BOARD BUSINESS and UP DATES

From the Desk of – Jeff Clark, President

As chairman of the Architectural Control Committee, I must remind everyone- yet againthat you MUST obtain approval from the Committee for ANY changes or additions you make to the exterior of your property (home and/or land). If I can see it by walking around your property, you need to get approval BEFORE you change or add it. The sole exception is work done directly beneath your home: plumbing, insect control, bottom barrier, sub-flooring, etc...

The biggest problem seems to be satellite TV dishes. Yes, you have the right to view DIRECTV and DISH Network in your home. Prior to installation of the dish, residents are reminded to submit an Architectural Request form. It appears that lately, many of the dishes have been installed on a pole into the ground, rather than mounted on the roof or side of one's home.

It is my responsibility to monitor and approve how these satellite dishes are installed within our community. Due to the number of unauthorized dishes I've seen going up lately, especially those mounted on poles installed into the ground, it has become an issue. Unless there is a valid reason – difficult to imagine what that would be - I will no longer approve pole-mounted satellite dishes.

The installers (mostly sub-contractors) may find it easier to stick a pole in the ground; they will install the dish on your home if you insist. Furthermore, they are creating an unreasonable "obstacle course" for our lawn-mowing contractor. It seems each week it's getting more difficult for them to mow our lawns in one day, due to all the TV dishes, lawn ornaments, and other obstacles.

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY, if I find any new, unauthorized pole-mounted dish you will receive a warning asking to have it removed and mounted on an existing structure. Non-compliance may result in a fine. You're welcome to scream, yell, and holler at me, BUT- you were forewarned via this Monthly Media.

<u>Clubhouse</u>

As you return you will behold all of the upgrades made to the Clubhouse by volunteer owners during the summer. The Clubhouse is enjoyed by all of our owners and the policy for the use of the Clubhouse is simple. The Association posts to a calendar those dates they reserve the Clubhouse for official business use. The Social Club reserves dates they need for all of the social events throughout their fiscal year. Other owners have asked for certain times to be reserved for repetitive community events (card games, line dancing, table tennis, etc.) which are open to all residents for fun activities. Owners can also request reserving the Clubhouse for private events. Our website (MyBriarCreek.com) has a calendar on the Clubhouse page where you can see the dates and times of all these Association, Social Club, community and private events.

If you wish to reserve the Clubhouse for an event, view the online calendar and pick out your preferred date(s). If it is a Social Club or community event, use the online Reservation Form and indicate if it is one-time or repetitive. This online Reservation Form can also be used by an Owner to request a reservation for a private event. If there are any community events occurring on your date, the Clubhouse Coordinator will discuss your needs with the people using the Clubhouse for the community event to see if we can accommodate your request. Association and Social Club events cannot be rescheduled due to contracts and commitments.

When you submit the online Reservation Form, it will automatically be delivered to the appropriate people. A signed Clubhouse Usage Agreement is usually also required and is available for download on the Clubhouse page, or you can pick up a copy from the bin on

the wall to the right of the Association Office at the Clubhouse. This form is necessary for insurance and legal reasons. For Social Club events, a Promo Request form is also available for download on the Clubhouse page, to request posters and tickets needed for the event. To keep our Clubhouse pristine and our bulletin board uniform from improper use, the Bulletin Board policy adopted by the Board of Directions is also downloadable from this page (as well as posted on the Bulletin Board at the Clubhouse).

The Clubhouse is there for all of us to enjoy and use, we just need to coordinate the use to avoid conflict in scheduling.

PROXIES FOR ANNUAL MEETING - DECEMBER 3, 2018 – Connie Holmes

To ALL Briar Creek 1 Property Owners:

Have you ever said, "I wish I could choose to pay the smaller amount?" If so, this message is for you.

You will soon be receiving an important package in the mail from Progressive Management concerning your ownership in Briar Creek. The packet will have your General/Limited Proxy which is essential to conduct the business of BC1 for the 2019 year. The annual meeting is scheduled for Monday, December 3, 2018 at the Clubhouse at 10:00 a.m.. Be sure to vote for each item listed on the Proxy.

A required number of owners/Proxies (159 of the 317 owners) is required to pass any item listed. If there is not a quorum (159) of owners, your fees will go up substantially. Only one Proxy is valid for property owner. If you own two properties, submit a Proxy for each. Please SIGN and date your Proxy before submitting and include the Unit # if known. (If you are unsure or do not know the Unit #, it will be filled in for you.) The signature MUST be an owner on the title/deed. If you have made any changes to the title or mailing address since last year, please let Progressive Management know immediately.

I have asked Gene Arend to help me with the Proxies this year as JoAnn Barr chose to step down from this 'job' last year. Every Proxy must be checked to confirm the signature belongs to a current owner and Gene keeps this information for BC1 as Webmaster and for our records and the proper government officials to confirm our 55+ status.

You MUST submit your Proxy prior by 9:00 am on December 3, 2018 by

- 1. Drop the Proxy in the mail slot at Clubhouse Director's Office
- 2. Give the Proxy to Connie Holmes, Secretary of the Board @85 Cypress Drive
- 3. Give the Proxy to Gene Arend, Webmaster at 103 Sugar Bear Drive
- 4. Mail the Proxy to Progressive Management

It is recommended to drop at the Director's Office or give to Connie or Gene. If your Proxy is mailed it does slow up the tally process. An early submission insures we are able to conduct business for the 2019 year. If you misplace your Proxy or it fails to arrive, extra copies will be available from Gene or Connie. If your Proxy does not arrive, you need to check with



Beware of Scammers, They are Everywhere!

On-line scammers are very savvy as to how kind-hearted people respond to a plea for charity; concerns about family; your computer operating smoothly; your banking matters; and all the other things you do on line. Keep in mind you don't really know who it is on the other side of the email. People get your email addresses from various sources.

Have you ordered anything on line; entered a contest on line; banked on line; or signed up for a newsletter? All these areas are fertile "hunting grounds" for criminals. They will do almost anything to get their grubby hands on your hard-earned money -- including telling you big fat LIES! They will tell you they are a woman dying of cancer who needs your money; they will tell you here's your chance to receive millions of dollars because you (and only you) have been named as a beneficiary by some person in another country (and that person only needs a little bit of your information to help you (and you alone) receive these millions.

On-line crooks wear disguises: They will say they are your bank, they are your internet provider, they are your friend, they are your church, they are your valuable on-line computer service technician, and the only person who can "speed up" your computer (all you have to do is allow them access to it and everything will be running much faster). Sometimes they sneak into your computer with a really great disguise.

The email will look very professional and warns you that your financial records or your computer or your internet provider or a special program you have on your computer has been compromised and unless you click on the provided link, you will lose money, computer usage, or other dire things may happen. Believe me, some of these scam emails look very real and *...continued on page 33*

very authentic. They are not! Look closely, though sometimes words will be misspelled or the grammar maybe slightly off.

They are experts at duplicating and mirroring an image of your banking home screen and then logging you into your bank after you enter your access information but first stealing the data. All you have to do is "click" on the provided link (or the attachment) or respond directly to the email and everything will be wonderful! DON'T BELIEVE THEM!

Remember, they're asking YOU for information that is valuable and should remain private and stay in your hands. If you receive an email and you're not sure if it's real or not, ask a computer-savvy friend or someone in your family to look at it. They don't even need to come to your house. You can forward the entire message (without doing anything else) to that person. There are tell-tale clues that experienced computer people can decipher very quickly, including how to determine the email source, what the return address displays, and so on. Please, if you're not sure, don't open or answer or click on a suspicious email message. Protect yourself and your privacy and your money!

Below are just two examples of emails I have received. Both are fakes:

"This is to notify you that your email address has been included in our blacklist and has been marked as an automatic junk sender, and has to be updated and verified, otherwise it will be permanently closed.

Update and verify your email to avoid closing immediately.

Click on the button below to update and verify instantly before 24 hours to show that you are not a robot and continue using your account."

"Dear Beloved one, I am Mrs.Charlotte Sparkman from United Kingdom, I am suffering from breast cancer I need your prayers. My doctor says I might not survive my surgery coming up because it is at stage 2, I really need your prayers and word of encouragement. please email me your prayers and wishes (mrscharlottesparkman@gmail.com) God bless you."




