What Do We Gain by Driving So Fast?

Coming home from work one day last week, I ran a little test. Starting from McMullen Booth, I drove all the way to the Phase II clubhouse at speeds between 20 and 25 mph. I timed the trip, then turned around and drove back to McMullen Booth, doing a steady 15 mph and timing that leg as well. Guess what? The slower return trip took an extra 38 seconds. Which means that, if you live at the easternmost end of Phase II, it will take you less than one minute extra to get to or from McMullen Booth. If you live in Phase I, then your extra drive time is 30 seconds or less.

We have many people that walk our streets, ride their bikes or walk their pets, at all hours of the day. Numerous residents have complained to me that people drive too fast through our community, and I couldn't agree more. One of these days, a resident is going to get seriously injured or even killed, all for the sake of shaving a few seconds off our trip in or out. Isn't a neighbor's life worth an extra 30 or 60 seconds out of your day? And remember: while the speed limit is 20 in Phase I, it's only 15 mph in Phase II. Please be respectful of that as you enter or leave our community.





If the Power Goes Out...How can you know if your frozen food is still good?

Simple. Take a small container of water and freeze it now. Once the water in the container is frozen, place a coin (penny, nickel, quarter) on top of the frozen water and place it back in the freezer.

If you needed to leave during the outage, or just have no idea how long food will remain usable, look at the coin. If it is at the bottom of the container, the water melted; throw out any frozen food...even if the water in the container re-froze. If the coin fell the power was out long enough for the ice in the container to melt completely which indicates your frozen goods thawed completely, too. No worries, if you neglected to do the coin trick, remember, "When in doubt, toss it out."

Guide for Wednesday Yard Waste Pickup:

This guide is from the Safety Harbor Sanitation Supervisor, Sherri Kennedy.

- 1. In order for yard waste to be recycled into mulch, it must be free of any contamination. Contamination means anything that is not pure vegetation.
- 2. Yard waste materials, i.e. grass clippings and leaves, must be placed in unlined garbage

cans, no larger than 32 gallons and curbside early on Wednesday mornings, **ONLY.** Sometimes, during Holiday periods, Yard Waste Pickup is suspended, in lieu of Trash or Recycling Pickup. The schedule change is always noted in the Safety Harbor News Letter, so pay attention to that.

3. Yard waste to bulky to be placed in a 32 gallon garbage can, i.e. tree branches and other vegetative materials must be cut into sections no larger than four feet in length and six inches in diameter, then bundled with twine in arm sized manageable bundles.

- **4. <u>Do Not</u>** use tape to secure bundled yard waste and **<u>Do Not mix</u>** paper or plastic in, this will contaminate the recycling process and will result in the yard waste **NOT** being collected.
- 5. For excessive piles of yard waste, larger than 5ft X 5ft, please call the Sanitation Div. at 727-724-1550, Ext. 2002, between 7a.m. and 3:30p.m., Mon. thru Fri. and request a special collection.

Please adhere to these guidelines so that we can preserve this valuable resource.

Alaska bound

hope that many of you have had the opportunity to visit Alaska, or that it is high on your bucket list. It is enchanting. The scenery is magnificent and the people we met fun and hard working.

We were lucky to be able to go on a 7 day cruise this July, and while I have seen a little of southern Alaska by land, neither of us have seen Alaska from the sea. So it was a grand new adventure for us both.

We sailed north from Seattle on the Joy (Norwegian Cruise Lines), and spent the first day "at sea". For us this was a lucky break after a tiring day flying up from Tampa the day before. The day did bring its excitements however, as we were sitting in the Observation Lounge when a pod of whales decided the ship needed an escort and they stayed around the bow of the boat for 20 minutes or so.

The Joy is a fairly large cruise boat, holding about 3,800 passengers and 1700 crew members. Fortunately the very top deck is set up as a kid's playground, including a go-cart track, a tube slide that snakes around and even protrudes maybe 20 feet outside the side of the ship. The slide is enclosed, but has clear plastic places where you can see the sliders during their ride. Despite July being a school holiday period and having several families on board, the top deck amusements kept the kids occupied.

Our first port of call was Ketchikan, a traditional old Alaska town nestled between the edge of the mountains and the sea. On our tour we did see a newer area where the houses are modern. But we loved the old town. We had chosen a tour which took us through town on a coach and then out on the water to see bald eagles, totem poles and a light house. And did we see eagles...at one point there was a group of 19 to 20 eagles on a sand bar in a river, and then we saw them on their nests, eating fish on the shoreline. Well, we also saw the lighthouse and the totem poles...the totem poles look most impressive in the setting they were designed for, outside the main village gathering place. Each totem pole tells a story, what primary clan lives there, what other clans live nearby and whether they have a medicine man etc. The day was lovely, the tour boat small and personal, and this added up to a wonderful day.

On the second day we were in Juneau, the state capital. And yes, we did see the Governor's mansion from which Sarah Palin could see Russia, and from which she moved because she didn't appreciate the roosters crowing in the neighbor's yard early in the morning. We had chosen a tour which combined whale watching and then a visit to the Mendenhall Glacier.

Both were impressive, we saw plenty of whales, spouting and flipping their tales as they dove deep. The glacier is beautiful but it was depressing to be shown the amount the glacier has receded in recent years. Not very long ago the glacier came to a point just below the Visitor Center they had built. Now it is a long trek to the base of the glacier, longer than our tour bus stop would allow.

We left Juneau early afternoon and sailed to Holkham Bay. This is a narrow fjord, and we started to see small icebergs drifting past us, and eventually these became large chunks of ice in a delicious shade of blue. When we arrived at Dawes Glacier, we were the only cruise boat there, and it was beautiful, peaceful and a very powerful image. The cruise line set up a coffee and drinks station out on the open deck where you had the best view (and as it was starting to chill down, they had blankets too). The captain kindly turned the boat so people on both sides had a great viewing opportunity. Seeing the glacier from so close was a humbling experience.

The third day saw us in Icy Point Strait, in the small town of Hoonan. For us, this seemed like the ideal future for Alaska. Hoonan is a small community, and they have developed the cruise port facilities and all the tourist amenities with their own funds. So no cruise line owns any part of the operations. The buildings are strong, well built and well designed. The tourist amenities are great and include the longest zip-line ride, a 6 person experience each with their own zip line, starting at a point higher than the Empire State building. Neither of us was tempted to try this. But we were proud to see the strength of the community spirit that is guiding this town's development. Surely this is the ideal face of modern Alaska.

Instead, we chose to look for more whales, and seals, and then went on a bear hunt. Well, we were not armed, but the group was accompanied by an armed native hunter. Fortunately the bear we did find stayed on the other side of the small river, long enough for everyone in the group to get all the photos they wanted.

At this point we had to head south, with another day at sea, arriving in Victoria around noon the next day. I had lived in Victoria for 17 years so this was all familiar territory. We had chosen to go out to Butchart Garden, which we had both visited before. But our choice was not the best. The gardens were so crowded, so many busloads of people, and so many groups of tourists all of whom had to have their photo taken in front of the same great site, and often with each person in many different poses. This made it almost impossible for others to pass by or see the beautiful gardens.

The evening ended well however, as our late sailing time (10.30pm) allowed us to meet with a grandson and his girlfriend for dinner. So we sailed out of Victoria with happy memories, just in time for a quick pack. The luggage was picked up outside our room and we didn't see it again till we arrived in Tampa. This seems to be an arrangement with the port of Seattle and only required a simple sign-up a couple of days before. They tagged and transported the luggage for us, arranged all the transfers and it certainly made for an easy disembarkation.

So an Alaskan cruise is no longer on our bucket list, but we would love to go there again.


