring fire into the oncoming enemy advance. He believed the tanks could not advance without infantry, so he began mowing them down. Murphy was right; as he cut down enemy troops, the German tanks were forced to fall back to their own tree line. He fought on as enemy tank shells and artillery exploded around him. For an hour, Murphy was obscured by smoke and firing the machine gun, stopping only to reload, call in artillery fire or recover from the exploding 88-millimeter shells. After what must have seemed like days, the clouds parted, and he was able to get close-air support from Allied air power. In the face of all that firepower, the Germans finally began a retreat toward the village. It was great timing for Murphy because his phone to Allied artillery suddenly went dead. He left the tank destroyer and rejoined his men in the relative safety of the forest. After he reached the tree line, the turret on which he stood for that entire hour blew up, tossing it sky high. Refusing to be evacuated or deterred, Murphy then began to plan a counterattack, retaking their original position from the remaining Germans. Company B held its ground throughout that night and the reinforced 30th Infantry Regiment captured the village the next day. Had Murphy not made his stand atop the burning armored vehicle, it is likely the entire company, undermanned and demoralized, would have been annihilated.

\*\*\*\*\*

Murphy was promoted to first lieutenant and received the Legion of Merit for his leadership during the Colmar Pocket operation. On June 2, 1945, Lt. Gen. Alexander Patch, commander of the Seventh Army, presented the 19-year-old Murphy with the Medal of Honor for his actions outside of Holtzwihr. By the war's end, he would famously receive every medal for valor the United States offered, along with three Purple Hearts for his trouble. After the war, Murphy went off to Hollywood, where he began a slow but lucrative film career, landing his first leading role in 1949's "Bad Boy." That film led to a contract with Universal Pictures, where he was particularly known for his war movies (whether they were his story or not) and for his westerns. He later parlayed his success in western films into making country music and western television series.

As the most decorated soldier of World War II, he not only wrote his popular autobiography "To Hell and Back," but also played himself in the 1955 movie of the same name, along with some 40 other films, including "The Unforgiven," "The Quiet American" and "A Time for Dying." His performance in "To Hell and Back" was so solid that the movie made him a massive star, one of Universal's "Big Four" leading men alongside Tony Curtis, Rock Hudson and Jeff Chandler. Murphy would go on to join the Texas National Guard and Army Reserve while being an outspoken advocate of post-traumatic stress disorder research and treatment, from which he personally suffered for the rest of his life. He died at age 45 in 1971, a passenger on a private plane that crashed into a mountain near Roanoke, Virginia, and was interred at Arlington National Cemetery.

was not sure what to write about for September. After learning about at least three falls in the last month, all ages. One at the pool, another in the coach tripping on a small area rug and the latest missing the bottom cement step at the front door. Quite sure there are numerous others either slip, stumble or slide to the floor. No loss of life though injury and necessary recuperation (a bit like being grounded as a teen.)

We live in a "Over 55" park though a second home resident can be 45 years old. Considering the oldest to youngest we have 50+ average years of age differences residing in 463 coaches. Whew.

More residents work now, full or part time, in the park. Not to mention those who volunteer. A gradual change over the last few years especially since Covid and other economic pressures created the difference between a yearlong living park versus a seasonal vacation park of the past. Things change.

Though the risk of falling wherever has not been reduced. Perhaps even risen. A lot of reasons it seems.

Let us get into the diverse ways to reduce not only the likelihood of falling each day plus how to diminish the risk in our coaches. One out of six adults in the U.S. will fall each year, putting them at risk of injury, broken bones and leading to a fatal outcome in more seniors.

- ✓ falling risks especially as we age can are reduced with these simple steps:
- Fall-proof our homes (all of them if you have them.) Remove small rugs (a tripping event waiting to happen and will.) Uneven flooring transitions too.
- change out dim lighting and do not put pots and pans in hard-to-reach places.
- In places where it is easier to lose your balance, a grab bar in a bathroom and no-slip strips on wood or tile floors especially by entry doors. Know where all the furniture sharp edges are, corner guards can help.
- It is also important to keep our coaches clean: Do not leave items on the floor and clean up spills before they dry up and become harder to deal with.
- Consider using a walker or cane to keep you stable, but make sure it is right for your height and that you know how to use it properly.
- Exercise to build strength and balance. There are medical licensed balance therapists now.
- Many exercises that can help prevent falls, even if you have limited mobility, like chair yoga, water aerobics and walking. Available almost weekly in Lincolnshire.
- Medications may increase your risk of falling. Many medications can have side effects like light-headedness, sleepiness or other things that impair your balance. Read the precautions.
- Changes in our hearing, vision and other senses are common as we age and can contribute to falls. Make sure to have your hearing and vision evaluated regularly.
- Bone health matters, too.
- Scoot small pets away from under your feet before you move.
- ✓ Falls are not usually caused by one thing and can combination of causes have been mentioned above. And, if we do fall, let your doctor know. A fall can have wide-reaching implications for our health and future. If you think of a subject that will benefit the residents, please let me know.




