

### **UPDATES FROM THE BOARD – Jeff Clark, Vice President**

### Laundry Room Renovation

A remodel of the laundry building on Sugar Bear is under consideration. If you have any ideas of your own (additions, improvements, colors, etc...), please share them via e-mail at <u>jeff@mybriarcreek.com</u>, or submit them in writing at the board office in the clubhouse. *Help local wildlife by NOT feeding them!* 

It can be tempting to feed what appears to be a very hungry or even starving wild animal, but it's against the law to feed them in Pinellas County (punishable by a \$500 fine, 60 days in jail, or possibly *both!*) From the Pinellas County Department of Animal Services website:

- Feeding wild animals makes them lose their fear of people. And, they can become aggressive when they don't get their anticipated serving.
- People-food isn't healthy for animals. Each animal has its own unique diet and disrupting it can lead to all types of health problems.
- If it smells like food (foil, plastic bags, etc.), animals will eat it. Dispose of trash properly.
- Don't forget about your home! Feeding your pets outdoors is an open invitation for wildlife, and unsecured garbage cans are attractive as well.



Please help keep Briar Creek safe for all residents by not putting out food for animals.

### **Pinellas County Watering Restrictions**

Despite our daily rain showers, we are still under a **Modified Phase III Water Shortage Order.** The rain may not necessarily get to all the areas where it can do the most good, so please help us all by following these rules. The current restrictions are:

### **Condo Board**

The home inspections in Phase II is an ongoing project. If you have been notified of any deficiencies with the exterior of your home to include unnecessary storage, weeds, mold, debris in the gutters, painting of the trim and structure, please correct those items as soon as possible. Any questions, please see, Mike Lucas or Clark Woodard.

We are now in the annual rainy season. I strongly recommend that residents clean and maintain their rain gutters and downspouts free and clear of debris twice annually. Rain water that does not drain out and away from a building will cause mold to form, water to find the least path of resistance which sometimes will enter your structure. Also, debris left in the rain gutters offers a

great home for ants, spiders and roaches.

Due to a test conducted on the clubhouse paint with the power washer, it was revealed that the paint is very loose and coming off the structure is small and large chips. Due to this situation, the planting of any and all flowers/tree is on hold until the clubhouse and garage building is properly cleaned & painted by a professional painting company. On July 8 the board of directors held a special meeting and awarded the painting contract to The Daley Group. The painting of the structures will be conducted in two phases.

The first phase is limited to the lower part of the clubhouse to include the doors, pool shower, shutters, trim and planters (2 side planters and the two rear planters), the lower section of the garage and the entire shuffleboard structure. The second phase will be the upper section of the structures, the dark mansard metal roof. We have to hold off on painting the dark mansard roof until the roofs of the clubhouse and garage are re-roofed in early 2018.

The board of directors is in the process of having the existing palm trees and shrubs within the island in front of the clubhouse removed with new flowers and palm tree's installed.

As a reminder, our swimming pool in Phase II is now lighted for swimming in the evening. The pool hours in effect are from 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM for adults. Children's hours are posted which are from 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM and then from 5:00 PM to 8:00 PM daily. Please return all noodles to the barrels provided.

wanted to update you on the food pantry. We have been located in the Mattie Williams Neighborhood Family Center for over 8 years. Mattie Williams housed us with no rent or utilities. However they are paid by the number of clients serves and the food pantry was the biggest draw to Mattie Williams. So we helped each other out. But we are Church and Community Outreach not Mattie Williams.

August of this year we celebrate 30 years. Calvary Church purchased Italian American Club in April 2017. They have offered CCO a place free of rent and utilities as MWNFC as over the years in the IAC.

## **Columbus' anchor salvaged from the depths**

team of explorers believe they've discovered an anchor from one of Christopher Columbus' ships in the Caribbean. According to a story on the Fox News website, an analysis of the anchor shows that it dates from somewhere between 1492 and 1550. It weighed 1,200-1,500 pounds and probably belonged to a 300-ton vessel, typical of Columbus' time.

The anchor is believed to come from a fleet of smaller ships called caravels, which included the Pinta. Captained by Vicente Pinzon on one of the "minor voyages" of Columbus' third expedition to the New World, the ship sank in a hurricane near the Turks and Caicos islands in 1500.



In addition to the anchor, the team brought up other artifacts at the shipwreck site, including grappling hooks used for salvaging cargo from shipwrecks, as well as pieces of pottery and an olive jar painted with indigo.

## Scientists create negative mass in the laboratory

Regative mass might sound like something out of science fiction, but physicists have created it in a laboratory. The BBC News website reports that scientists at Washington State University have created a particle composed of negative mass by using lasers to trap atoms of rubidium and then cooling them down to just above absolute zero. This caused the atoms to behave as a superfluid liquid, flowing without losing any energy.

Paradoxically, if you push something with negative mass, it accelerates in your direction, following behavior predicted by quantum mechanics. Scientist expect the technique to help them solve questions about black holes, neutron stars, and dark energy in the cosmos.

## Ancient bone raises modern questions

n artifact unearthed in Crimea may shed new light on our Neanderthal ancestors, according to the Sci-News website. It's a bone fragment from a raven, and it's approximately 38,000 years old. A mere 18 mm long, the bone bears a series on notches that are too evenly spaced to be the result of everyday butchery. Archaeologists believe that two notches on the raven bone could have been made intentionally by Neanderthals to create a pattern meant to be consistent or symbolic. The bone may have worn as a personal ornament, some speculate.
