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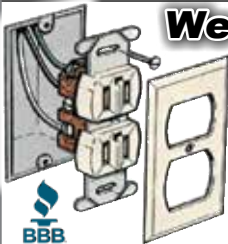
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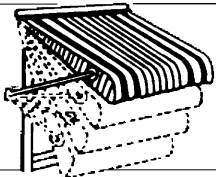

WHY DO I NEED TO UPDATE MY EMERGENCY CONTACT CARD?

As you may have heard or read, a resident recently was locked out of the house due to a door that chose to close BEFORE they were back inside. They had done the right thing and updated their Emergency Card when an update had been encouraged two years ago. The problem arose because the emergency contact noted on the card had changed phone numbers and the homeowner had not updated the Emergency Card. These cards are for one purpose ONLY, an Emergency Contact card. No one has access to the cards except your Directors and this info can make the difference between a good or bad outcome in many emergency situations. You might get locked out of your house or you might be out and about in Briar Creek when a health situation occurs and you require medical attention. One of the directors will be able to access the information and call your emergency contact if you are unable to do so.

Do you have a spare key with a neighbor in Briar Creek? Do you have a spare key hidden somewhere but no one knows where it is? This info is also requested on the Emergency Contact Card. Is this information required? That depends. It is only required when you NEED it.

Do not wait! It's time to UPDATE your info. Please contact a director and have it done.

Line dancing in the street in front of my house on Wednesday evening. Had an audience of neighbors, staying 6 feet apart. Everyone enjoyed it.

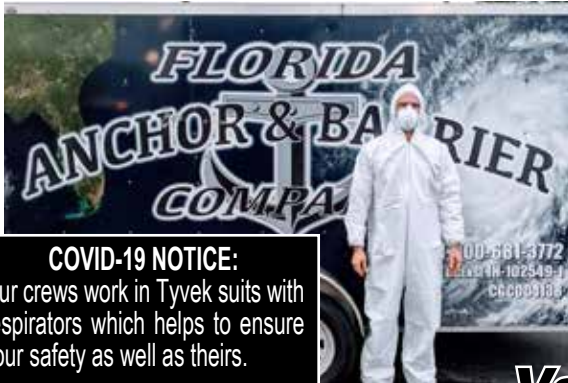

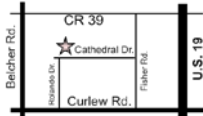

Hope all is well with you and your family. The governor has allowed the swimming pool & spa to be re-opened on April 28. Therefore, the pool area is open, but with restrictions. The pool/spa & deck is restricted to residents of Briar Creek Phase II only, no visitors, no children as this time until further notice. Per the governor's restrictions, the swimming pool is restricted to 10 persons, 50% of the bathing load. The spa is restricted to 4 individuals. Again please keep at least six feet apart. If there are ten persons in the pool or four in the spa with residents waiting, please limit your time in the pool to one hour, 10 minutes in the spa. Under ten persons in the swimming pool, the one hour limit is waived. Ten minutes only in the spa. Please read the posted rules & restrictions that are posted at the pool area. Please bring your own cleaning wipes so to clean your chair & table prior to use and after use. Bring your own noodle, no noodles will be provided. The pool deck chairs have been placed six feet apart. Please keep the chairs six feet apart, do not move chairs around.

The clubhouse remains closed at this time except for the rear door near the pool. This door is opened by your fob so you can access the clubhouse bathrooms. All other areas of the clubhouse are off limits until further notice. The clubhouse (except the bathrooms) to include the fitness room remain closed until notice is received from the governor and or the Pinellas County Board of Commissioners.

If notice with instruction is received after this writing concerning the opening of the clubhouse & fitness room the announcement will be placed on our community phone tree and

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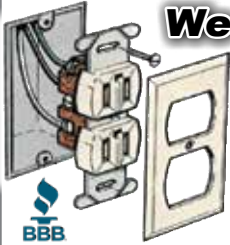

When the clubhouse is available for meetings, I will contact the folks on the "update the bylaws" committee with a meeting date & time. Let's keep protecting each other by continuing to observe the health measures suggested by the authorities.

REMINDERS



Overnight Parking in the street is NOT allowed.

Daytime Parking – please Park on ONE SIDE of the street in your area. This will keep our streets open for Emergency Vehicles.

Visitor Parking is at the clubhouse on the side of the shuffleboard courts, (grassy area). Please put the VISITORS PASS in the front windshield. Residents who do not have the pass can contact a board member. Parking in an empty carport is NOT allowed without permission.

STOP at ALL STOP SIGNS, and, our SPEED LIMIT is **15MPH**. Your help is greatly appreciated.

Also: “FOR SALE” & “FOR RENT” Signs are restricted to “14" X 12" and may be posted inside a STREET SIDE window only of the mobile home unit. No other signs of any kind shall be displayed."



Emergency Entrance/Exit:

There is an emergency exit gate that is kept locked, and only opened in case of an emergency.. The gate is located between 146 and 148 Pinewood Terrace in Phase II. The exit opens into the Country Villas subdivision south of us and you can reach SR580 via that subdivision. Country Villas Drive takes you straight out to SR 580. **In case of an emergency the gate will be unlocked by one of the members of Phase II board of directors.**

To get to our emergency exit/entrance from McMullen Booth, turn East onto SR 580, and Country Villas is on the North side before you reach the bridge.

Turn into Country Villas onto Country Villas Drive, stay on that until you get to Timberview Drive. Make a right turn onto Timberview Drive; the emergency exit/entrance gate is on the left side of Timberview Drive between the houses at 266 and 264 Timberview Drive. You will be able to see the gate between the two homes. When you drive between the houses and enter Briar Creek, you will be on Pinewood Terrace.

In the event we have a future emergency that might cause Briar Creek's entrance from McMullen Booth Road to be blocked, it might be wise to familiarize yourself with the steps to access our additional exit/entrance location. As far as we can find out this gate has only been used 3 times, this past month (May 2020), December 2018 and according to one of the neighbors in Country Villas about 25 years ago. Originally there were cement block pavers that you could see on the Country Villas side, but grass has grown over the pavers.

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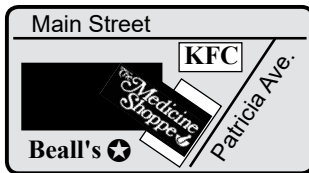

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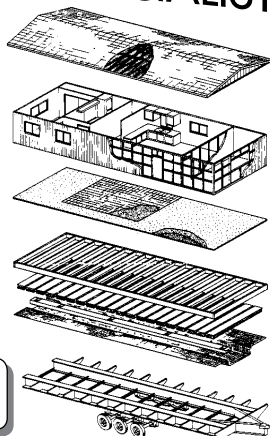
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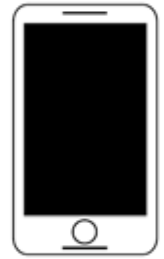

HISTORY OF BRIAR CREEK

Our community began in 1976 with a purchase of 200 plus acres by developer & President J. Warren Hughes, along with George A. Knutsson, EVP of Briar Creek. Their vision of spaciousness with changing elevations and winding streets is what makes Briar Creek unique. They strove for soft colors that would blend in with the natural setting of the land, and filled with trees, shrubs, and native plants. Mr. Knutsson describes Briar Creek as a project that "shook up the industry." First off, the property is unusual, almost a direct opposite of the usual mobile home park, normally laid out like a grid on perfectly flat land with the original trees stripped away. Briar Creek has elevations ranging from 15 to 45 feet above sea level. There are 5.3 homes per acre in their master plan, rather than the typical cookie-cutter criteria of 9 homes per acre.

"Majestic old Oak trees provide privacy and shade for unusually spacious and lovely home sites. Our phases feature both wooded and waterfront homes sites right on Old Tampa Bay. Best of all you own your own home site, not rent it, so you and your neighbors will experience the pride of ownership usually associated only with a single-family home." This was the quote by developer & President J. Warren Hughes.

Twenty-two acres were sold to Mease Hospital, with five acres earmarked for commercial development in front of our park. Hughes and Knutsson created a foliage-filled buffer as people

entered our park; without realizing it, this was something that has benefited our residents with a sense of privacy and security throughout the years.

Phase I's plan was for 317 homes sites. In the later part of 1976, the first resident owners of Briar Creek purchased their lots and began taking up residence in their mobile home units. The initial maintenance fee was \$47.00 per month. Lots in Phase I ranged from \$5,995 to \$8,995. The mobile home units started at \$18,900 furnished and are again unusual in that Briar Creek provides free decorator service to ensure that colors blend right, and only custom-manufactured home are used.

Phase II was expected to be 500 units however consideration for retention lakes and additional common use resulted in Phase II having 261 units. The first home in Phase II was set up in June 1980, the last lot was sold on June 15, 1987.

Due to increasing traffic on McMullen Booth Road, entering and exiting Briar Creek became more and more dangerous, which resulted in at least one fatal accident. On October 12, 1985 George Costage, one of our veteran residents, presented a petition to the city of Safety Harbor signed by 604 residents requesting a Traffic light for the intersection of McMullen Booth Road and Briar Creek Boulevard. The traffic signal was ultimately installed in June 2006.

This information was gathered from the History Books of Briar Creek, the Photo Directories, and the Monthly Medias.

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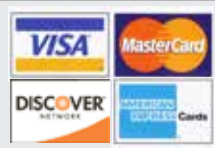
