• EDUCATED by Tara Westover (memoir) – Tara Westover grew up preparing for the End of Days in rural Idaho with radical survivalist Mormon parents. She didn't get a birth certificate until she was nine and had no medical records because her father didn't believe in doctors; She and her six older siblings worked in her father's junkyard. As she grew older, her father's beliefs became more extreme and one of her brothers grew violent. At 17, she decided to educate herself as a means of escape. Within 10 years she had earned a PhD in intellectual history and political thought from Cambridge but was estranged from her parents and half of her siblings. Now 31 and still living in Cambridge, she has written a powerful memoir, Educated, about the transformative power of education and the price she had to pay for it. Learning along the way that to be educated is to learn much more about the world than what's contained in books.




Growing "Metta" Gratitude: How grateful we are for a community that has wisely participated in steps to slow the transmission of Covid-19.

#### **Helping Hands - How to Avoid Getting Scammed!**

Thile staying home may be getting boring, it's still open season on seniors for scams. They can happen in a variety of ways. To avoid being scammed, look for these RED FLAGS:

- Being asked to pay money to receive your prize.
- Being pressured to act quickly.
- The use of scare tactics if you don't act right now.
- Asking you to wire money.
- Schemes that sound too good to be true. (They usually are!)

One thing each of us can do is to add our phone number to the DO NOT CALL Registry by going to **donotcall.gov**. Scanners can still call you, but if you are on the DoNotCall list, you know it is a scam.

Common scams include:

<u>Sweepstakes/Lottery scams:</u> You are told that you have won a sweepstakes, but you must first pay the taxes or customs duties, typically by wire transfer. Legitimate sweepstakes will not ask you to pay tax-es or fees when you receive your prize. You simply report the prize on your next tax return and pay the taxes then.

<u>Tech Support Scams:</u> You get a phone call or pop up on your computer that says Microsoft has detected a virus on your computer. They convince you to let them remotely access your computer to "fix the problem." From there, they can charge you for fake services or even a monthly maintenance contract. They may even install malware on your computer to detect your passwords for your accounts. Microsoft does not make unsolicited calls to consumers. It's a scam. Do not allow control of your computer to a third party who calls you unsolicited. Don't click on pop up ads that say your computer has a virus. If you need technical support, contact an established electronics or computer retailer.

<u>Imposter Scams:</u> When a con artist poses as someone you trust in order to trick you into paying them money. For example, he may say he is an IRS agent and demand immediate payment. The IRS does not call anyone. It sends them a letter. Do not respond to an imposter, but call the IRS directly at 1-800-829-1040.

Other scams include asking for money by pretending to be utility workers, calling you pretending to be a grandchild in need of money, online dating services asking you for mon-ey, "Pie-in-the-sky" investment schemes or asking you to pay money to be a "mystery shopper."


