The New FEMA Base Flood Elevation and Tax Rate Plan - Why We Need to Unite and Fight

There is an important issue looming on the horizon for all of the manufactured home communities with-in St. Petersburg and Pinellas County. The issue involves the projected impact of the new FEMA Base Flood Elevation (BFE) plan. The new FEMA BFE Plan is expected to be approved by the City of St Petersburg and fully enacted by years end (2020). Based on the information presented by City of St Petersburg officials at the Town Hall Meeting at Americana Cove in February, the new FEMA BFE plan will require, among other things,continued in page 14



that new homes built within FEMA A-flood zone map areas (Americana Cove) must be further elevated so that the lowest floor is at or above the new reported BFE of 11 feet.

Let us at Americana Cove describe what possible impacts the new FEMA BFE changes might have. First, the new BFE of 11 feet will have an extreme cost impact in per unit to construct the new ground based block, rebar and poured concrete fortifications, as well as the cost for the bigger staircases and ramps among other things. The new addition of 2 feet to BFE will require a minimum of **3 additional steps** to be added to the 8-9 steps currently required to be included within the staircase of all newly constructed homes.

We should not believe that adoption of the plan will justify any potential savings in city and county flood insurance rate. We also should not consider the plan as automatically approved or inevitable. If we in the manufactured home retirement communities want to preserve and sustain our communities home values and appearances into the future, and avoid the inconvenience, added costs, and health risks, we need to make a unified stand at future St Petersburg city board meetings to express how these simple changes in BLE (if adopted) will have diverse and monumental impact and will not come without added costs and inconvenience, both to that of the community and to individual homeowners.

Future St Petersburg city board meetings re: this issue will be posted at club house, we urge all those who can to attend.

Housing supply is low; prices are increasing


The Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corp. (Freddie Mac) recently conducted a housing study that found that the U.S. housing market is in need of 3.3 million housing units, and there will be a shortage of more than 300,000 homes each year for the next decade. Approximately half of all U.S. states have a housing shortage with Oregon having the largest deficit. It is followed by California, Minnesota, Florida, Colorado and Texas.

"Years of underbuilding has created the deficit particularly in states with strong economies that attract people from other states," according to the National Association of Realtors.

The lack of housing will continue for many years in Florida as currently there are 900 people per day moving into the state, according to the Florida Office of Economic and Demographic Research.
