Snowbirds [and Vacationers]: Before you leave:

- 1. Please make sure you have someone doing your wees trees, etc., and keep mobile clean on the outside during the summer.
- 2. Make sure anything that can be pitched around with the wind is put away.
- 3. If you have a change of address, please make sure you notify the office.



All Residents: Rules commonly broken:

- 1. Parking overnight on street and/or every day.
- 2. If you have someone living with you, make sure you have registered in the office.
- 3. Do not pile garbage in fron of garbage bins. When you throw garbage, throw it to the back so when you open the door, it doesn't fall out and there is space.
- 4. Check mobile for cleaning, trim, awnings, driveway and/or painting. We will have someone out soon checking your mobile.

Still relevant announcements Cliff made this year at Koffee Klatch:

- 1. Keep the dumpster area neat, especially on the weekends. If the dumpster is full, please put extras neatly beside it.
- 2. Parking on the grass or sidewalk is against the rules. If necessary, park on the road.
- 3. Cars parked on the street after midnight will be towed. [Eds. Note: you have to pay the fine even if you run out before the tow truck takes your car away. We have nice neighbors who remind us when we are parked on the street at night.]
- 4. The Office must authorize overnight parking at the Clubhouse.

We bought an Amazon Echo and now talk to Alexa when we need help. I asked her for a joke for the column. Here it comes...What did the scarf say to the hat? I'll hang around here while you go on ahead. Hmm, you thought my jokes were bad!

I'm very late with this column and out of working brain cells. So here's one man's review of retired life. When we retired to a mobile home park in Florida, our biggest concern was time management. What were we going to do all day? Let me assure you, passing the time is not a problem. Our days are eaten up by simple, daily activities. Just getting out of our car takes 15 minutes. Trying to find where we parked takes 20 minutes. It takes a half-hour in the check-out line in Walmart, and 1 hour to return the item the next day.

Let me take you through a typical day: We get up at 5:00 am, have a quick breakfast and join the early morning Walk and Fart Club. There are about 30 of us, and rain or shine, we walk around the streets, all talking at once. Every development has some late risers who stay in bed until 6:00am.

After a nimble walk, avoiding irate drivers out to make us road kill, we go back home, shower and change for the next activity. My wife goes directly to the pool for her underwater pilates class, followed by gasping for breath and CPR. I put on my "Ask me about my grandchildren" t-shirt, my plaid mid-calf shorts, my black socks and sandals and go to the clubhouse lobby for a nice nap.

Before we know it, it's time for lunch. We go to Costco to partake of the many tasty samples dispensed by ladies in white hair nets. All free! After a filling lunch, if we don't have any doctor appointments, we might go to the flea market to see if any new white belts have come in or to buy a Rolex watch for \$2.00.

We're usually back home by 2:00 pm to get ready for dinner. People start lining up for the early bird about 3:00 pm, but we get there by 3:45 because we're late eaters. The dinners are very popular because of the large portions they serve. We can take home enough food for the next day's lunch and dinner, including extra bread, crackers, packets of mustard, relish, ketchup and Splenda, along with mints.



At 5:30 pm we're home, ready to watch the 6 o'clock news. By 6:30 pm we're fast asleep. Then we get up and make five or six trips to the bathroom during the night and it's time to get up and start a new day all over again.

Doctor-related activities eat up most of our retirement time. I enjoy reading old magazines in sub-zero temperatures in the waiting room, so I don't mind. Calling for test results also helps the days fly by. It takes at least a half hour just getting through the doctor's phone menu. Then there's the hold time until we're connected to the right party. Sometimes they forget we're holding, and the whole office goes off to lunch.

Should we find we still have time on our hands, volunteering provides a rewarding opportunity to help the less fortunate. Florida has the largest concentration of seniors under five feet and they need our help. I myself am a volunteer for The Vertically Challenged Over 80. I coach their basketball team, The Arthritic Avengers. The hoop is only 4-1/2 feet from the floor. You should see the look of confidence on their faces when they make a slam dunk.

Food shopping is a problem for short seniors, or "bottom feeders," as we call them, since they can't reach the food on the upper shelves. There are many foods they've never tasted. After shopping, most seniors can't remember where they parked their cars and wander the parking lot for hours while their food defrosts. I'm tall enough to locate vehicles and save the food before it thaws.

I can identify with this fellow...except he's a health nut, getting up at 6:00 am to walk?!? Just sayin'.

I do miss all my northern friends that have left for the summer but it also gives me something to look forward to in the fall. Please come back healthy and safe my friends.



Hopefully I remember to fill these out with all the places we have been.

First off is Glory Days Grill at 9900 4th St N. Around 4th St and Gandy area.

This is a traditional American sports tavern type place. Lots of TV's, great atmosphere, super selection of both food and adult beverages. The food is on par with the last review of Miller's

We tried the Santa Fe Egg Rolls for an starter. Chicken, pepper jack cheese black beans, and stuff in a tasty flour roll with an avocado ranch dipping sauce. Can make this a meal by itself, flavorful to the extreme.

Ale House. Fresh and tasty combinations with a lot of food on your plate.

For dinner it was Fish Fry. It may be an English dish, but sometimes us Yanks do a great job of reproducing this dish. Beer batter made with Sella Artois beer. Big piece of Haddock fried to perfection. Very happy kind of dish.

Strawberry Salmon Salad was our other dish. Flavor-filled grilled Salmon on Spring mix with Feta cheese, candied pecans and balsamic vinaigrette. Really liked this place. With all the TV's, each table has a speaker box so you can use to listen to any TV in the place. Friendly staff and they do military discount.

Next up is a Mexican joint in Dunedin, Casa Tina, 365 Main St. This is a real slice of real Mexican food right here. If you are looking just for a Margarita bar, the amount of Tequila here and selection makes me, a Whiskey drinker, jealous. Did not know that many Tequila types were out there.

If you don't drink, don't worry--the food matches the drink selection just as well. The menu, in Spanish, does include English. Everything is here available with multiple protein choices. And yes, it includes beef tongue, eewww! (tasty). The beef is shredded, chicken well-seasoned and roasted, shrimp and fish as well.

We both tried the lunch special of Flutes. Regular tortillas stuffed, rolled and fried. Filled with beef, chicken or cheese. Lite and crispy with fresh salsa, guacamole and sour cream. Yellow rice and black or red re-fried beans. Even a lunch portion was a lot and we took half home.

She got chicken and I got beef. Real, real goooood. Look forward to coming back for dinner to try some of the other items. Also want to try the house-made sangria. If it is anything like the food, it will be outstanding. Only downside is downtown Dunedin parking. May have to walk a bit if you come during rush hours.

One of our favorite easy entrees is frozen stuffed chicken breast. We really like them, and I plan to serve them at least once a week while we are "up North." My son David apparently likes them, too, because when he was in charge of food for his Masonic Temple, he served them for an important get-together (what do I know? It's a secret society) to rave reviews.

They are raw chicken with a crispy breading and stuffed with one of several fillings. They must be baked in a conventional oven at 375 - 400 degrees F. for 35 - 40 minutes.

We've been able to buy Chicken Cordon Bleu, Chicken Kiev, and Chicken with Broccoli, but the company also carries Buffalo Style Chicken, Chicken and Country Gravy, Chicken with Homestyle Stuffing, and Chicken Philly, as well as "minis" of these. The online price is \$3.99 per 10 oz. package of 2.






