Teek by week, the number of Palm Hillers playing Bocce on the newly refurbished Bocce Courts off Queen Palm Street is increasing. And so are the spectators.

The court was closed for several weeks this summer while Suncoast Renovations, LLC rehabbed the area after winning the bid. The Building and Grounds Committee managed the contract and oversaw the construction. The

Today, the clay and sand beds of the Bocce courts are level and improved, there are new sturdy steps and comfortable, covered handrails, and new pressure-treated wooden block siderails. That has increased the accuracy of the Bocce tactic of bouncing the balls off the rails to achieve strategic positioning on the courts, said Joe Cothran, who lives on Queen Palm and organizes a regularly scheduled Wednesday evening group Bocce play.

Anyone can come out to play with the group, which starts gaming at 6 p.m. Wednesdays under the lights. The courts are next to the outdoor cornhole courts. In the balmy tropical summer evenings, Bocce play starts at 7 p.m. Sometimes the sounds of the pickleball or tennis players on the courts off King Palm Street just across the grass increase the festive atmosphere.

The Bocce courts are open to all during the day and early evenings. Balls are available in bags in the shed behind the Shuffleboard building.

BOCCE HAS A LONG HISTORY

Forms of Bocce were played during the Roman Empire and forms of "lawn bowling" are shown in medieval tapestries. It is known as a game perfected in Italy, and many Italian communities rally around Bocce as a central focus of community life.

HOW BOCCE IS PLAYED

According to Bocceboss.com, teams are positioned at either end of the courts. Eight balls are used, four to a team, with a smaller ball called a pallino or "jack". The "jack" is a different color than the team balls and serves as a target for the larger balls. Players use the side rails of the courts to bounce off and direct balls to strategic positions at opposite end of the courts.

The main objective of the game is to throw the Bocce balls closer to the pallino than the opposing team's Bocce balls. A measurement device is used to determine the distance of the Bocce ball to the pallino, sometimes called a "jack".

Bocce rules state that each game consists of a series of matches known as "frames." After each round, points are awarded to whichever team has their ball closest to the pallino. The first team to reach 12 points wins the Bocce ball game.

Close by the Bocce courts is the covered shuffleboard building, damaged in the 2024 hurricane. Repair was nearing completion at the LINK's deadline, said Joe. The organized Shuffleboard clubs now play in the North.

Four horse shoe pits are also available near the Bocce courts.

Equipment for these outdoor activities – horse shoes and Bocce balls (in bags) are all available in the sheds behind the shuffleboard courts building. The equipment is also for use outside of the organized group events or play. Cornhole boards and bean bags are also available in the plastic shed at the end of the courts for those who wish to play corn hole outside of the special organized events, said Sandy Sullivan, Cornhole event organizer. The Shuffleboard Club leaves equipment – the disks and sticks (cues) – at the courts for use by Palm Hillers playing outside of scheduled events, said Stew Ashton, Social Shuffle coordinator.



our Seats on the Board of Directors will be available in the January 2026 election.

Three, three-year term seats and one, one-year term. The top three vote-getters will get the three-year seats and the fourth-place winner will get the one-year term.

DECEMBER 12: Candidates' Notice Of Intent to seek election due at the Office. Ideally, candidates would return their information sheets when they return their Notice of Intent sheets. That would allow the second notice of the annual meeting to be sent to shareholders as soon as possible.

DECEMBER 15: Meet the Candidates Event, 4 to 5:30 p.m., North Clubhouse. Red Palm Hill shareholder badges will be required for entry.

DECEMBER 17: 8 ½ by 11-inch, single sided Informational Sheet is due to the Office no later than 4 p.m.

DECEMBER 22: Second notice for Election (with ballots) and Annual Meeting will be mailed.

JANUARY 21: Annual Election and Annual Meeting. Meeting starts at 1 p.m. North Clubhouse. Electronic voting will close at 10 a.m. Ballots will be accepted at the Office until 10 a.m. and at the meeting until the meeting starts.

The Communications Committee will announce when a **Special Election Section will be posted on the website** in the weeks after Candidates Night but before the election that will include bio info and candidates' written answers to a set of questions.

ONLINE AND PAPER VOTING: Get Quorum is the online voting software that has been sending out requests to sign up. The emails are coming from notices@getquorum.com. At the LINK's deadline, we had 750 signed up for online voting. The remaining 359 will receive a paper ballot that will be mailed on or before December 22. Those receiving the notice electronically will receive the information the same day it is mailed.

Online voting can begin – on or before December 22 as soon as the notice is sent.

Paper ballots will be mailed in late December and must be returned to the Office by Jan. 21, 2026 by 10 a.m.





The Toilet Water-Saving Testing Program is still active and approved to repair toilets that waste water.

With the water and sewer bills costing \$23 per every 1,000 gals of water, this is an excellent place to reduce our expenses where we can. Since this project began, about 300 toilets have been fixed.

Any place we can conserve water we can reduce our expenses. When a toilet or faucet is changed, there are options with some devices that use less water; please choose wisely.

To test toilets, pick up dye tablets available at the Office. The description of how to use the dye tablets is attached to the bag. If your toilet shows to be leaking water, go to the Office and fill out a consent form with your contact info so a volunteer can come by to make the toilet repair.


If for some reason you cannot test your toilet, we have volunteers who can come by and perform the test for you. Just call the office and ask to put your name on the list to test your toilet.

pectrum has been working in Palm Hill laying the conduits that will contain the new fiber optics, said Bob Newport, board member. Once that phase is complete, Spectrum will then begin to connect the new system to the homes. One estimate is that the project may be completed by year's end.

In the new system, residents will receive two XUMO streaming boxes as part of the bulk package. If a resident needs help with the new system, he or she should contact Spectrum. Specify to the customer service representative that your service is part of a bulk contract at Palm Hill in Largo, Florida.

Points to note:

- 1. If you want to watch 732 now before the new system is up and running, and you update to the new XUMO boxes, keep an old set top box to access the old 732 channel.
- 2. We are working to get the new cloud version of 732 running and when up, both should be available for a while.
- 3. If you go to Spectrum and get the new ZUMO box(es) and take them home but cannot make them work, call Spectrum and tell them the installation FAILED, and you need help.



SANITATION FIELD

PALM HILL RULES AND REGULATIONS, SECTION 6 – O:

Use of Sanitation Area: The sanitation area is available for the purpose of material handling of recyclables, non-recyclables, vegetation, and construction materials.

The use of the construction bin shall be used strictly for the purposes of construction material and household items such as furniture. Renovation debris, such as kitchen cupboards, shall be broken down as to minimize the volume required of the construction bin. Electronics, tires, paints, oil, metals including aluminum, and hazardous materials are not permitted. Items that can be recycled should be separated and placed by the appropriate refuse or recycle bin. Recycled items are not to be taken/ removed by a resident or individual. No dumping of construction material or refuse directly on the ground is permitted under any circumstance(s).

Should the construction bin be filled, the office shall be notified, and appropriate arrangements made for disposal.

Should such abuse of the sanitation area occur, the cost of such cleanup will be borne by the resident and may include suspension of access and associated fining. Sanitation facilities are restricted to Palm Hill homes only. All others, including commercial use by contractors, individuals outside the corporation, will be considered unauthorized and trespassing.
