PROXIES FOR ANNUAL MEETING - DECEMBER 5, 2016 - Joann Barr

You will be receiving in the mail from Progressive Management your General/Limited Proxy. It is important that all owners submit their proxy for our Annual Meeting scheduled for 10:00AM, Monday, December 5, 2016. Your completed SIGNED Proxy ensures the Board of Directors will be allowed to conduct business during 2017. Unsigned proxies will not be counted.

Be sure you vote for each issue as explained in the Proxy. A quorum of owners (159 of 317) is required to pass the listed issues. If we do not have a quorum our monthly maintenance fees will go up considerably. Only one Proxy is valid per property. If you own two properties, submit a proxy for each one. Please show your Unit Number, then date and SIGN your Proxy before submitting. The signature must be any owner on the title. If you change or have changed the title or mailing address since purchasing you need to let Progressive Management know.

You must submit your Proxy prior to 10:00AM on December 5, 2016.

There are several ways to submit your Proxy:

- 1. Drop in the mail slot at Clubhouse Director's Office.
- 2. Give to Jo Ann Barr any time, or drop off at 106 Cedar Elm Drive, put in black mail box at back door.
- 3. Mail to Progressive Management



It is recommended that your Proxy be dropped at the Director's Office or given to Jo Ann Barr. Mailing slows the tally process. Early submission insures there are enough proxies received to conduct business during the 2017 year.





DECEMBER

The month we celebrate several interesting religious/ethnic/fun holidays:

• HANUKKAH - December 24, 2016-January 1, 2017

Hanukkah commemorates the rededication of the temple in Jerusalem after it was ransacked by the ruling Syrian/Greek regime. The temple was left with only enough oil to light the candles for one night, but the oil miraculously lasted eight. That's why Hanukkah is celebrated for eight nights, beginning at sundown on December 25th. Traditions include lighting one candle of the menorah every night, eating fried foods such as latkes (to signify the importance of the oil), and playing the dreidel gambling game.

YULE – December 21st

Another name for the Winter Solstice, this holiday was celebrated centuries before Jesus Christ was born and marked a turning point in the season, when the worst of the winter was over. Animals were slaughtered so they wouldn't have to be fed so it became a natural feast time. A live tree was brought into the home and decorated with ornaments and edible treats. Yule traditions include decorating the inside of the home with evergreens and candles, as well as traditional plants such as holly and mistletoe, and burning the Yule log for 12 days straight.

• CHRISTMAS – December 25th

For Christians, Christmas marks the birth of Jesus Christ and began as a "mass for Christ". Christmas traditions include giving gifts (just as the three wise men brought gifts to the infant Jesus), Santa Claus (derived from Saint Nicholas, a bishop who gave generously to the poor) and a festive meal. Originally this featured goose, but was replaced by turkey when Europeans colonized the Americas.

• **KWANZAA** - December 26, 2016-January 1, 2017

Kwanzaa (Swahili for "first fruits") is a non-religious African-American holiday celebrating family, community, and culture that was started in 1966. It is celebrated for seven days. Traditions of Kwanzaa include lighting a candle each of the seven days, family gatherings, and festive meals. Gift-giving is not a part of the Kwanzaa tradition.

• **BOXING DAY** - December 26th

The origin of this holiday's name is not clear. In feudal times in the United Kingdom, the lord of the manor would 'pay' people who worked on his land in the past year with boxes of practical goods, such as agricultural tools, food and cloth. These were often distributed on the day after Christmas Day. More recently, employers traditionally gave their servants a gift of money or food in a small box on the day after Christmas Day. Some people in Canada still give gifts to people who provide them with services. Other stories relate to servants being allowed to take a portion of the food left over from the Christmas celebrations in a box to their families and the distribution of alms from the church collection boxes to poor parishioners. These traditions evolved into the Christmas baskets that some employers distribute to their employees during the holiday season.

• **FESTIVUS** for the Rest of Us December 23rd

If you don't celebrate any of the above holidays, but don't want to feel left out, you could start commemorating Festivus, the December holiday invented by Frank Costanza on the TV Show "Seinfeld". Instead of a Christmas tree there is a pole, which is central to the "airing of grievances" between family members. There is also a "feats of strength" component, which could be fun. You can see clips from the "Festivus" episode on You Tube.



Medicare 2017 Medicare open enrollment period (OEP) 2017 Medicare open enrollment Period is October 15, 2016 to December 7, 2016.

Medicare is for individuals:

- 65 and over
- of any age who have kidney failure or long term kidney disease
- who are permanently disabled and cannot work
- Medicare is applied for at your local Social Security office (SSO).

Some individuals qualify for both Medicaid and Medicare. Medicaid can sometimes be used to help pay for Medicare premiums. People who qualify for both programs are called 'dual eligible'.

Who Is Eligible For Medicare.gov Coverage?

As a rule, all persons 65 years or older qualify for Medicare coverage. If they have been a resident of the US for at least 5 years. All people with disabilities in the US are also entitled to Medicare.

What is Covered Under Medicare?

Basically, Medicare has four parts. Part A covers hospital stays and expenses. Part B is general medical insurance coverage. Part D is coverage of prescription drugs. Part C, also called Medicare Advantage Plan – is just another way to receive parts A, B and D.

Medicare Part D offers prescription drug plans (PDP) through private insurance companies. There are 10 national plans offered, including AARP Part D Coverage, and some regional plans. The estimated cost for the premium will vary with the plan but the current estimate for the average PDP is approximately \$37 per month. The premium cost is expected to increase annually. (Info taken from www.medicare2017.us)

The University of Chicago social neuroscientist John T. Cacioppo has done pioneering research on the startling effects of loneliness. A sense of isolation or social rejection can disrupt our thinking abilities, will power and also our immune systems. Loneliness can be as damaging as obesity or smoking. Cacioppo, in *Loneliness: Human Nature and the Need for Social Connection*, uses biological and social science facts to demonstrate that, as individuals and as a community, we have everything to gain managing our social connections.

Be kind to yourself during December. It is a busy month. Keep in mind that it is okay to say no if you feel overwhelmed or overscheduled. Gift exchanges with folks who have everything can be simplified by donating to local food pantry or a favorite charity on behalf of or instead of gifts that may not really be needed. When shopping, be very aware of your surroundings and your wallet. Be careful not to leave packages visible in your parked car. At least we don't need to worry about slipping on the ice!

To FLU or Not to FLU – shot that is!

any individuals opt not to receive annual Flu shot because they claim that it makes them sick. According to the Center for Disease Control http://www.cdc.gov/nchs/fastats/flu.htm, the vaccination does not contain any live virus or form of the flu. Each year the shot will provide protection against seasonal viruses research indicates will be most likely to infect people. Usually, up to six viral infections are targeted each year; the annual vaccination provides protection against those. Of course there are many more viruses which can be transmitted through the air, from sneezing, coughing or runny noses. Cover your mouth if you are sneezing or coughing; wash hands frequently helps to protect yourself. Throw away tissues after single use; or cough into your elbow rather than your hand.

It takes about a week after receiving the inoculation before you are protected. So, you may indeed still be able to get sick...but not from the shot or from any other viral infections during the season. In general, the CDC recommends anyone over the age of six months receive the flu shot. Certain groups of individuals are at higher risk for the flu and are strongly advised to get the shot. There is a very small group of people who should not get the shot; which really mean almost everyone should be vaccinated annually. Check with your doctor.

My doctor's office was out of the vaccine during my regular visit. Most pharmacies or minute clinics can give the flu shot; many insurance companies pay for the flu shot.

There are emergency warning signs for the adult population. If you have:

- -Shortness of breath of difficulty breathing
- -Pain or pressure in chest or abdomen
- -Sudden dizziness
- -Confusion
- -Severe or persistent vomiting

Seek emergency medical care urgently! Every year, over 4,600 people die from the flu or complications of the flu. More than 200,000 people are hospitalized annually with the flu. That alone is enough to encourage me to get the shot.

IF you do experience flu-like symptoms call your doctor or seek medical care at urgent care center, minute-clinic, or emergency room. Antiviral medications are available by prescription to treat those very sick with flu symptoms; these medications are most effective within the first 2 days of symptoms. Don't delay.





ASSISTANCE FOR ELDERS

Perhaps, you don't think you will ever have a need for the information below, but we are often surprised to find that we can't do many of the things we used to do. We tend to take these things for granted, so please read and take note of this information.

I was quite taken aback recently to realize that I am "Elderly"! I am also dismayed to find there are many things I used to do without a thought and am finding I am no longer able to do many of them! I recently attempted to get something out of the kitchen cabinet over the refrigerator. Without thinking, rather than go to the shed and getting my ladder with a hand grip on it, I grabbed a kitchen chair and attempted to climb onto it! What a surprise I got! I was several weeks recovering from that failed attempt and the bruises accompanying it! It could have been worse! I could have broken something and been down for the count! Falls are VERY DANGEROUS for folks of our age! If you don't have one, consider getting one of those gadgets when you can press the button for help.

I think there are many of us who are unaware of the services available to us at either reasonable rates or are covered by Medicare and/or other Insurance. Those not covered by either are sometimes provided no cost due to our financial ability to pay.

As we age, we find there are many tasks we can no longer accomplish or services we

cannot afford to get. There are agencies available to meet these needs and therefore allow us to remain in our homes.

Hospice is no longer just an end of life provider. They now offer many services for those of us in need, such as: Primary medical care, Adult day care, medications and supplies, Medically necessary transportation, In-home care and support and Social and emotional support. Most, if not all of these are paid for by Medicare or Insurance. To obtain further information about services available to you, call (727) 289-0062 or on the computer at EmpathHealth.org.

The Aging and Disability Resource Center can provide you with guidance as to where you can get the following: Caregiver Support, Case/Care Management, Financial Assistance, Food resources/Meals on Wheels, Homemaker/Personal Care, Housing Options, Legal Help, Long-term Care, Medicaid, Medicare/Health Insurance Counseling, Nursing Home and Assisted Living Placement, Prescription Assistance, Transportation and other services. They can also help you with Medicare Eligibility, Enrollment and Coverage Options, Long-Term Care Planning and Prescription Assistance Resources. Further information can be obtained by calling 1-800-963-5337 or on the computer at AgingCareFL.org.

Prescription Drugs are sometimes unaffordable and not covered by our insurance. These can, in many cases, be provided to you, at not cost, by the company who manufactures the drug. You simply need to obtain the 800 number for the company, call them and ask if they have a "Patient Assistance Program". If they do, request a form to apply. If, after submitting the request, you are turned down because you have Insurance, or any other reason, call and request a "Hardship Form". Complete & resend. If you qualify, they will provide the drug to you, at no cost.

There are many of us who have no family members to assist us, so these agencies are there to help us locate the assistance we need. No one should sit in our homes alone without the help to keep us as healthy as we can be, the medical attention we need, housekeeping services and nutritional food to sustain us.

Remember, with any calls you make, document the date, time and who you spoke with. Also make a copy of any forms you submit. This information will be of use if forms are lost or caller doesn't follow through, so you will have all of the information needed to resubmit.

Something else you may want to check is your Will or Trust Fund. If you have an attorney, check to be sure everything is current and correct. There have been recent cases where a person's assets have been tied up for years due to an improper Will or Trust. If you don't have an Attorney, get one, or check with the above agency for legal assistance.

And, last but not least, take a good look at your age and health to determine if you should consider going into a facility where you can get the assistance you need, whether it be Independent Living or Assisted Living. I'm sure you would rather choose the place than waiting too long and having someone else make the choice for you.

If you, or someone you know, need assistance of any kind, please avail yourself of the above mentioned services.
