

BOARD BUSINESS and UPDATES

From the Desk of John Pickering, President

elcome to our March Media update. Always lots going on for those who like to stay busy, and a great place just to hang your hat if relaxing is your goal. Speaking for your Board of Directors, I want to thank all of you who have shown

an interest in what's going on, but more specifically, the turnout at our Monday night BOD meetings has been impressive. Having 75 or 80 residents attending is a wonderful example of the Community support we have here from the top-to-the-bottom of the social food chain.

For those who have not made it to one of our evening meetings yet, I'd like to touch on a couple of significant issues that our Board has recently tackled:

- 1. RENTALS: Due to subtle changes within the Florida Condo Law regarding rental legislation, our Board recognized the legal importance of resetting BC-1 back to the 10% level originally established by your Board in the year 2000. Simply put, 31 dwellings within Phase 1 can again qualify as rental properties as long as the current/potential landlord manages said property within the well documented Rental Standards & Policies available for review on our website.
- 2. CREEK BANK DETERIORATION: Your Board established a Steering Committee to review options helping us better understand environmental challenges related to the measurable deterioration of our creek. "The Briar Creek Waterway Management Committee" (BCWMC) was formed during our February



Board of Directors meeting. The Committee is staffed by four BC-1 volunteer professionals who will be working closely with various Safety Harbor agencies on this important initiative. I'll keep you informed as we begin making progress.

In closing, I personally invite you to attend & participate in a future Monday BOD meeting. The next meeting begins at 7:00 p.m. sharp in our Clubhouse on March 2nd, typically the first Monday of the month. I'd love to see you there!

IN MEMORY OF LISA JOHNSON

any of you may have heard on the news of the tragic death of a family of three who were killed at the intersection of Tampa Road and US Highway 19 on February 1, 2020, around 11:30 p.m. What you may not have heard is that one of the victims was Lisa Johnson who was our newspaper carrier in Briar Creek. She, her husband, and 18-year-old son were on their way to pick up their papers when a car ran a red light going about 65 miles an hour. Lisa and her other two family members died at the scene, while the two lawbreakers fled on foot from the scene. No arrests have been made yet.

I walk early in the morning each day and got to know Lisa as she would sometimes stop along the way and we would talk about our families. I know she was a hard worker who was devoted to her family, but did not have a lot of material wealth to show for all her hard work.

Brenda Greene is in a club with Lisa's mother, Barb Sweet. Like me, she feels that besides prayers for her surviving two daughters and family, it would be nice for us as a community to show our love and support for Lisa and her family by collecting money to help with their needs. Therefore, Brenda and I are working together to get the word out to everyone that I will be collecting any donations over the next few days. which Brenda will bring to the family when she attends the club meeting on February 20th.
