You must submit your Proxy prior to 10:00 AM on December 7, 2015.



# **Diagnosed with Skin Cancer?**

Living in the "sun belt" area means lots of sun exposure, which many times translates into skin cancer. That's the bad news. The good news is that there are many techniques for treating skin cancers, including one of the most effective treatments, which is Mohs surgery. Mohs, (rhymes with "nose") surgery was developed by Dr. Frederick Mohs in 1938, is a micrographic surgery proved to be highly effective in skin cancer treatment.

Two types of skin cancers, Basal Cell Carcinoma and Squamous Cell Carcinoma, (the most common skin cancers) can be treated with Mohs surgery. This micrographic

surgery is accepted by many dermatologists as the single most effective technique for removing these two kinds of skin cancer. The surgery is a 98% (or higher) cure rate, better than most other types of surgery for skin cancer.

To put the Mohs surgical technique in simple terms, the patient (who has been previously diagnosed for skin cancer) is prepared with a local anesthetic in an outpatient facility. Then a small thin tissue section is removed; the patient is then moved to a "holding area," while the skin section is examined for cancer cells. If cancer cells are present in the removed tissue, then the patient is brought

back into the operating area, and the procedure is repeated, taking off another thin section of tissue which is examined for cancer cells. When a tissue section comes back totally free of cancer cells, the surgical area is repaired and the patient goes home. Sometimes the entire procedure only takes two tissue examinations; and sometimes more procedures are required. The best news is that when the patient goes home, they have been declared cancer-free in the treated area

Even better news is that Mohs surgery limits the amount of skin and tissue removed from a cancerous area, which is extremely important in the facial, head or neck area, which relieves many concerns about the cosmetic ramifications of traditional cancer surgery. To put it bluntly, rather than having a big chunk taken out of one's nose to remove a cancerous area, Mohs surgery should be considered to save as much tissue as possible, so that even a minimal amount of reconstructive surgery may not be necessary.








#### Mary Casola - In the Spotlight

Our In the Spotlight celebrity this month is Mary Casola, who lives at 95 Cypress Drive. Mary, and her husband, Joe, have lived in Briar Creek since December 2007. Mary was born in the Bronx. With an older brother (11 months older) named Dominick (Mimi for short) and a younger brother, Gene, by five years, Mary was a middle child. Her older brother and Mary were very close; so close, in fact they were sometimes referred to as "the twins."

Mary's father Victor was from Calabria, Italy, and a fisherman by trade; he not only fished, but he also functioned as a cook on the boat. Actually, it wasn't a boat ... it was a vessel with a capacity of 100+ men and it was called "The Three Sails." Dad brought home lots of seafood for family dinners, night after night. Unfortunately, seafood wasn't on Mary's list of favorites, but as she got older, seafood became an important part of the dinner menu.

Mary's mother Jean was known to her family as a "saint," by keeping order in the family. Jean was born in Montreal, Canada, and also worked as a shop seamstress, an occupation that she began between Mary's middle school and high school years. Working in the Bronx area meant many families did not even have a family vehicle; they simply walked to work, walked to shop, and walked to the homes of friends and relatives.

Attending Grace H. Dodge Annex Vocational School in the Bronx didn't mean hitting the books or studying for Mary. School days meant fun at lunch, recess, and sharing time in the bathroom with friends. Caught one time smoking in the restroom, even though the other girls got into hot water, Mary's "angel" seemed to watch over her and she escaped punishment. Mary never seemed to get into serious problems in school, even though she was mischievous; she mentioned she was usually the teacher's pet, thanks again to her "angel."

After graduating from high school, Mary entered the work force to work at a bank in the

bookkeeping area, along with about 200 other women. When Mary wasn't working, she was always in the midst of family activities, as well as keeping personal friendships alive and well.

When Mary started at the bank working with so many other women, it was in the days before computerization. As a result, a large staff was necessary to conduct banking business. At school, Mary turned out to be the "teacher's pet," and at the bank, she was also the special employee that the bosses treated a little better than the others. In fact, Mary was lucky enough to be able to do shopping for the management staff, especially around Christmas, when she was selected to do their Christmas shopping. No wonder Mary loved her job!

As computers began to be used more extensively in business, the staff at the bank was slowly reduced. Mary's job, rather than being eliminated, was changed to a teller's duties. There were lots of new things to learn, but she was up to the task and ended her bank career after many productive years. In fact, Mary was last of the 200 women to leave the bank.

One evening she was attending an engagement party about four blocks from her home, when her eyes fell on a handsome young soldier. Mary was with three girl friends, so she figured this young soldier could decide which of the four young ladies would pique his interest. Mary introduced herself to the soldier (who -- at least in Mary's eyes -- looked a little thin and could use some "fattening up"), and found out his name, and that he was on leave from the 716th military division of the U.S. Army. Since the soldier's name was Joseph Casola, it's easy to see which young lady caught his eye! In November, Joe and Mary will be married 55 years!

Mary and Joe had a big Italian-style wedding and honeymooned at Mt. Airy Lodge in Pennsylvania. Women often wear the Dirndl, which a close-fitting bodice combined with an apron in a different color. Sometimes the dirndl is sleeveless and worn with a cotton and lace blouse; sometimes it features sleeves and a high neck. Men's traditional clothing can include Lederhosen, knee-length trousers or short-pants made from leather, normally worn with rustic shoes and wool socks. As with other customs of the country, clothing depends on the occasion and region of Germany.

**Opal** is the national gemstone of Australia. Australian opal has often been cited as accounting for 95-97% of the world's supply of precious opal, with the state of South Australia accounting for 80% of the world's supply.

The internal structure of precious opal makes it diffract light; depending on the conditions in which it formed, it can take on many colors. Precious opal ranges from clear through white, gray, red, orange, yellow, green, blue, magenta, rose, pink, slate, olive, brown, and black. Of these hues, the reds against black are the most rare, whereas white and greens are the most common. It varies in optical density from opaque to semitransparent.

#### **Tourmaline**

The alternate birthstone for October is the tourmaline, a gemstone that exhibits the broadest spectrum of gemstone colors. Gem-quality forms of this mineral have in the past been misidentified as rubies, emeralds and sapphires. In fact, a famous tourmaline, the size of a pigeon's egg, belonging to the Russian Empress Catherine the Great was long thought to be a ruby.

The name of this gemstone is believed to derive from the Singhalese (Sri Lankan) word "toramalli," a term applied to yellow, green or brown stones, that means "something little out of the earth"

Tourmaline has an unusual property. When it is warmed or rubbed, it attracts small bits of paper, lint and ash. This occurs because the gem becomes charged with static electricity. In fact, Benjamin Franklin used this gem in his studies of electricity. Maintaining tourmaline exhibits at museums requires frequent cleaning of the gemstone because heat from lights of the display case create a charge in the stone that attracts dust.

ifting heavy items incorrectly can injure your back and other parts of your body. Whenever you have a heavy object to move, follow these basic rules for staying safe:

- Bend at the knees.
- Keep your head up.
- Keep your back straight.
- Lift with your legs, not your arms or back.
- Keep the object close to your body.
- Don't twist your back as you walk.
- Maintain stable footing.
- Ask for help if the load is too heavy for you to move on your own.
