PHASE 1 Clubhouse Usage

Joe Daley/Gene Arend

The Phase 1 Clubhouse and Recreation area is used by the Association, Social Club, Community Events, Individual Owner Private Events, and other recognized Not-For-Profit Organizations. In order to provide equal opportunity for all the community use, a calendar of these various events is available online for review. If you plan to use the clubhouse for an event, you must contact either Joe Daley or Gene Arend to schedule the event. Any event must be approved by the Board of Directors, the owners of the common elements. This procedure allows all owners to have access to the clubhouse for an event. If there is an event scheduled during a time period you wish to schedule, then either Joe or Gene can contact the parties involved, and see if the use of the clubhouse can be shared, by dividing the clubhouse, using the partitions in the middle of the clubhouse, or rearranging the time, or sections of the clubhouse. It is only through this process the clubhouse becomes equally available to the entire community. You can review the calendar online by going to www.mybriarcreek.com and clicking the tab "Clubhouse Reserve". This web page allows you to see the calendar, and request to reserve the clubhouse, using an online request form. You can also call Joe by phone. If you are requesting to use the clubhouse for multiple days (.i.e. every week on Monday, at a certain time), then specify the start and end dates of the event. Any "for profit" event must obtain written Board of Director approval and comply with the rules of use established in 1988 and amended in 2008





Why is it IMPORTANT to wear (or have) a Medical ID?

Have you ever gone to a Doctor's office and upon speaking with the Doctor and said, "what's wrong with me?" The Doctor replies, "what are your symptoms?" and you reply, "YOU tell me!" We all know Doctors and medical professionals are NOT mind readers and we must supply the basic information for them to begin their examination. Example: you would not find out what's wrong with your aching head if the Doctor only checks your hands for

problems there; nor would you expect to find out what's wrong with your hearing when you go to an eye doctor. This could be true life experience if your Doctor does not have all the pertinent information to begin the examination process.

A medical ID provides for quick recognition of any medical conditions, allergies, medications, or treatment wishes which leads to faster and more effective treatment.

Medical ID bracelets reduce errors in treatment, which can result from not having a patient's health record during an emergency situation.

A medical ID speaks for you if you become unresponsive in an emergency.

First responders and medical personnel are trained to look for medical ID jewelry in an emergency. Medical IDs will alert professionals of critical health and personal information. Another possibility for your medical information is to place this information on your refrigerator for emergency personnel to locate easily. Just place it on the refrigerator folded or in an envelope with 'EMERGENCY ID INFO' on the outside. Make it very visible!

There are many reasons for you and your loved ones to wear a medical ID when living with common or unusual medical problems. A medical ID can and will save your life.

WHO should have a medical ID?

Some possibilities are patients with: Alzheimer's/Dementia, ADD/ADHD, high blood pressure, diabetes, cancer, allergies, on dialysis, on blood thinners, lung disease, autism, heart disease, Asthma, COPD, blood disorders, have a pacemaker or defibrillator, epilepsy, etc...the list goes on and on.

So many in our park live alone, this can be a matter of life and death. We ALL laugh at the commercial that shows someone who has fallen and 'can't get up' but this is a major possibility for many of us here in Briar Creek. Anyone can fall at any given time. There is an old saying that 'pride goes before a fall' and it is so true. If you need help...ASK!

The Remembering past Christmas Seasons

S tanding at the kitchen counter this year, with my arms deep into sugar and flour, I started thinking about Christmas baking seasons in the past. All years are memorable in their own way but one stands out.

I had belonged to a Christmas Cookie Exchange with some dear friends for many years, sharing the happy memories of successful Christmas goodies, the tears over failed recipes, the yearly news update about families...jobs, marriages, children, school triumphs and disasters, college, children's' marriages and grandchildren. In 27 years, a lot of water goes under the bridge.
