

The AREA AGENCY on AGING of PASCO-PINELLAS, as a designated Aging and Disability Resource Center plans, coordinates and offers services through state and federal resources that help older adults remain in their own homes. HELPLINE: 1-800-963-5337. Agingcarefl.org.

The Helpline is a federally funded service to help seniors and caregivers gain access to services in the community. As part of the Aging and Disability Resource Center, the Helpline staff provide information and assistance/referral over the telephone to seniors and caregivers in Pasco and Pinellas Counties. They also provide information on community resources for adults age 18 and over who have a mental health or a developmental disability and their caregivers. Calls are answered by Area Agency on Aging staff from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday through Friday. Spanish speaking staff are available to take calls. The Helpline is able to provide information on government funded programs, non-profit agencies, and for-profit businesses that serve seniors in this two county area. Information is available in many areas including caregiver support, case management, in-home services, insurance counseling, legal help, meal services, nursing home and assisted living facilities, transportation, and victim advocacy. The Helpline also serves as the entry point for several community programs, and refers callers to the Intake Department for triage, telephone screening, and prioritization for services.

PROXIES FOR ANNUAL MEETING - DECEMBER 5, 2016 - Joann Barr

To all Briar Creek Property Owners:

You will be receiving in the mail from Progressive Management your General/Limited Proxy. It is important that all owners submit their proxy for our Annual Meeting scheduled for 10:00AM, Monday, December 5, 2016. Your completed SIGNED Proxy ensures the Board of Directors will be allowed to conduct business during 2017. Unsigned proxies will not be counted.

Be sure you vote for each issue as explained in the Proxy. A quorum of owners (159 of 317) is required to pass the listed issues. If we do not have a quorum our monthly maintenance fees will go up considerably. Only one Proxy is valid per property. If you own two properties, submit a proxy for each one. Please show your Unit Number, then date and SIGN your Proxy before submitting. The signature must be any owner on the title. If you change or have changed the title or mailing address since purchasing you need to let Progressive Management know.

You must submit your Proxy prior to 10:00AM on December 5, 2016.

There are several ways to submit your Proxy:

- 1. Drop in the mail slot at Clubhouse Director's Office.
- 2. Give to Jo Ann Barr any time, or drop off at 106 Cedar Elm Drive, put in black mail box at back door.
- 3. Mail to Progressive Management

It is recommended that your Proxy be dropped at the Director's Office or given to Jo Ann Barr. Mailing slows the tally process. Early submission insures there are enough proxies received to conduct business during the 2017 year.





To protect against Financial Exploitation...

- Direct Deposit for regular payments you receive regularly is the most secure and dependable method. This saves you a trip to the bank to deposit and it never gets delayed in the mail.
- Never sign blank checks allowing someone else to fill in the amount.
- Never leave valuables or money in plain view.
- Be aware of scams. Always remember if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.
- Never pay for any prize you WON, if you pay for it, you did not win it. Buying something does not increase your chance of winning.
- NEVER, NEVER give any caller your credit card number or other personal info such as social security number. (Many times it is difficult to tell if a telemarketer is legitimate. Be cautious and NEVER allow a caller to intimidate you HANG UP!)
- Do not give anyone your ATM code (pin #) and cancel immediately if stolen. If you are concerned you may have misplaced it rather than it stolen, take no chances...cancel and have it replaced.
- Watch you bank statements carefully for questionable listing...call your bank immediately and verify that you made the withdrawal.
- Be cautious of joint accounts. Both parties are equal partners in the account and both have equal access to the funds.
- Build a good relationship with the professionals who handle your money..
