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

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
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#### TRAVEL CLUB



s President elect, soon to be President, I hope all is doing well. With this difficult time I am not sure if 2021 will get us any closer to normality.



ast month, Ellen wrote the story of Beverly Alho who has lived in Briar Creek since 1977. To me it is fascinating to listen to our neighbors' stories and learn about their experiences here.



This month, I talked with Joan Davis in Phase 2. Joan and her husband moved to Briar Creek in 1983, 37 years ago. When they first arrived in Briar Creek they commented to each other that with the trees, the crooked roads, the hills, and wildlife, it was as close to being in upstate New York you could get here in Florida. They liked that BC was not a rubber stamped community. Joan had left her busy and responsible professional position as an Assistant Administrator for 240 residents and 320 employees to retire here. She told her husband if she was bored in 6 months she would go back to work. Needless to say, she did not.

One of the best features about Briar Creek is that residents are safe here. She can recall less than 5 incidents that involved law enforcement. One was her golf cart stolen and then later she was able to retrieve it with the help of a neighbor in Phase 1., Another incident was a pot being thrown into a window of a vacant house. Another best characteristic of neighbors in Briar Creek is neighbors' concern for their neighbors. When her husband was hospitalized often, cards from their Briar Creek neighbors filled the wall in his room. The support she felt for her and her husband was priceless. She feels that living in Florida gives people an extra 10 years of living.

Joan was on the Board of Directors from 1987-1988 and now since 2007, as the Treasurer. She is committed to having reserve funds so that we are not assessed every year which is typical

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of other condominiums. She is adamant about having a budget and sticking to it, pleased that this is a board with working members, and that there are neighbors that are willing to help without a board position.

Joan is grateful for Progressive Management. The Progressive Management staff has always been helpful and responsive. Briar Creek is fortunate to be a partner with them.

The biggest change Joan has seen in Briar Creek is that it is no longer a predominate retirement community and that neighbors are not as community oriented as in the past. Her request is that more neighbors pitch in and do what needs to be done. Sounds like an invitation to anyone who has a slight interest in making a contribution to do so.

Thank you Joan for sharing your observations and thoughts about living in Briar Creek with us.


# Request Guidelines to make a Social Club purchase request:

# Fish Crows, American Crows, and Camphor Trees

s I write this, I can hear the crows making a racket outside in the trees. At this time of year, the camphor trees produce those small dark-blue to black berries, and the crows love them. We have two kinds of crows down here. Most people are familiar with the American crow because it's widespread. The fish crow is mostly southeastern, and likes to live near wetlands. The two look pretty much the same, but you can tell them apart by their calls. American crows make the familiar CAW! CAW! sounds. Fish crows have a kind of hiccup: WAH-AH! WAH-AH! Both of them like camphor berries, and they also break off twigs, making quite a mess. Of course, this doesn't last for long.

Camphor trees are not native to Florida—they were introduced in 1875 for the production of camphor, but turned out not to be profitable. They do quite well here, though, and can sometimes be a troublesome invasive. Still, their limbs have a graceful shape, and the wind in their leaves makes an interesting hissing sound.






