Looking ahead to 2026

s we look forward to 2026, we appreciate the residents who have used our services to assist them with the sale and purchase of their homes. In 2025, there were 41 homes that sold, which means there were at least 41 new residents who came to the community.

"It's easy to refer to home sales in terms of the home rather than the people who have purchased," commented Broker Marty Pozgay. With each home sale, there are new residents who become members of the community and become friends and neighbors.

The number of new residents can add up. In the past four years, there were 189 people who moved into the community. That does not include family members of residents who may have moved into the home or people who are renting from homeowners. A breakdown follows: 43 homes sold in 2024, 49 homes sold in 2023, and 56 homes sold in 2022 when it was a strong seller's market.

What are the market predictions for 2026? The National Association of Realtors is forecasting the following trends:

- 6.2% average interest rates with a prediction of lowering to 5.9% by year end.
- More balanced market between buyers and sellers. 2024 and 2025 saw a strong buyer's market in the Tampa Bay area due to the increase in inventory causing sellers to lower pricing. More stable pricing is predicted for 2026.
- In Florida, insurance rates will hold steady if no natural disasters occur such as a direct hit from a hurricane, according to the Florida Realtors Association.

Overall, the Tampa Bay area remains an attractive housing market for its continued population growth and its popular beaches that bring tourists. "The dream of living in warm weather and enjoying the beach is still a draw for many people," notes Pozgay. "If they are new retirees, they will be looking for an affordable place to live, and Americana Cove is a great choice."
