


From the Board of Directors

ood Day All,

I usually begin my Monthly Media article by looking back over similar months for previous years to see how things were going then compared to today. I must say that I did not bother to do so this time, as nothing could compare to our lives right now. I look back to our March Board meeting where we closed everything down "for a



few weeks" until we got through the virus mess. I can't imagine anyone would have believed at that time that the most important fashion accessory we all owned would now be a mask. "Don't leave home without it" has a whole new meaning in the world of the corona virus.

The Board has worked long and hard to keep our vulnerable Blue Jay friends safe in an increasingly dangerous environment in Florida. We were not the first, second or probably the 100th homeowners association to open our pool. But we did it safely. Our clubhouse is currently open to only 10 people at a time, but it was opened safely. Every action the Board took during these months was taken with safety in mind, and while there were times that some of our residents were frustrated by the slow pace, Blue Jay has lost none of our residents to the virus, and that is more important than any visit to the pool.

By the time you read this article, the first workshop for the 2020 budget will already have been held, on August 17th. If you missed it and want to comment, make sure to attend the second workshop which will be held on Tuesday September 8th, 2019 at 2pm in the clubhouse. All homeowners are invited to attend. It would be nice if the clubhouse was open by then, but I am not optimistic. We will be using the deck as a backup for residents who cannot fit in the clubhouse.

I feel the need to remind residents that except in an emergency any issues in the park need to be dealt with by either putting a note in the box in the clubhouse or attending the Operations Meeting held every Monday morning at 8:30 in the clubhouse. This is much more important while we are still dealing with the virus. You should never call or text a Board Member, and certainly never go to their house unless there is an emergency situation. Please remember that Board Members are residents first, and deserve the same privacy as you would expect to have while in your home. Their privacy should be respected in the same manner as you would expect that yours would be. Remember what I always say. "Put it in the box!"

Please also take a few minutes to walk around your house and check to see that it meets "Blue Jay Standards." It has not been possible to do our usual drive through this year, but in reality we should not have to remind you to that the area around your home needs to be clean, that you should be looking out for mold, and that your roof needs to be clean. Please be kind to your neighbors and keep Blue Jay looking beautiful.



Ational Wildlife Day, Sept. 4. Also celebrated on Feb. 2, National Wildlife Day serves to bring awareness of endangered animals nationally as well as globally.



Labor Day, Sept. 7. A day off and a day to pay tribute to working men and women.

National POW/MIA Recognition Day, Sept. 18. This honors those who were prisoners of war (POWs) and those who are still missing in action (MIA). It is most associated with those who were POWs during the Vietnam War.

Rosh Hashanah, Sept. 18–20. The Jewish New Year and the traditional anniversary of the creation of Adam and Eve, the first man and woman according to the Hebrew Bible, and the inauguration of humanity's role in God's world.

World Alzheimer's Day, Sept. 21. An international campaign to raise awareness and challenge the stigma that surrounds dementia.

The history of Labor Day

abor Day is a creation of the labor movement, a yearly celebration of the American worker, and a national tribute to the laborer's contribution to the social and economic achievements of the United States. There is some uncertainty about the origins of Labor Day. Some records show that Peter J. McGuire, general secretary of the Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners and a co-founder of the American Federation of Labor, was first to suggest a day to honor those "who from rude nature have delved and carved all the grandeur we behold." Other research suggests that machinist Matthew Maguire, later the secretary of Local 344 of the



International Association of Machinists in Paterson, N.J., proposed the holiday in 1882 while serving as secretary of the Central Labor Union in New York.

The first Labor Day holiday was celebrated on Tuesday, Sept. 5, 1882, in New York City, in accordance with the plans of the Central Labor Union. In 1884, the first Monday in September was selected as the official holiday. The first governmental recognition of Labor Day came through municipal ordinances passed in 1885 and 1886. The state of Oregon passed the first law recognizing the Labor Day holiday on Feb. 21, 1887. Four more states—Colorado, Massachusetts, New Jersey, and New York—followed suit that same year. On June 28, 1894, Congress passed an act making the first Monday in September of each year a legal holiday in all the states, the District of Columbia, and all U.S. territories.
