# ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of the homeowners was held on December 7, 2015 at 10 AM. There were 200 Proxies returned -- meeting the 159 minimum required to hold the meeting. Had that number not been obtained, the annual meeting would have had to be rescheduled.

The Vote to Waive full funded reserves was 173 Yes - 17 No - 10 Not voting. The need to fully fund reserves is not expected to be necessary, since it is not anticipated there would be any one time when all of the repairs or replacement of the common elements would be required (leading to excess funds being reserved).

The Vote to Waive an Audit was 178 Yes – 11 No - 11 Not voting. The Law requires a full audit be performed every four years. Those years an audit is not performed, the board has an independent accounting firm review the financial records and submit a report on the review. A copy of the audit or review is available on request from the Treasurer, Bob Barr.

The Vote to rollover any excess funds if any from the operating account into the reserves was 190 Yes - 1 No - 9 Not Voting. The excess fund at the end of

each budget year is transferred to the common element reserves, otherwise the association is required by Internal Revenue Service to pay taxes.

While there were some items discussed and noted in the minutes of the meeting, the subject and vehicle violations with regard to speeding in the park, failure to stop at the stop signs or traffic light at McMullen Booth Road was discussed at length. Speeding on our roads not only endangers our residents, but is especially important at night while residents in the pet section are walking their pets. Our residents and/or their guests have been repeatedly asked to drive at or below the posted speed limits.

Also coming to a complete stop at the traffic light (when the light is red) at Mc Mullen Booth Road is required by law. Not doing so poses an extreme hazard to pedestrians attempting to cross the street. I was informed there was a fatality to a pedestrian on McMullen Booth Road. There have also been some close calls while residents are walking their pets. Please respect the residents of our community and the traffic laws.

ormer long-time resident George Costage passed away November 29, 2015. George and his wife, Nancy, were involved residents while they lived in Briar Creek. In2008,after 63 years in bureaucratic limbo, Mr. Costage finally received the Distinguished Flying Cross for his heroism during aerial combat over Europe during World War II. The presentation ceremony took place at the Briar Creek clubhouse and George was presented this honor by the then-U.S. Rep. Gus Bilirakis, R-Palm Harbor, for his bravery. Mr. Costage was also active in the local political arena, serving both as a City Commissioner, as well as a Vice Mayor of Safety Harbor. 


