BOARD BUSINESS and UP DATES

From the Desk of

Jeff Clark, President

Recently, one of our neighbors called me with an "amazing" idea. I won't waste your time or bore you with all the details, but this person insisted that I just HAD to implement this proposal immediately. When I tried to explain that (as a single board member) I didn't have the authority to make such a decision, they accused me of not doing my job and hung up.

You must understand that any one board member cannot arbitrarily change our rules. Only the board, discussing it in public and working together, can make such changes. If one director could make such decisions, we would have:

- Individual board members interpreting (and enforcing) rules differently,
- Decisions made in secret,
- No public input or debate on such a decision, and
- No record of the discussion or the decision.

I'm convinced this is the basis for Florida's Sunshine Law: decisions made by a duly elected board, discussed and voted upon at a public board meeting. When we abide by this law, we have public debate of the topic, along with board members' votes and a written record of the proceedings. So, while you're welcome to ask any board member for their opinion of a rule



or by-law, please don't singularly ask us to change any of them on your behalf. That's what board meetings are for.

ur shuffleboard season is on the horizon. We will begin daily practice for those available October 3rd. Members will start practice at 11:30 AM until 1 PM each day Monday Through Friday. This will allow our players from last season to hone their skills for the start of our 18 week season beginning on November 12th on our home courts.

As always our teams are open to all residents of Briar Creek Phase I. If you don't have a Virus Protection program installed on your computer I strongly suggest you get one. McAfee one of the popular virus protections will allow you to protect from 3-5devices for one price. Well worth the money. Another Virus protection is Norton. Inspection Procedures

s volunteer inspectors evaluate the condition of your home, they're primary reference is the Annual Inspections* document. This guideline will then be used to fill out the Inspection Form*, if the inspectors should find any deficiencies with your property. The inspectors will primarily be looking for:

- The overall cleanliness of your home's exterior,
- The condition of your landscaping (lawn, trees, shrubs and flowers),
- Wear and tear on your property,
- Excessive clutter that detracts from your property's appearance, and
- Areas that needed previous work (per last year's Inspection Form).

Once the inspection is completed, you'll receive one of two papers: the white copy of the Inspection Form noting areas that need attention, or the famous "smiley" coupon that tells you everything looks great (and that you're entitled to a free donut and coffee at the Social Club's Wednesday morning coffee hour). If you received the Inspection Form and have completed the necessary work, make sure you've signed it and returned it to the Director's Office within 30 days.

We're fully aware that the 30-day time frame doesn't work for everyone. If- for ANY reason- you can't complete the work within one month, please note it on the Inspection Form and return it to the Director's office as soon as possible. Tell us *why* you need the extra time, and a reasonable estimate of *when* the work will be completed. A re-inspection will then be performed on that new completion date. We have no problem with any resident that feels they need more time, but you *must* communicate this request to us, and keep us informed along the way.

The following is extremely important, and cannot be stressed enough: **EVERY Inspection Form MUST be returned to the Director's Office within 30 days of receipt, whether you have completed the work at that time or not.** I would suggest you keep a copy of the Inspection Form for your own records.

The school project is the priority at this time due to the school year to start. FYI, access to the garage has been restricted. Any resident in need to borrow tools from the garage must call a board member and or the individual listed on the contact list that is located at the garage on the exterior wall by the overhead door.

Recently, some of our residents have had issues with their exterior circuit breaker panel boxes to include the circuit breakers within the box. The boxes were found pulling away from the structure with the breakers within the box old & corroded. The exterior circuit breakers generally are circuits to your Florida room, utility room and to the HVAC unit. Please play it safe and have your exterior electrical box & circuit breakers inspected by a licensed electrical contractor.

With the rainy season upon us, the lawn maintenance contractor might not be here on their scheduled day due to rain on that day and or during the week. During the rainy season, low areas on you property will become saturated. These areas should be flagged off so that the lawn equipment does not cause ruts in those areas when being cut. If you are at home at the time of the grass cutting, just ask the workers to trim the problem areas and or any other area you feel needs attention.

Again, I would like to recommend that all residents check their rain gutters for debris. Rain gutters to include the down spouts that contain debris is an invitation for various crawling insects to nest. If rain water cannot drain out and away from your structure, problems will develop. During the rainy season, concrete, bricks and pavers develop mold. These areas should be power washed as the mold not only takes away the beauty of your home, but is not healthy. Please be a good neighbor and keep you home clean, property free and clear of unnecessary storage & weeds.

Weeki Wachee Springs: Weeki Wachee

If you have been at Saturday morning coffee in the clubhouse recently, you will have heard our dedicated travel club organizers, Karen and Roz, talk about a trip to see the Weeki Wachee mermaids. The trip is now planned for September 11th and if the following description of the history of the mermaid show peeks your interest, the sign up list is up and waiting for your signature.

(This description was found in the book "Strange But True Florida" by Lynne Hall. *Wacky wonders and strange sights you won't see anywhere else*, one of the books recently donated to the BC2 library. The book was published back in 2005 so there will have been changes.)

Do you believe in mermaids? Yes, Virginia, they do exist. At least they do in Weeki Wachee Springs. Not only do they exist but they also treat visitors to intricate ballet performances daily in the world's only underwater spring theater.

One of Florida's natural wonders, Weeki Wachee Springs is a natural spring that discharges more than 64 million gallons of crystal-clear water daily into the Weeki Wachee River. Because of the proximity to the sea, the spring and river are filled with both fresh and saltwater fishes and sea animals, such as manatee, turtles and otters. And mermaids.

The underwater theater opened in 1947, the brainchild of former Navy frogman Newt Perry. Perry was the first to conceive the idea of "hose breathing," staying underwater by breathing through an air hose supplied by an air compressor located above water.

Looking for a way to perfect his idea, Perry built a glass-walked theater sixteen feet below the surface of Weeki Wachee Springs, where he staged demonstrations of eating and drinking underwater. He also hired nubile young women to perform underwater ballets and synchronized swimming routines. Somewhere along the way came the idea to dress them as mermaids.

Weeki Wachee became internationally famous for its mermaids and soon tourists began streaming in. The 1960s saw lines of cars packed with tourists waiting to get in and take a gander at these otherworldly creatures. Eight shows a day, and still there were lines. Some of the mermaids are now allowed to interact with the visitors, an attraction popular with little girls and amorous dads.

Weeki Wachee Springs Park is found with the city limits of Weeki Wachee, one of the world's smallest cities. Established in 1966, the city has a population of nine. Its mayor is a former mermaid (Note: these data are as of 2005).

It isn't easy being a mermaid. Not only must the Weeki Wachee mermaids learn complicated underwater ballet moves, but they must also learn to do them holding their breath. And battling the spring's 12mph current.

Prospective mermaids must first audition, and if accepted, undergo rigorous training to learn to breathe from the long air hose and perform ballet moves while holding their breath. More than half of the mermaid trainees wash out before attaining the rank of full mermaid, which involves one year of on-the-job training. The final exam is a killer. It's held at the mouth of the spring, where the current is the strongest. Trainees must hold their breath for two-andone-half minutes, while changing out of costume under the 72 degree water.




