#### **Tornado Preparedness**

It is important to have a plan for all types of emergency situations. This article will focus on tornado preparedness. Unlike hurricanes or floods, an approaching tornado allows you only a brief amount of time to make life-or-death decisions. Advance planning and quick response are the keys to surviving a tornado.

Mobile homes offer poor resistance to tornado winds; hurricane straps or other tie-downs will not protect a mobile home from the wind gusts associated with tornadoes. You should plan on leaving your mobile home to seek shelter elsewhere. The Bay Ranch Clubhouse could offer safe haven.

Q. When should you leave your home due to a possible tornado?

A. When a tornado warning is issued for your area by the National Weather Service.

**A Tornado Warning** indicates that a tornado has been sighted in your area, or is indicated on weather radar. You should proceed to safe shelter immediately.

A Tornado Watch is issued by the National Weather Service when torna-does are possible in your area. You should remain alert for approaching storms and carefully monitor radio or television reports for further developments.

- Q. How will I know Bay Ranch is in a tornado warning area?
- A. There are several ways to get notified of a possible tornado.
- 1. Use a cell phone enabled for Wireless Emergency Alerts (see article below).
- 2. Sign up for Alert Pinellas, an emergency notification service. It is FREE to Pinellas County residents and will give the county multiple ways to get the word to you whenever an urgent situation arises. All you have to do is reg-ister your contact information with **Alert Pinellas** and an automated mes-sage will be sent to alert you to local emergencies. <u>http://www.pinellascounty.org/alertpinellas/default.htm</u>
- 3. The Weather Channel. Notification can be sent to your cell phone or desk-top
- Free mobile and e-mail alerts (message and data rates from your mobile phone company may apply) at <u>https//registration.weather.com/ursa/alerts/step1</u> and <u>http://www.weather.com/mobile</u>
- Free desktop alerts at <u>http://www.weather.com/services/desktop.html</u> and <u>http://www.</u> weather.com/services/twcalerts.html
- 4. Sign up with local tv stations
- 5. Purchase a NOAA Weather Alert radio with an alert feature.

#### Wireless Emergency Alerts Surprise Florida Residents

*Ed. Note: this is an excerpt of an article* by Kevin Spear, McClatchy News | April 2, 2014 As dark clouds and lightning bore down on Central Florida in April 2014, countless cellphones in the region vibrated and sounded off with a dire message: "Tornado Warning in this area. ... Take shelter now."

Many cell owners were surprised and wondering how the alert showed up on their phones. Phones from Sanford to Walt Disney World sounded off as part of the federal government's Wireless Emergency Alerts system set up in 2012 for Amber Alerts and warnings about terror threats, chemical spills, tsunamis and potentially deadly weather.

It's meant to be used sparingly, said Chuck Hagen, logistics chief with the Florida Division of Emergency Management. "We don't want to be lighting phones up every 10 minutes."

The alerts are not text messages or emails. They have their own format, cannot be replied to and arrive with their own tone and vibration pattern. There's no charge for them.

The voluntary program has been ramping up gradually among carriers and cellphone makers. And phones that weren't initially programmed to receive WEA information are getting updates to receive the alerts.

AT&T is able [at the time the article was originally published] to send WEA messages to 33 models of phones. The company says on its website that it is working to bring more phones into the system: "Please check back regularly to see if your smartphone has been added." Other carriers, including Sprint, T-Mobile and Verizon, provide similar information on their websites.

The WEA system also doesn't care what a phone's area code is; alerts are sent from cell towers in areas in harm's way to all phones capable of hearing them. That's why out-of-state tourists at Central Florida theme parks got the messages last year. If somebody driving along a highway enters a danger zone after a warning was initially sent out, the driver will still get pinged with a WEA message waiting in a queue.







Your slow cooker or crockpot can often help have meals ready even when you have been gone for most of the day. Using the barbecue rub found below on chicken or pork makes a very quick and easy start to a great meal. The recipe makes enough to use on several meals. It can be used on meat in the oven, on the grill, cooked on the stovetop.

#### Barbecue Rub

LET'S EAT by Ione Jones

- 4 Tablespoons paprika
- 4 Tablespoons brown sugar
- 2 Tablespoons chile powder

- 1 Tablespoons ground black pepper
- 2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 2 teaspoons onion powder
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme

Combine all ingredients and store in an airtight container. Makes about 1 cup.

St Patrick's Day is coming soon and Irish Stew is a favorite of many. Here is a recipe found in **Taste of Home** for this all-time favorite. It makes multiple servings and great leftovers.

## Irish Beef Stew Recipe

- 8 bacon strips, diced
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 3 pounds beef stew meat, cut into 1" cubes
- 1 pound whole fresh mushrooms, quartered
- 3 medium leeks (white portion only), chopped
- 2 medium carrots, chopped
- 1/4 cup chopped celery
- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 4 garlic cloves, minced

- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 4 cups reduced-sodium beef broth
- 1 cup dark stout beer or additional reducedsodium beef broth
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon dried parsley flakes
- 1 teaspoon dried rosemary, crushed
- 2 pounds Yukon Gold potatoes, cut into 1-inch cubes
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 2 tablespoons cold water
- 1 cup frozen peas

#### Directions

- 1. In a stockpot, cook bacon over medium heat until crisp. Using a slotted spoon, remove to paper towels. In a large resealable plastic bag, combine flour, salt and pepper. Add beef, a few pieces at a time, and shake to coat. Brown beef in the bacon drippings. Remove and set aside.
- 2. In the same pan, saute the mushrooms, leeks, carrots and celery in oil until tender. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Stir in tomato paste until blended. Add the broth, beer, bay leaves, thyme, parsley and rosemary. Return beef and bacon to pan. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 2 hours or until beef is tender.
- 3.Add potatoes. Return to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 1 hour longer or until potatoes are tender. Combine cornstarch and water until smooth; stir into stew. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Add peas; heat through. Discard bay leaves. Yield: 15 servings (3-3/4 quarts)





# Going the store? Why leave the house?

Shopping online has exploded in recent years. One example: A survey conducted by 72 Point Inc. and commissioned by Door to Door Organics, an online organic grocer, found that shoppers increased their online grocery purchases by an average of 29 percent in the past year, and those shoppers do about 19 percent of their weekly grocery shopping via the Internet.

# Extra sleep may not lead to longer life

ost of us look forward to sleeping late on the weekend. After a hard week of work, we deserve a few extra hours, right? But a study from the Journal of Clinical Endocrinology & Metabolism suggests that sleeping in may contribute to a higher risk of diabetes and heart disease.



Researchers tracked more than men and women age 30-54, using devices that recorded their movement to determine when they fell asleep and woke up for a one-week period. Close to 85 percent went to bed later and got up later on their days off from work, and those people tended to experience lower levels of HDL cholesterol (the good kind) along with higher triglycerides, greater resistance to insulin, and a higher body mass index, even after controlling for factors like physical activity, calorie consumption, and alcohol use.

The implications are clear: Maintaining a consistent sleep schedule, even on weekends, is better for everyone's long-term health.

# Aspirin prevents skin cancer?

spirin is known to cure our aches and pains and improve heart health. It may also be useful in preventing certain kinds of skin cancer, according to an article on the Discover magazine website.

Non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) like aspirin and ibuprofen are already known to help prevent cancers in the colon, lungs, prostate, and breasts. A meta-

analysis of studies, some previously unavailable to researchers, turned up evidence that non-aspirin NSAIDs can reduce the risk of developing squamous cell carcinoma by 15 percent, and that when aspirin is added to the mix, the risk drops to 18 percent. NSAIDs are known to inhibit COX-2, an enzyme produced by skin cells in response to ultraviolet light.

Talk to your dermatologist about aspirin, and otherwise limit your exposure to UV light to stay safe from skin cancer all year round.
