NOTES FROM THE BAY RANCH OFFICE

 **COMPLAINTS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR MUST BE IN WRITING AND SIGNED.** Give the written complaint to the office or drop it in the mail slot in the office door. Verbal and unsigned complaints cannot be addressed.

MANAGEMENT WILL ALSO ADDRESS COMPLAINTS ONLY IN WRITING.

 **Rules:** The Park has rules that everyone received and reviewed when they bought or rented their coach. They are also printed annually in the Directory (September issue of Bay Ranch Review). Please read and follow them. Failure to follow rules is grounds for eviction, and management has shown that it is willing to evict.

Rules commonly broken:

-  1. Parking on grass or sidewalk, overnight on street, and/or every day.
2. Parking overnight at the Clubhouse without Office authorization.
3. Failing to register at the office all persons living living with you.
4. Piling garbage in front of garbage bins. When you throw garbage, throw it to the back so when you open the door, it doesn't fall out and there is space.

5. Failure to maintain, paint and/or clean mobile home, trim, awnings, planter and driveway.

Sewage remains an intractable problem. Drains continue to back up because grease, vinyl/rubber gloves, paper towels and other inappropriate items are flushed. Bay Ranch will not pay to unclog sewers when the clog is caused by inappropriate items put down the sewer. The tenant will have to pay for this problem.

 Eds. Note: It is inappropriate to flush anything other than toilet paper, and doing so causes costly sewer clogs. If the park pays, *we all will ultimately*, through rent increases.

Also, those so-called flushable personal cleansing cloths are really **NOT FLUSHABLE**. They do not disintegrate in the sewer system, and they WILL clog the sewer someplace in the system. Lots of people like to use these cloths in the bathroom, but PLEASE do not put them in the toilet. Limit what goes into the toilet to toilet paper. Eds. Note: My housemates and I had to hire a plumber when our own drain system clogged due to dishwasher detergent that was not well dissolved. We had virtual rocks of detergent blocking the drain. Our solution (after paying the plumber): liquid detergent.

Those metal electric service boxes behind each mobile home belong to Duke Energy.

Please do not service or pay to service them yourself.

Call Duke Energy or Carol Alvey (see her cell phone number at the front of the Review) if your electric needs service. Why? Well, in a couple of instances, residents have submitted bills for about \$4,500 for service. If the repair is the park's responsibility, we have an electrician who will do the work for \$1,500. It just makes economic sense.

From the box to the mobile home is the resident's responsibility. Please make your own arrangements with an electrician if that area needs repair. The office can tell you if the repair is your responsibility.

Homeless people are moving into the park. In one instance, an empty coach was left unlocked and homeless people had moved in. In several instances, people have been sleeping in the driveways/patios of empty homes. And others have been sleeping on the shuffleboard courts, sometimes using cushions from outside the clubhouse for mattresses.

Please watch out for your neighbor and neighborhood. If you see someone entering a home you know to be empty, or someone sitting or sleeping in that home's driveway/patio, or any other inappropriate behavior of this type, please call the Largo police. It is ok in this case to use 911 because you don't know what the danger is.

Cars left parked on the street after midnight will be towed. This is expensive and inconvenient. This is another opportunity to be a good neighbor: by reminding someone whose car is in the street after 10 pm. \

Cars parked on the street during the day should be staggered so emergency vehicles can pass by. Do not park on the grass or sidewalk.

You must register at the office if you have something parked in the field north of the clubhouse, or see Brent (maintenance).



* Please, put ALL garbage in the dumpsters, even big and heavy items like furniture.

* DO NOT dump behind, beside or anywhere near the trash bins. Put the garbage in the bins.

*Put household trash in the smaller trash bins.

* Do not bring garbage to the bins on Monday morning. By that time, the bins are overflowing. Wait until Monday afternoon or later, when the bins are empty.

* Pick up for furniture, tree brush/limbs and other debris will be on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday only. Put out trash after 5:00 p.m, the day before.

***DO NOT DISPOSE OF TVS OR ELECTRONICS IN THE PARK. DO NOT PUT THEM IN OR BESIDE THE DUMPSTER.** We get fined. Call pinellascounty.org/recycle to dispose of them.

*If you need help disposing of something, someone in the park may help you for a fee

Larger families and visitors: Reminder: that rent is based on one or two per household. Each person above the two must pay an additional \$30 a month, including visitors who stay over 30 days. Please be proactive about this and pay the money without first being reminded.

The following information remains in force:

Fires: Test your smoke detectors to make sure they work. Recommended action: purchase a fire extinguisher if you don't have one and know how to work it. If a fire starts, spray it with the fire extinguisher immediately and GET OUT OF THE HOUSE. Fire destroys mobile homes very quickly..





Management requests that you turn off your water heater when the water is off, to prevent the element from burning out. Eds. Note: According to diy.stackexchange.com/questions/3766, this needs to be done because the element will burn out if the water heater becomes empty. Tankless heaters don't need this.



Other announcements:

The stoves in the kitchen both work.

The purified water dispenser at the clubhouse operates on its own schedule. After someone has filled containers, it may take the dispenser some time to regenerate enough water for more containers. There is a light on the dispenser that tells whether it is ready.

Some have questioned why the application fee is “so high.” One reason is to help cover garbage fees, since new owners usually throw away most of the furniture and electronics.

Mr. Larson (the owner) calls the lawn service for lawn care on an as-needed basis. The park pays for lawn mowing, etc., once a month but the need sometimes goes unnoticed. If you notice the lawn needs trimming, please let the office know so they can call Mr. Larson.

Sometimes an automobile will leak oil onto our new, nice looking pavement, creating an eyesore. If you notice a leak by your house, call the office to have it cleaned up. Let's keep these streets looking nice!

Lost and Found Dog/Cat: If you have found a dog or cat, you can post on a site called pawboost.com or call Animal Service on Walsingham. If you call, Animal Services will come out, free of charge, to pick up an animal.







Once an Angel, Always an Angel: A Loving Farewell to Betty Ann Quish

Betty Ann Quish left us without saying goodbye. The suddenness of her departure continues to be a shock. She was such a constant here at Bay Ranch, always at the Monday Morning Meeting, then the Friendly Shuffle Practice, and Mugs for karaoke. And that's just Monday.

Let's start with the eulogy her family posted on the Fallon Funeral Home site (https://www.fallonfuneralhome.com/obituaries/Elizabeth-Betty-Ann-Quish?obId=12926990&fbclid=IwAR060ywb_12OCy5Uhe9udPdbUFqnWVbsvZbmf2lzxws5SXskocYe5YCK-40): Elizabeth A. (Betty Ann) Quish, (nee Fallon), 84, of Avon-by-the-Sea, NJ and Largo, FL died peacefully on Sunday, May 3, 2020. Betty Ann was born in Jersey City, lived there most of her life, Avon-by-the-Sea for many years and wintered in Largo, FL. She was a music teacher, served on the Parish Council and a Eucharistic Minister at St. Paul of the Cross in Jersey City for many years. MANDATORY 14-DAY QUARANTINE

Now I know how prisoners feel when they are incarcerated for a period time, even for a short time.

No, I wasn't sentenced to serve time behind bars for committing a crime. But for Louise Parker and me, a mandatory 14-day quarantine upon returning to Canada from the United States was in a sense very similar to a jail term.

Normally, we spend close to six months at Bay Ranch every winter, then head home around mid-April. However, when the coronavirus hit North America in mid-March like an invisible tsunami, the Canadian Government issued warnings to Canadian citizens sunning or just relaxing in the warm south that they should head home and pronto while the borders were still open, we decided to cut short our stay this year by three weeks. So we packed up and headed for home on March 24th.

The drive was not only different from previous years, but it was an adventure and truly an experience I won't forget. Since I do all the driving (Louise doesn't drive anymore), we take three days with two overnight stays in hotels. All three days traffic was unusually light compared to previous years, as trucks outnumbered cars by at least a 7-to-1 most of the time. The Howard Franklin Bridge and Interstate 275 through Tampa to 75 were a breeze. Too bad it's not like that on a regular basis. In fact, I never once had to brake, as it was relatively light up to Ocala where we cut across the state to hook up with 95.

Other than gas stations and drive-thru restaurants, there wasn't much open in the eight states

we covered in our three days enroute to Canada. Fortunately, most rest areas were open along the way, but in talking to a couple of friends who left their southern spots a few days later, a number of those rest areas were closed by the time they drove by them.

At our two overnight stops in Walterboro, SC and Sutton, WV, the dining areas at both facilities were closed, along with all restaurants, due to the Covid-19 pandemic. So it was either the drive thru at McDonald's or find a takeout with a better menu.

The homestretch drive on day three, around Pittsburgh through to Buffalo, was no different than the previous two as the volume of traffic was extremely light. When we got to Canadian customs at the Peace Bridge in Fort Erie, only three inspection stations were open but there were no lineups. We drove straight to one and were greeted by a friendly female customs officer wearing a face mask. We presented her with our passports, and she asked some routine questions plus asked about our health conditions.

Then the officer handed us some literature stating that the Canadian Government has implemented an order requiring all persons entering Canada to self-isolate for 14 days to limit the introduction and spread of Covid-19. The sheet of paper went on to say: "Failure to comply with this Order and other related measures are offences under the Quarantine Act. The maximum penalties are a fine up to \$1,000,000 and/or imprisonment for three years."

She then asked if we understood the order and if we had any questions. When I told her we were aware of the order and had made advance plans to isolate at Louise's apartment along with her sister Diane, she asked me to make the following declaration: "I/we acknowledge that I/we must self-isolate for the next 14 days to prevent the potential spread of Covid-19," and we were off to Welland the final stop.

Normally when we return from Florida, I drop off Louise and her belongings at her apartment, then head to Port Colborne and my residence on Lake Erie. However, had I done that my son Jason, who lives with me, would have to self-isolate, too, and couldn't go to work.

So it was better to stay Louise's along with her sister, who didn't have a work commitment. I figured during the 14 days I would be able to roam around outside now and then, as long as I observed social distancing and didn't come in contact with anyone. Not so, as we found out. On the very first day, Diane left the third floor apartment to visit some friends on the ground floor. Shortly after returning, a note was slipped under the door that all three of us were quarantined and could not leave the apartment under any circumstances or we would be reported to the health authorities.

That meant no walks in the hallways of the five-story, 75 unit building or going for a stroll outside. It meant we were confined, period, and our freedom date wasn't until Good Friday, April 10th.

I asked myself how could I do it, how could I survive? There was television, but all network channels in the U.S. and Canada were inundated with coverage on the virus. And there was no sports---NHL, NBA, Baseball or Golf. All the sports channels were showing reruns of games or tournaments. Furthermore, to make matters worse, I had no internet connection as Louise has no need since she doesn't have a computer. I was totally lost.

Fortunately, I/we survived and the 14 days flew by. There were times when I didn't have anything to do as I don 't play cards or any games. Furthermore, other than sports, I don't have any indoor hobbies. I was lucky I didn't have to cook, as I was waited on very graciously. Then, we ordered take out. a few days. And by all means I didn't run dry. I had picked up a couple cases of Yuengling before I had left Florida as I figured Duty Free at the border would be closed. And my son twice dropped off some supplies at the door that included a couple cases of good old Canadian beer. I was in business. I could do it.

Finally, it was April 10th, and showing no signs of the virus or any ill effects, I was free to go and Louise and her sister could vacate their apartment. We had served our time, all 14 days.

When I arrived at home, the first thing I did was go down to the lake, looked across the water and took a deep breath. It was so good just to be home.

Looking back it was an experience Louise, Diane and I will never forget. I also came to realize that this virus is still around and things will never be the same. But if we follow the guidelines set out, we will survive.

Linda's Craft Corner: How to make a terracotta pot lighthouse

A terracotta pot lighthouse is simple and crafters can use their creativity to make it very individualized.

The first step is getting the pots. At the store, I stacked up different sized pots upside down until I found a nice shape.

Back at home, I painted all the pots and saucers white.

When dry, I taped off my stripe pattern and painted the red. Lighthouses come in an assortment of colors, though red, white and black are the most common. Check online for inspiration.

Then I used a silicone adhesive to glue my pots together so the lighthouse would be easier to move, but this step is optional.

Once the pots are painted, add decorations; rocks, shells, driftwood, etc. I added steps using craft sticks.

Take the spike off the solar light and glue it to the top.

That's it. Enjoy

What I used:

8.25" pot for the bottom. (I measured across the open top).

6.5"

5.25" short pot

4.5" pot

12" saucer for the base

4.5" saucer for the top

acrylic / craft paint

a solar light I used a dollar store yard light

painter's tape

silicone glue or gorilla glue


