





Pan Roasted Potatoes

Everyone who has these loves them.

Melt 1/4 lb butter in a glass baking dish, season butter with garlic powder, salt, pepper, parsley or your favorite seasonings.

Mix together and coat potatoes (peeled) with the mixture. Cover glass baking dish with aluminum foil tightly and put in oven at 350 degrees for an hour or until potatoes are tender. Just before serving turn broiler on and brown the potatoes. Turn once so they all have the same degree of browning.

Summer Salads

When summer heat settles in, cold salads are a popular entrée or side dish. This month, two Bay Ranchers submitted favorites.

Grilled Corn, Avocado and Tomato Salad with Honey Lime Dressing

- 1 pint grape tomatoes
- 1 ripe avocado
- 2 ears of fresh sweet corn
- 2 tbsp fresh cilantro, chopped

Honey Lime Dressing

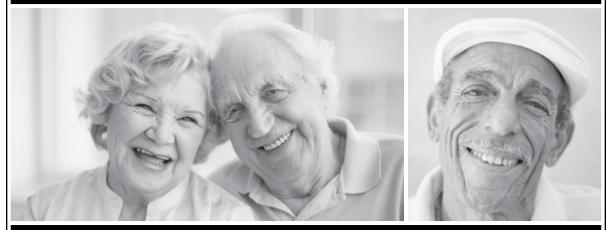
Juice of 1 lime 3 tbsp vegetable oil 1 tbsp honey Sea salt and fresh cracked pepper, to taste 1 clove garlic, minced Dash of cayenne pepper

Remove husks from corn and grill over medium heat for 10 minutes. The corn should have some brown spots and be tender and not mushy. Cut the corn off the cob then scrape the cob with the back of your knife to get the juices. Set aside and let cool. Slice the tomatoes in half. Dice the avocado and chop the cilantro.

Combine the sliced tomatoes, avocado, cilantro and grilled corn and honey lime dressing and mix gently so everything is evenly coated. Be careful not to mash the avocados. Let the salad sit for 10-15 minutes to let flavors mingle.

To make the Honey Lime Dressing, add all the dressing ingredients in a small bowl and whisk to combine. Set aside.

Easy Mini Cupcakes

While attending Bay Ranch Monday morning meetings, you will often hear requests to furnish "finger food" for an upcoming event at the club house. I like to furnish something for these occasions, but as a snowbird, I do not keep a lot of baking ingredients on hand. My favorite donation is a tray of mini cupcakes made from a "doctored" cake mix. One recipe makes many mini cupcakes so I am able to share a nice platter and still have a few left for home. Best of all, any cake mix can be used as long as the baking time is adjusted for the tiny size of the cupcakes. I like to start at 12 minutes and adjust from there. Here are recipes for two of my favorites, with frosting.

LEMON BLOSSOMS

18 1/2 oz yellow or lemon cake mix3 1/2 oz instant lemon pudding mix4 large eggs3/4 cup vegetable oil

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

For the glaze

4 cups powdered sugar1/3 cup freshly squeezed lemon juice1 lemon, zested3 Tbsp vegetable oil3 Tbsp water

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Cream Cheese Frosting

1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened 2 8-oz pkg. cream cheese, softened

8 cups confectioners' sugar (about 2 lbs.)

1 tablespoon milk

Spray miniature muffin tins with vegetable oil cooking spray. Combine the cake mix, pudding mix, eggs and oil and blend well with an electric mixer until smooth, about 2 minutes. Pour a small amount of batter, filling each muffin tin half way. Bake for 12 minutes. Turn out onto a tea towel. One recipe makes about 40 mini cupcakes.

To make the glaze, sift the sugar into a mixing bowl. Add the lemon juice, zest, oil, and 3 tablespoons water. Mix with a spoon until smooth.

With fingers, dip the cupcakes into the glaze while they're still warm, covering as much of the cake as possible, or spoon the glaze over the warm cupcakes, turning them to completely coat. Place on wire racks with waxed paper underneath to catch any drips. Let the glaze set thoroughly, about 1 hour, before storing in containers with tight-fitting lids.

My Notes: I add a tablespoon of freshly grated lemon zest to the cake batter as well to add more flavor and the smell of lemon to the mini cupcakes. The flavor of lemon is in the rind (or zest). Personally I think it makes a huge difference.

In a large bowl, mix together the cake and pudding mixes, sour cream, oil, beaten eggs and water. Stir in the chocolate chips and pour batter into a well-greased 12-cup bundt pan. Bake the cake for 50 to 55 minutes or until top is springy to the touch and a wooden toothpick inserted comes out clean. Cool cake thoroughly in pan at least an hour and a half before inverting onto

To make the frosting, beat butter and cream cheese in a large bowl with electric mixer until light and fluffy. Gradually add confectioners' sugar and milk. Beat on high until smooth (30 - 60

seconds). If icing seems too thin, add confectioners' sugar 1 tablespoon at a time. If it seems too thick, add more milk 1 teaspoon at a time until icing reaches desired consistency. This makes a large amount of frosting. When frosting mini cupcakes I like to use a decorating tip and put a single large flower or star on the top. This is easy to do and the frosting will become firm after it sets.

Writing these stories down is a gift to ourselves because it helps us remember things in our past that are worth remembering. It is a gift to our friends because they get to know us in a way they never could without our stories. It is a gift to our children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren because, well, you know why.

Some call this "life story writing." It's easier than most other writing because we know the subject so well. Life story writing is often done in short vignettes, similar to the reminiscences Russ Trombley shares or Maureen Stapleton's piece about Danny Boy, her Shih Tzu, in last month's BRR.

While looking for a humorous article to share with you this month, I came upon a website, www.memoirsbyme.com. The information was copyrighted by Kathleen Adams from 2001 – 2006. I was unable to find a way to request permission to use it. Adams shares the story of Goggie, who began writing about her life when she was 86.

I was born on March 22, 1904 in Tecumseh, Oklahoma -- Indian Territory. I am the youngest of ten children -- five boys and then five girls. I had two very wise and wonderful parents. When I was 18 months old, my papa and mama each filed a claim on adjoining land farther up near the Panhandle of Oklahoma. We must have been traveling in covered wagons because we had an organ and all good things of Mama's. Mama was taking her side saddle. Later she cut off the leather flaps and half-soled us kids' shoes. She was a very efficient lady.

This was the beginning of Googie's "memoir," begun at the "urging of her granddaughter. Over the next several years, Googie wrote or told dozens of vignettes that described homestead life in the Wild West -- her father's accidental death, carving out a settlement in the midst of Indian country, her toys and playmates, holiday celebrations, the courtship and marriages of her siblings, her own marriage at the age of 17.... When Googie died at 95, her eulogy was crafted around the 'memoirs' that had become a family heirloom. Her granddaughter fashioned the stories into a booklet, and this hand-made treasure will follow 13 great-grandchildren through the next generations."

Googie had help writing her story. "Googie's granddaughter engaged her through cor-

respondence, writing letters that asked a specific question. She included a piece of stationery and a self-addressed, stamped envelope, and most often received her answer within the week." For example:

You asked me how we spent our Sunday afternoons. We went to community Pie Suppers, and we also had Box Suppers. The boxes were decorated with pretty paper and Mama made a handle on it with a big bow. We put lunches, doughnuts, cake or whatever we had -- goodies in the bag and it was auctioned off to the highest bidder to raise money for something. I'll never forget how Jim Rodgers never failed to get my oldest sister's box. He always paid the most. The auctioneers would see to that.

Don't these bits make you smile? When people write life stories, they "begin to see their lives as jewels that have been polished through time and experience and living. They begin to see the beauty and uniqueness that their life has represented." That's certainly how I see the nuggets Russ and Maureen have shared with us.

Tremember while in high school, I took what was called a crip course. This was print shop, taught by a nice little man named Mr. Alfred Meadows. The shop contained a storage room. I recall walking downtown Clearwater and seeing Lana Turner (the It girl of movie fame) coming out of our Woolworths, and Jane Pauley of the Today Show talking to all her fans. Her parents lived in Clearwater. I remember Buddy Dawson, Blackdog Bowers and Howard Dobson fishing in a 14.ft. skiff for sharks off the Clearwater Beach Causeway. I thought they were nuts, especially in a 14 footer with low sides.
