



This time of year always means apples; I love them about any way they are served, but here are a couple of different presentations:

CARAMEL APPLE JELLO SHOTS [WITH REAL APPLES]

- 10 small granny smith apples
- 1 envelope knox gelatin
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/2 cup coconut milk
- 2 drops yellow food coloring
- 1 envelope caramel or regularl hot chocolate
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup butterscotch schnapps
- lemon juice



For more alcohol content Van Gogh Dutch Caramel Vodka instead of butterscotch schnapps. Or for a kid friendly, non-alcoholic version just use cold water mixed with two tablespoons of caramel syrup instead of butterscotch schnapps or vodka

- 1. Half and hollow out apples cutting them from the stem down. Squeeze some lemon juice on top to reduce browning.
- 2. Mix 1/2 cup water with envelope of hot chocolate in a medium sized sauce pan. Whisk to combine. Add 1/2 cup of coconut milk, whisk again.
- 3. Sprinkle gelatin on top and let it sit a few minutes. Turn on low/medium heat and mix the gelatin until all is combined.
- 4. Add 1/4 cup sugar and simmer slightly until sugar is combined. Add food coloring until you get the caramel color desired ~ two drops. Let mixture cool to warm. Pour in 1/2 cup butterscotch schnapps.
- 5. With apples arranged so they fit tightly and securely on a cookie sheet, pour your caramel jello mixture into your apples. Refrigerate overnight.
- 6. Cut halves in quarters and those quarters in half again. Serve immediately. (The lemon juice can only prevent the browning for so long). Trim off the sides of the apples that have browned too much!

Baked Apples with Cinnamon Mascarpone + Toasted Coconut

Serves: 6 halves Please put picture of backed apples here

Ingredients

- ½ cup unsweetened coconut flakes
- 1½ cup water
- 3 apples, halved, core removed
- 1½ tablespoon butter, sliced into 6 thin pieces (keep cold)
- · cinnamon to dash
- 8 oz. mascarpone cheese
- 1½ tablespoon maple syrup
- ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg



- 1 Preheat oven to 325
- 2. Spread coconut flakes in a single layer on a baking sheet.
- 3. Bake for 5 minutes, until slightly browned. Remove from oven, place coconut flakes on a plate and let cool.
- 4. Preheat oven to 350.
- 5. Place apple halves in a glass 13x9 baking dish flesh side up. Add a piece of butter into the hole of each apple where the core use to be. Add a dash of ground cinnamon to each apple.
- 6. Pour the water into the baking dish. Cover with tin foil.
- 7. Bake for 30 minutes. This will make the apple somewhat tender but leave them with a slight crunch still. (If you want them really tender bake for 45 minutes.)
- 8. In the meantime, add mascarpone cheese, maple syrup, cinnamon, vanilla ex-tract, and nutmeg to a small bowl. Using a spatula gently stir until all ingredi-ents are combined. Set aside.
- 9. Remove apples from the oven.
- 10. Serve each apple warm with 1-2 tablespoons of mascarpone and 1 tablespoon of toasted coconut.

The Land of My Youth

he weather has been beautiful here on the Northern Plains, temps in the 70's and 80's, sunny with blue skies and fluffy clouds, if at all, just enough wind – what more can one ask for?

One day this week, I drove to Miller, a town of about a thousand and a half 80 miles northeast of Chamberlain. I didn't pass through another town the whole way, but it didn't seem desolate. In fact, I think I had cell service the entire time, which is more than I can say about I-90 on the way to Sioux Falls.

The hills were lovely. In the midst of a drought in the middle of September, everything was green except the ripening grain. This doesn't happen here. Fall is usually dry, brittle.

The terrain was rolling, fields of corn, silage and stuff I didn't recognize were interspersed with hillier pastures populated with cattle of various breeds. It turns out Miller is a prosperous farm community. Farmers advertise their farms—or their show calves. Who knew there were show calves? Along Highway 45, one of those blue highways with no shoulder, were at least 3 hunting lodges. One of them had a netted corn field to hold baby pheasants until they grow up and can be captured and released into the neighboring fields, landscaped into strips of corn alternating with barren soil for the hunters to walk while the dogs scare up the pheasants from the corn. People pay a lot of money to hunt this way. I don't have to get it.

Much of the drive was a trip into my past. The land a few miles off the freeway and the "beaten path" hadn't changed that much in the last 50 years. New were the big round hay bales in place of the smaller rectangular ones. Floating on the breeze was a turkey buzzard—not a sight I would have seen then. And the ubiquitous metal monsters carrying high-voltage electricity from Big Bend Dam in Fort Thompson to somewhere-else-not-here invaded sightlines. But the wood and barbed wire fences were the same, the vast expanses of rolling prairie, the panoramic view unimpeded by trees, except where there was (or, more commonly, had been) a homestead—this was the land of my youth.



Get your imagination going when you paint

ou don't have to be a Picasso to find satisfaction and enjoyment in creating art. When you're searching for ideas or subjects to paint, consider these approaches:

• Seek inspiration. Spend some looking at art—paintings, sculpture, drawings. Listen to music to stimulate your creative juices.

- Start small. If you're hesitant, or blocked, don't tackle a big art project. Start with something small and easy. Work on one section of a painting you're planning, and don't think of the rest of the project. You'll accomplish something concrete, and your success may give you the momentum you need to continue.
- Switch things around. If you usually paint or draw horizontally, switch to vertical. Instead of painting what you see, paint what you feel. If you draw with your right hand, try switching to your left. A small change can make a big difference.
- Try an exercise. Pick a common saying: "Once in a blue moon," for instance. Draw or paint what the saying means to you. What kind of rare occurrence springs to your mind? How would the world look under blue moonlight? Choose other clichés and catchphrases to illustrate, and you'll keep your perceptions sharper.

Fear criticism? Do it anyway

The cliché that you can't please everyone is a simple lesson on dealing with criticism. You'll always have detractors, so you may as well follow your heart and do what's right.

That's what Julia Butterfly Hill learned. Hill made headlines a couple of years ago when she climbed into a California redwood and lived there for two years to protest logging in the ancient woods. After she came down, she wrote a book about her experience, The Legacy of Luna (Luna is the name she gave to her tree home).

Then came publicity—and criticism from loggers whose livelihood she was curtailing and environmentalists who accused her of selling out.

"For every action, there's an equal and opposite criticism," Hill said. So do it anyway.
