

Manager's Message

- I know that like me, your lives have been turned upside down by the **MANAGER** COVID-19 virus. The management team and Board of Directors have had to make difficult decisions about closing and re-opening our facilities and we appreciate the patience and understanding you have shown through this situation. Please know that we all want everything to be open and "business as usual" around here and we are working diligently to resume activities as quickly and safely as possible. We are continuing to monitor the situation and will make adjustments as necessary.
- Over the summer, we have been considering making a change to how we staff the gate house overnight. Specifically, by staffing the gate house with resident employees overnight and moving away from having a security vendor handle that shift. If you are interested in applying to work that shift at the gate, please forward me a copy of your resume for consideration.
- Due to the upcoming election season, the Board has approved a 30-day moratorium on the prohibition on signs on home-sites. Beginning on October 3rd, up to two campaign signs/flags will be permitted on each home-site. All campaign signs/flags must be removed within five days of the general election. Any signs or flags posted before October 3rd will still be considered a violation.
- Rules Reminder All dogs and cats should be on a leash when they are outside. The rules call for leashes to be 6 feet or less in length. Allowing your pet to roam freely or wander between homes is a violation and may result in the animal being trapped and removed from the property. Please also remember to always clean up after your pets.
- We are partnering with Walgreens to hold a Flu Shot Clinic here at Americana Cove. Residents can sign up to receive a flu shot without having to leave the property. Most insurance and Med-icare is accepted. Vaccines for shingles and pneumonia are also available, by request. In order to allow Walgreens to order enough vaccines, you will need to sign up in advance. If you are in-terested in signing up, please contact Brad Coath at 727-308-8013. The exact date is to be de-termined, but should be scheduled in mid to late October.

Helping Hands: Home Safety Tips for Seniors, Part Two.

hen so many seniors are living independently and often alone, it is very important that we practice good home safety. Here are more tips for keeping our homes safe from HealthinAging.org.

Protect against fire and related dangers:

- If you have a fire in your home, do not try to put it out. Leave and call 911.
- Know at least two ways to get out of your home.
- When you are cooking, do not wear loose clothes or clothes with long sleeves.
- Replace appliances that have fraying or damaged electrical cords.
- Don't put too many electric cords into one socket or extension cord.
- Install a smoke detector and replace batteries twice a year.
- Never smoke in bed or leave candles burning, even for a short time, in an empty room.
- Make sure heaters are at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn. Turn off space heaters when you leave the room.

Avoid bathroom hazards:

- 1. Set the thermostat on the water heater no higher than 120 degrees to prevent scalding.
- 2. Have grab bars in the shower and near the toilet to make getting around easier and safer.
- 3. Put rubber mats in the bathtub to prevent slipping.
- 4. If necessary, use a special tub or shower chair or raised toilet seat. Prevent Poisoning:
 - Carbon Monoxide: Never try to heat your home with your stove, oven or grill.
 - Medications: Keep meds in original containers so you won't mix them up.
 - Ask for large-print labels on your medications to make them easier to read.
 - Bring your pill bottles or a list with you to your doctor to make sure you are taking your meds correctly.
 - Never mix bleach, ammonia or other cleaning liquids together when you are cleaning. They can produce deadly gases.

Protect against Abuse:

- Keep your windows, doors and cars locked at all times.
- Never let a stranger into your home when you are alone.
- Always ask for written information about any offers, prizes or charities and wait to respond until your have reviewed the information thoroughly.

Do not let yourself be pressured into making purchases, signing contracts or making donations. It is never rude to wait and discuss the plans with a trusted family member or friend.



Sellers: How To Transfer Utilities Before Closing

hen a resident has sold their home and the day of closing draws near, how does one turn over utilities from the seller to the buyer?

At least one week before the day of closing, the seller and buyer need to contact Duke Energy. The seller needs to ask for a final reading and explain the home is sold and the new buyer will be contacting them to put the electric service in their name. The seller should NOT turn off the electric. Simply ask for a final reading and tell the energy company to NOT turn off the electric.

"The buyer needs the electric on to do a walk through. A closing can be delayed or worse the buyer is so upset they do not close," said Broker Marty Pozgay.

The same scenario should occur when transferring gas with TECO People's Gas. Since the co-op sup-plies water/sewer, sellers do not need to contact a utility direct.

If the electric service is turned off completely, there are more charges that the buyer incurs as well as additional time to have the service turned back on.

"Sellers want to be sure that they are no longer charged for service when they don't live in the home, but they do themselves no favors by completely having the service shut off," says Pozgay.

The same procedure should occur if residents are selling the home themselves.
