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
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

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FIRE IN THE KITCHEN



I will need a couple of volunteers for sign up, \$\$ collection and organize.

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



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

Halloween

Origins & History

• Ancient Celtic Festival of Samhain: Halloween traces back over 2,000 years to the Celtic festival of Samhain, marking the end of the harvest and the beginning of winter. Celts believed that on this night, the boundary between the living and the dead blurred, allowing spirits to roam the earth.



- Christian Influence: In the 8th century, Pope Gregory III designated November 1 as All Saints' Day, and the night before became known as All Hallows' Eve, eventually shortened to Halloween.
- American Evolution: Irish and Scottish immigrants brought Halloween to the U.S. in the 19th century. It evolved from somber spiritual traditions into a fun, community-centered celebration



Traditions & Activities

- Trick-or-Treating: Children dress in costumes and go door-to-door saying "Trick or treat!" to receive candy. This practice stems from medieval "souling," where people collected food in exchange for prayers.
- Costume Parties: People of all ages wear costumes ranging from spooky creatures to pop culture icons and attend themed parties.
- Pumpkin Carving & Jack-o'-Lanterns: Inspired by Irish folklore about "Stingy Jack," people carve pumpkins into faces and light them with candles to ward off spirits.
- Haunted Houses & Corn Mazes: These attractions offer spooky thrills with eerie decorations, jump scares, and ghostly themes.
- Horror Movies & Storytelling: Watching scary films and sharing ghost stories are popular ways to embrace Halloween's eerie vibe.



Symbols & Superstitions

- Witches & Black Cats: Associated with magic and superstition.
- Skeletons & Gravestones: Symbolize death and the afterlife.

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

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


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Halloween Humor
