



Notes from the March 6 Annual Membership Meeting

on Hanson thanked all those residents who volunteered to be on the board to take on a leadership role in the management of our park including Duke Ganote, Unit #31, and Ed Winseck, Unit #175. He expressed his appreciation to the members of the board he served with and said he and Vivian would miss us. They moved back to Canada and plan to do some traveling.

Some damage from the October hurricanes was covered by insurance including the fence repairs and the palm trees but not the shuffle board awnings. Tony reported the estimate for the shuffle board awning replacement is \$37,000; hopefully work to start in the Apr/May timeframe and to be completed before fall 2025. Some palm trees will be replaced with shorter Foxtail trees sooner or later to spread out replacement expense. Two major projects are budgeted: palm tree replacement and the east side ditch from the Reserve Fund. Romance Scams

Romance scams occur when a criminal adopts a fake online identity to gain a victim's affection and trust. The scammer then uses the illusion of a romantic or close relationship to manipulate and/or steal from the victim

The scammer's intention is to establish a relationship as quickly as possible, endear himself to the victim, and gain trust. Scammers may propose marriage and make plans to meet in person, but that will never happen. Eventually, they will ask for money.

If someone you meet online needs your bank account information to deposit money, they are most likely using your account to carry out other theft and fraud schemes.

Tips for Avoiding Romance Scams:

- Be careful what you post and make public online. Scammers can
 use details shared on social media and dating sites to better
 understand and target you.
- Research the person's photo and profile using online searches to see if the image, name, or details have been used elsewhere.
- Go slowly and ask lots of questions.
- Beware if the individual seems too perfect or quickly asks you to leave a dating service or social media site to communicate directly.
- Beware if the individual attempts to isolate you from friends and family or requests inappropriate photos or financial information that could later be used to extort you.
- Beware if the individual promises to meet in person but then always comes up with an excuse why he or she can't. If you haven't met the person after a few months, for whatever reason, you have good reason to be suspicious.
- Never send money to anyone you have only communicated with online or by phone.

Park Rules



veryone must adhere to the park rules including your guests. It is essential in order to keep our park a 5* Star Park, and everyone happy! If you see something suspicious, say something. Let's all be vigilant! Be observant, look out for your neighbors to be sure they are well and not in need of help.

- 1. Park Speed Limit is 15MPH for all vehicles.
- 2. Do Not Park in Neighbors' Driveways without permission. The park office needs proof to confirm this. Do not park on sidewalks. No parking on streets between 11PM and 7AM.
- **3. Guest overnight parking** is not allowed in common areas without Management permission. It is allowed around the Clubhouse with appropriate permit obtained from the office.
- 4. Residents must **register all guests** with the office. Guest Registration Form are near the Bulletin Board.
- 5. No Pets other than caged birds and fish. This means your guests too! Exception: Service and "Emotional Therapeutic Support Animals". Residents requesting a waiver must provide verification forms to be completed on a yearly basis by a Licensed Mental Health Professional Therapist, Psychologist and Psychiatrist or a Physician confirming the Resident's physical/emotional/psychiatric disability. As may be required by law any approved service or support animal specifically trained to aid and assist sight or hearing impaired, or other disabled resident or occupant shall be prohibited by Colonial Village from residing with the resident or approved occupant. However, the resident or approved occupant, must make application and register said service or support animal and show proof of licensing and required vaccinations and inoculations as set forth in the Rules. In addition, all Rules are applicable to service or support animals trained and certified to assist disabled and impaired residents and/or approved occupants.
- **6. Noise**. No loud vehicles and motorcycles. Three legitimate written complaints as to noise, the gasoline powered vehicle will be prohibited from Colonial Village. All complaints should be in writing, dated and signed.
- 7. Yard waste needs to be placed in the bin on Virginia Drive, NOT in the trash and recycle bins at the Colonial Drive entrance; this includes cut-up pieces of wood, furniture and such.
- 8. Do not put plastic bags with Recyclables in dumpster. Empty your bag and take it with you or place it in the garbage bin. Cardboard boxes must be broken down before being placed in the dumpster bins. When done, be sure to close the bin door to keep the squirrels out! Please Recycle your Aluminum cans in the Maintenance North Garage. Be sure to rinse the cans before crushing them to avoid bugs and bees and roaches! There is a can crusher on the wall in front of the large barrel. The garage door is open 8:30-3:45.

U.S. Cities With Distinct Smells

For decades, motorists driving Interstate 5 through Tacoma, just south of Seattle, were greeted by an unpleasant scent, much like Rotorua's rotten egg odor. However, Tacoma's scent was of a more unnatural variety: a combination of pollution from adjacent Commencement Bay — once considered one of the 10 worst toxic waste sites in the U.S. — and the noxious air pouring from smokestacks of nearby industries, such as paper mills and smelting factories. In a 1984 cover story Rolling Stone, New Jersey rocker Bruce Springsteen revealed that he canceled a show at the Tacoma Dome because "something in the air" made him "sick to his stomach." Whether it was the loss of the Boss or just an increase in environmental awareness, Tacoma has cleaned up its act, and the stench has lessened considerably — but its memorable nickname, the "Aroma of Tacoma," will live on in history.

San Jose, CA

Located about 30 miles southeast of San Jose, California, Gilroy is known for one thing and one thing only: garlic. The crop was established in the area in the mid-20th century, and the unmistakable odor it produced quickly turned into the joke of the town. But Gilroy decided to go a;; in on garlic and held the first annual Gilroy Garlin Festival in 1979. By the time of the first festival, the garlic-growing industry had moved inland, but the factories that dehydrated and processed the bulbs were still in Gilroy, supplying the town with a consistent garlic aroma. The summer celebration now attracts upwards of 100,000 attendees, making it the world's

largest garlic festival. Gilroy is also home to other garlicky attractions, from the Garlin City Café, the Garlic Farm Inn, and the Garlin Twirl amusement park ride at Gilroy Gardens.

Chicago, IL

Thankfully, a particular section of Chicago, Illinois, bucks the sour-smelling trends of other cities on this list. Along a stretch of the Chicago River — where exactly depends on wind speed and direction — Chicagoans are treated to the sweet smell of chocolate thanks to the Blommer Chocolate Company, located in the Fulton River District northwest of the Loop. In 2014, a local resident even began mapping the chocolate smell by measuring its approximate range and cross-referencing with weather patterns from the National Weather Service. When the factory had to shut down its retail space during the COVID-19 pandemic, local residents worried that the chocolate aroma was next on the chopping block, but fortunately, a spokesperson for the company confirmed, "The smell will continue."

Buffalo, NY

If you're a fan of cereal, Buffalo, New York, is your town. For 80 years, General Mills has manufactured Cheerios (called Cheeri-Oats when the product was invented back in 1941) in the upstate New York city, and the toasted oat smell still permeates Buffalo's streets to this day. The oats are baked along the Buffalo River, and the wind from Lake Erie blanket the town in a cereal aroma — from Cheerios, Lucky Charms, Chex, or whatever part of a balanced breakfast the nearby plant is making that day. The town doesn't seem to mind, as the local tourism board has even held events celebrating the odor, and one local clothing brand sold T-shirts proclaiming, "My city smells like Cheerios" — a badge of pride woven in cotton.


Do You Wonder Why People Are Not Smiling in Your Old Family Photos?


hese early photographic portraits transport us back in time, painting a picture of a different way of life: Families were larger, clothes were bulkier, and postures were noticeably stiff and formal. But perhaps the most conspicuous difference of all is that no one ever seemed to smile.

The somber expressions preserved in early photographs might lead us to assume that past generations led austere and joyless lives. However, the lack of joviality in these snapshots can be attributed to several other factors. Here's tin the earliest days of photography, the lengthy exposure periods made it impractical to photograph people. For instance, French inventor Nicéphore Niépce's 1826 "View from the Window at Le Gras," credited as the oldest surviving photograph, required an exposure time of eight hours. It was more than a decade before Louis Daguerre's 1839 invention of the daguerreotype made portrait photography practical. But even then, it was a relatively slow and meticulous process that required the subject to remain still

for as long as 20 minutes.

By the early 1840s, photographic technology had advanced further, and the daguerreotype images that once required a 20-minute exposure needed only 20 seconds to process. Still, even modern photo subjects understand the difficulty of maintaining an open-mouthed smile for any amount of time. It only takes a few moments for a candid smile to turn into something more like an awkward grimace. And anyone who has dealt with a restless child can attest that more than a few seconds of remaining motionless is a formidable challenge. To minimize movement and guarantee a sharp image, children were sometimes put into restraints for the length of a photo shoot.

Additionally, until the 20th century, the expense of photographic equipment and the toxic and dangerous chemicals needed to process film meant that most photographs were taken by professional photographers working out of studios or traveling with their equipment. A photography session was a time-consuming and pricey undertaking; it cost the average person as much as three or more months' salary, and a person might only be photographed a few times in their life. The requirement for stillness, combined with the novelty and cost of posing for a professional photographer, created an atmosphere where it was simply easier to maintain a neutral or serious expression. But even once the technology existed to capture more relaxed expressions, it was a long time before smiling in photos became the norm.

St. Lucia Is the Only Country Named After a Woman

Thile Ireland is named after the mythical goddess Eiru, there's only one sovereign nation in the world named for a real-life woman. That distinction lies with St. Lucia, a Caribbean island nation christened in honor of St. Lucy of Syracuse, saint of the blind, who died around the fourth century CE.

St. Lucia was initially called Louanalao (meaning "Island of the Iguanas") by the Indigenous Arawak people as early as 200 CE. It was in 1502 that the origins of its current name formed, when shipwrecked French sailors dubbed the place "Sainte Alousie." It was a common practice at the time to name islands after saints, and legend has it that the sailors reached the island on December 13 — St. Lucy's Feast Day. Given the date's significance, December 13 is now celebrated in the country as the National Day of St. Lucia. The Spanish who arrived around 1511 named the island "Sancta Lucia"; the current name formed after waves of colonization by the English and French.

While female namesakes are rare on a national level, one woman has lent her name to dozens of smaller locations. The name of Queen Victoria, the U.K.'s reigning monarch from 1837 to 1901, appears in the titles of locations around the globe, such as the provincial capital of British Columbia, Canada, and Zimbabwe's breathtaking Victoria Falls. You'd be hard-pressed to find an American woman with influence so vast. Even in the U.S., only a handful of

Practice Proper Flower Care for a Long-Lasting Arrangement

ne penny isn't enough to keep cut flowers looking their best. Follow these care instructions for long-lasting blooms:

- 1. Sterilize your vase by cleaning it with warm water and dish soap. If the opening is too narrow to reach into, you can use one or two denture tablets to remove stubborn residue and kill bacteria.
- 2. Cut about 1 to 2 inches from the bottom of each stem at a 45-degree angle. Repeat this process every two to three days until it's time to toss the arrangement. Remove any lower leaves that may come into contact with the water, as this can cause contamination.
- 3. Fill the vase two-thirds full with lukewarm water and add a copper penny for good measure. You may want to top up your vase with fresh water the following day as the flowers will be especially thirsty. After that, you should replace the water every two to three days.
- 4. Avoid placing flowers in direct sunlight or exposing them to extreme temperatures. Keep your arrangement away from heat sources, cooling systems, or even drafty doors and windows.
- 5. Remove any dead flowers from the arrangement to protect those that are still healthy. Mold spreads easily from stem to stem, so this should be done daily. While dropping an old copper penny into a flower vase is more of an old wives' tale than scientific fact, it's a low-cost trick worth trying. Pair your farmers market blooms with a crushed aspirin tablet to lower the water's pH level or a spoonful of vodka to slow ethylene production, and they may last even longer.
