#### **JUST SAY'IN**

#### NOTES FROM THE BAY RANCH OFFICE



The Office has become aware that Pinellas County and the City of Largo are conducting surprise inspections of mobile home parks. No one knows when Bay Ranch will be inspected, but managers believe it will happen sooner or later.

The inspectors will look for healthy and safety and code violations. Owners have been cited for are having refrigerators and on their driveways. It is also not ok to drop garbage bags on the driveway (or anywhere outside the coach) until you can take it to the receptacles. It isn't known what else might cited as violations. Residents should look around their coaches and see what might be slip, trip and fall hazards or health hazards or whatever.

IN MOST CASES, FINES WILL BE LEVIED AGAINST THE COACH OWNER. In some cases, the park may also be fined.





Complaints against your neighbor must be in writing and signed. Give the written compaint to the office or drop it in the mail slot in the office door. Verbal and unsigned complaints cannot be addressed.



Rules: The Park has rules that everyone received and reviewed when they bought or rented their coach. They are also printed annually in the Directory (September issue of Bay Ranch Review). **Please read and follow them**. Failure to follow rules is grounds for eviction, and management has shown that it is willing to evict.



#### Rules commonly broken:

- 1. Parking on grass or sidewalk, overnight on street, and/or every day.
- 2. Parking overnight at the Clubhouse without Office authorization.
- 3. Failing to register at the office all persons living living with you.
- 4. Piling garbage in front of garbage bins. When you throw garbage, throw it to the back so when you open the door, it doesn't fall out and there is space.
- 5. Failure to maintain, paint and/or clean mobile home, trim, awnings, planter and driveway.



Sewage remains an intractable problem. Drains continue to back up because grease, vinyl/rubber gloves, paper towels and other inappopriate items are flushed. Bay Ranch will not pay to unclog sewers when the clog is caused by inappropriate items put down the sewer. The tenant will have to pay for this problem.

Eds. Note: It is inappropriate to flush anything other than toilet paper, and doing so causes costly sewer clogs. If the park pays, we all will ultimately, through rent increases.

Also, those so-called flushable personal cleansing cloths are really **NOT FLUSHABLE.** They do not disintegrate in the sewer system, and they WILL clog the sewer someplace in the system. Lots of people like to use these cloths in the bathroom, but PLEASE do not put them in the toilet. Limit what goes into the toilet to toilet paper. Eds. Note: My housemates and I had to hire a plumber when our own drain system clogged due to dishwasher detergent that was not well dissolved. We had virtual rocks of detergent blocking the drain. Our solution (after paying the plumber): liquid detergent.

Those metal electric service boxes behind each mobile home belong to Duke Energy. Please do not service or pay to service them yourself.



Call Duke Energy or Carol Alvey (see her cell phone number at the front of the Review) if your electric needs service. Why? Well, in a couple of instances, residents have submitted bills for about \$4,500 for service. If the repair is the park's responsibility, we have an electrician who will do the work for \$1,500. It just makes economic sense.

From the box to the mobile home is the resident's responsibility. Please make your own arrangements with an electrician if that area needs repair. The office can tell you if the repair is your responsibility.

Homeless people are moving into the park. In one instance, an empty coach was left



unlocked and homeless people had moved in. In several instances, people have been sleeping in the driveways/patios of empty homes. And others have been sleeping on the shuffleboard courts, sometimes using cushions from outside the clubhouse for mattresses.

Please watch out for your neighbor and neighborhood. If you see someone entering a home you know to be empty, or someone sitting or sleeping in that home's driveway/patio, or any other inappropriate behavior of this type, please call the Largo police. It is ok in this case to use 911 because you don't know what the danger is.

Cars left parked on the street after midnight will be towed. This is expensive and inconvenient. This is another opportunity to be a good neighbor:by reminding someone whose car is in the street after 10 pm.

Cars parked on the street during the day should be staggered so emergency vehicles can pass by. Do not park on the grass or sidewalk.

You must register at the office if you have something parked in the field north of the clubnouse, or see Brent (maintenance).

- Please, put ALL garbage in the dumpsters, even big and heavy items like furniture.
- •DO NOT dump behind, beside or anywhere near the trash bins. Put the garbage in the trash after 5:00 p.m, the day before.
  - DO NOT DISPOSE OF TVS OR ELECTRONICS IN THE PARK. DO NOT PUT THEM IN OR BESIDE THE DUMPSTER. We get fined. Call pinellascounty.org/recycle to dispose of them.
  - If you need help disposing of something, someone in the park may help you for a fee

Larger families and visitors: Reminder: that rent is based on one or two per household. Each person above the two must pay an additional \$30 a month, including visitors who stay over 30 days. Please be proactive about this and pay the money without first being reminded.

The following information remains in force:





**Fires:** Test your smoke detectors to make sure they work. Recommended action: purchase a fire extinguisher if you don't have one and know how to work it. If a fire starts, spray it with the fire extinguisher immediately and GET OUT OF THE HOUSE. Fire destroys mobile homes very quickly..



Management requests that you turn off your water heater when the water is off, to prevent the element from burning out. Eds. Note: According to diy. stackexchange.com/questions/3766, this needs to be done because the element will burn out if the water heater becomes empty. Tankless heaters don't need this.

#### Other announcements:

The stoves in the kitchen both work.

The purified water dispenser at the clubhouse operates on its own schedule. After someone has filled containers, it may take the dispenser some time to regenerate enough water for more containers. There is a light on the dispenser that tells whether it is ready.

Some have questioned why the application fee is "so high." One reason is to help cover garbage fees, since new owners usually throw away most of the furniture and electronics.

Mr. Larson (the owner) calls the lawn service for lawn care on an as-needed basis. The park pays for lawn mowing, etc., once a month but the need sometimes goes unnoticed. If you notice the lawn needs trimming, please let the office know so they can call Mr. Larson.

Sometimes an automobile will leak oil onto our new, nice looking pavement, creating an eyesore. If you notice a leak by your house, call the office to have it cleaned up. Let's keep these streets looking nice!

Lost and Found Dog/Cat: If you have found a dog or cat, you can post on a site called pawboost.com or call Animal Service on Walsingham. If you call, Animal Services will come out, free of charge, to pick up an animal.






#### **BOB'S CORNER**







#### **BAY RANCH PROFILE: Adam Pirhofer**

If you're a football fan and live in the city which has an NFL franchise chances are you root for that team. Adam Pirhofer did one better.

Raised in Chicago he played football during his high school days and was a Chicago Bears fan. What most residents of Bay Ranch don't know is that Pirhofer had a tryout with the Bears. That was back in 1984 and he was 23 years old at the time.

Normally, when you are a walk-on at an NFL tryout camp, you spend one day, then are sent on your way. It's very rare that walk-ons last much longer or, for that matter, make the team as most teams have returning veterans and draft picks from colleges to fill any gaps in the lineup. But Pirhofer went beyond the first day. In fact, he lasted three days before being cut.

It was quite an excellent experience for Pirhofer, and he met such Bears' stars as William "The Refrigerator" Perry, Richard Dent, Mike Singletary, Dan Hampton and coach Mike Ditka, to list a few. During one of his tryout days, Ditka brought along the legendary Walter Payton. "What a wonderful man, besides being a football player," said Pirhofer referring to the NFL great.

Pirhofer would meet Ditka again but under different circumstances a few years later. Pirhofer's brother Alan, an executive chef, and his employer teamed up with Ditka to name a restaurant "Iron Mike's". At Alan's wedding rehearsal party a couple years later Ditka showed up at "Iron Mike's" to congratulate Alan and his bride to be. Adam was naturally at the party too. "I remember going up to him (Ditka) and saying do you remember me? And he said 'No'.

"I think about all these years later he (Ditka) knows my brother better than he knows me simply because my brother fed him and put money in his pocket."

Besides pro football, Pirhofer also had thoughts about turning to professional wrestling.





He and his high school buddy were both, as he put it, "huge" in size and together made a perfect tag team. Furthermore his buddy's brother, who was 15 years older than both of them, had connections, having gone to college with wrestling great Rick Blair.

"My friend and I looked like twins, as we were both huge. The only difference was I wore glasses. We considered it, but at the time I was a nuclear engineer for Commonwealth Management. We were the first power plant to go on line since the Three Mile Island disaster.

"It was exciting being there as a nuclear reactor operator. I was the controller. There were two units and I was in charge of one of them."

He started at \$60,000 a year at the power plant. Prior to that, he had served in the navy. So when he weighed his good paying job against going the

wrestling route, he decided to stay with the nuclear position. "The wrestling was a total shot in the dark. I would give up my job and travel around the country 50 weeks of the year against staying at home and working."

By 1988, his dad approached him about starting up a business together. "We did and it went very well. Then my dad's health turned. I couldn't find a partner to take his place, so we sold the business. I liked working for my dad and also being my own boss."

He tried being a car salesman but it didn't pan out. "Being a car salesman is hard work. If you're going to be a car salesman I recommend being a used car salesman as you make more money, the profit margin is higher."

Pirhofer also had a couple other jobs: working as a freelance photographer and as manager of an ABC Liquor Store when they included bars. "While working there I managed to drop a keg of beer. I tried to catch it with one arm and injured my biceps in the process. That took me out of commission for three months.

"My dad's health started to turn and I became a full-time care-giver for him. In 2000 he passed away. After two and half years of taking care of my father, I had a nervous breakdown. He was 65 when he died and I was with him. Some of the things that were wrong with him were a potential to my brother and I. We both had to get checked out."

Pirhofer went back to school for a while, then dated a girl. Unfortunately this girl was diagnosed with cancer and once again Adam was back to taking care of her. "After that I basically said I'm retiring."

He became a volunteer at the VA and he's still doing it today. But Pirhofer became more involved at VA. Despite not being involved in any wartime situations or anything like that, he

### **RECIPE**

ur family enjoys wings. They can be pretty expensive, especially if you order them from Wing House, so Ione Jones decided to see if she could conjure up a recipe we like. Easier said than done, since Jim doesn't want them too spicy and I prefer them "naked." She served these drumsticks to Jerry and Carol, who like them a lot, and then again during the Super Bowl. For some reason, the meat on the drumsticks was almost as light as wing meat, and these were a hit. Let us know what you think.

### **Honey Garlic Naked Chicken Legs**

#### **Ingredients**

12 chicken drumsticks (or use wings)

2 T baking powder (do not use baking soda!!!)

1/2 cup honey

4 tablespoons soy sauce

4 large garlic cloves crushed (I used a combination of fresh garlic and garlic powder)

1 tablespoon finely diced ginger

1/2 teaspoon chili flakes (I used chili powder)

1/3 cup water

1 teaspoon corn starch

### **Instructions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 450F.
- 2. Pat chicken drumsticks dry with paper towels really well and place in a large bowl. Sprinkle the baking powder all over the drumsticks and toss well to ensure even coverage.
- 3. Line a large (15" x 21" is ideal) baking sheet with aluminum foil (to avoid cleaning the baking sheet after baking), then parchment paper. Lay the drumsticks on the baking sheet, spacing them about 1-2 inches apart.
- 4. Bake for 30 35 minutes, until they are nicely browned and crisp. Turn about  $\frac{1}{2}$  way through. Start checking for doneness at 25 minutes in case your oven is different from mine.
- 5. Meanwhile, combine sauce ingredients in a small pan. Bring to a boil, reduce heat and simmer about 10 minutes or until sauce is slightly thickened and coats the back of a spoon.
- 6. When legs are done, coat them with the sauce. I use a pastry brush, turning them to do both sides. Return to the oven for 10 minutes. Let rest about 10 minutes.


