LAWN MOWING

owing for the month of August will be on the following Fridays: August 5th, 12th, 19th and 26th. Please note that some or all of a service might not be provided due to weather considerations. In those instances, service will resume on the next regularly scheduled service date.

Grievances / Mowing Service

If you have any issues with a mowing service, please call Barbara Pesic at 727-307-5316. Please do not instruct the mowing crew while they are providing service. If you think there is a problem with your service, please phone in your complaint. Inspections will be provided as necessary. These issues are reported to the management of the mowing service for resolution. We appreciate your cooperating by following this procedure.

A Reminder about Tree Trimming: The association provides trimming of trees in all common areas of the park. Trees on residential lots are private property, and tree trimming of those trees is the responsibility of each homeowner. Trees should be trimmed so that their branches are not hanging over the streets and impeding the



flow of traffic and large trucks through the park (at least a 12 foot clearance is recommended). Tree growth should not block illumination of street lights to the roads. The dead growth on palm trees should be trimmed off on a regular basis. Please inspect your trees and trim them as necessary.

A Reminder about Barriers: There is a posting on the Board of Directors bulletin board in the clubhouse that provides an illustration of the recommended barrier needed to protect property from possible damage by the lawn service, primarily the trimming service. It suggests that an 8" barrier be provided around all utility installations, buildings, and plantings to prevent damage. For many units, a barrier around the building bottom is not necessary because it is brick. In some units (mainly the newer units), vinyl is installed to the ground and grass is installed to the vinyl (that is, no planter). These unprotected areas are vulnerable to damage without the protection of a barrier. The lawn service will not be trimming areas without barrier protection and is not held responsible for damage in the absence of a protective barrier. Please avoid any damage to your property by installing these barriers where they are needed.

How many of us have ever felt alone? TOTALLY ALONE? And no one seemed to care! Many times this happens when we are at our lowest...mentally or medically! You just heard those dreaded words, 'YOU HAVE CANCER!' You suddenly feel like you are having an 'out of body' experience. The Doctor keeps talking but you don't hear what is being said.

When and IF this happens to YOU, you need an advocate 'buddy' (someone who will listen and take down information for you when you are just struggling to keep it all together). The AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY has someone just for you. The ACS has a toll free hotline to speak to someone (a patient navigator) about any questions you need answered or to help you deal with your diagnosis. You will NOT be put on hold nor will you get an answering machine; only a real live specially trained 'buddy' to help you face your fears and concerns. They are there 24/7/365. Many times the toughest times come when everyone else is sleeping, working, or just not around. Please make use of all available resources provided FREE through the American Cancer Society and their staff partners. There is an abundance of information available online as well at cancer.org This phone # 1-800-ACS-2345 is a toll free call. Just call 1-800-227-2345.

"I only sing for the Mamas"

Ticholaus had sung to us for most of the night climb. Rhythmic, chanting songs, songs which called for a response from everyone in the group, songs to help the Mamas as he led us to the top of the slope. Other groups on the mountain face could hear us singing and sent us reassuring and encouraging shouts.

I was the second person in our group zigzagging in a short line up the steep slope, following Nicholaus and his slow, even climbing pace, bemused and intrigued by the singing and by the sexy hip swing accompanying each step highlighted in the beam from my headlamp.

Nicholaus checked how the group was doing. "Ok? Mama. Ok? Sister. Ok? Mama." We all replied in turn. I, as the first Mama, then my daughter Fay, Ellen the other Mama (from Norway) and finally Juma the assistant guide.

The place was the final ascent of Mount Kilmanjaro. Three degrees south of the equator in January and we were bundled up for the -25 degree weather, with heavy hiking boots, long underwear, fleece, windproof jackets, hats, scarves and mitts as well as face protectors.

The wind at the top of the mountain that day was so strong that 2 men lost their lives when they stepped off the main trail to avoid the bites and stings of flying icicles. We looked like frosted snowmen.

The final climb started at midnight and it took us nearly 6 hours to reach Gilmans's Peak at 5,600 meters above sea level. That was my limit. Fay and Ellen went further, up to Uhuru the ultimate peak. I was happy with a green certificate but they wanted gold. We all saw dawn break over Africa.

Many turned back. Only 13 of 54 climbers "summited" that day. Some because of fear, some because of physical weakness or injury, some because of altitude sickness. Even one of the experienced guides had problems with the altitude that day.

We'd spent the previous 4 ½ days trekking to the highest hut. 40 kilometres in distance and 4 kilometres in altitude. We would cover the 40 kilometres back in 1 ½ days, but then we were walking with wings.

We did have the luxury of porters to carry all the bags, food, water and firewood. Seven porters and two guides for 4 people. The porters and guides were mandatory. They were



wonderful, strong, cheerful, willing, friendly and interested. Providing support for Kilimanjaro climbers is a huge contributor to the local economy.

Why were we successful when others turned back? Strong will? Yes, but many others were just as motivated. Good health and fitness? Yes, but altitude sickness doesn't respect fitness levels.

A slow, even walking pace for the first days of the hike, stopping to take pictures, looking at the amazing flowers and trees. "Pole, Pole" was the mantra. "Slowly, slowly". Lots of water, about 3 ½ litres a day.

Even then you may not be as lucky as we were. As Nicholaus said "I only sing for the Mamas "




