PHONE BOOKS ARE HERE!

You can pick up a new Amber Glades Phone Book at the park office.

n the front cover you will notice that it is the 42nd Edition. Maggie McDonald has a collection of the other 41, if you are interested. She shared with me the first edition. Even her name is not listed in the 1st edition. She moved in just after it was printed. In fact, no one is mentioned in that first edition that is in this years' book.

Yes, the entire Amber Glades population has turned over in that time. And grew! In 1974 there were 203 families listed and this year 435.

Comparing the books, we find 4 different emergency phone numbers listed in the 1974 book and only one today -- 911. The first edition listed 4 area hospitals, 7 are listed today. Of these seven hospitals only 2 are the same and Mease Dunedin Hospital is the only one that lists the same phone number as 42 years ago.

Amber Glades has definitely expanded and the booklet now contains a map in the center of it so you can negotiate your way around the sometimes confusing lot numbers (SOMETIMES???).

The newer book also has a listing by Lot Number, not just by last name. That way when we forgetful, older people say, "You know, the people who live down by so-and-so at the end of Jade." You can look at the Lot Number listing and find their last name and therefore look them up in the general listing for first names and phone number.

Other new features are a two year calendar and listings for the Amber Glades Office, HOA Officers, Social Committee Members and Activity Chairpersons.

Advertising helps pay for the booklet so that it is free to consumers. But, advertisers are down. In the first edition there were 20 advertisers and in today's only 6. For some reason this fact intrigues me. I can't imagine that printing costs have gone down that much, so I am inclined to believe that advertising costs have become too great for the "little" guy to afford.

[Having just run this article by my husband and critic, he points out that the first booklet was hand-set by Linotype and more manual work was involved whereas today computers do most of the work and copy machines take over collating, folding and stapling.]

Taking a looking at, and comparing the old 1st Edition of the Amber Glades Phonebook with the new one has been fun. My greatest take away from looking at the books printed 42 years apart isn't the interesting differences, but, that I found there is an emergency number for Amber Glades! It's on my refrigerator now with all the other numbers I hope to never have to use.

FOURTH OF JULY TRIVIA

- Most of the signers of the Declaration of Independence actually signed the document on August 2, 1776. Only two signed the document on July 4th.
- Three of the first 5 presidents died on the fourth of July. John Adams, Thomas Jefferson and James Monroe. Adams and Jefferson both died on the same day in 1826.
- Calvin Coolidge, 30th president, was born on the fourth of July in 1872.
- The 4th of July became a legal Federal holiday in 1938.
- There is something written on the back of the Declaration of Independence. [NO! Not a treasure map as Nicholas Cage's character claims in "National Treasure"]. Written upside down at the bottom of the signed document is, "Original Declaration of Independence dated 4th July 1776." It is not known who wrote this or when it was written. Since parchment was normally rolled up in those days, it's thought to have served as a label.





Balance your internal 'thinker' and 'doer' to bring ideas to life

- Take small risks. Get used to uncertainty by using your imagination when the risks are minimal. You'll build confidence as you learn what works and what doesn't.
- Search for data. Be on the lookout for all the information you can gather about the problem you're trying to solve—and about your organization and industry. The more facts you have, the better the creative decisions you'll make.
