UTDOOR WATER USAGE

Watering of lawns should be done with consideration for the whole community as there is only a single water meter that monitors the water usage in both Briar Creek Phase I & II. The water bill reflects the water usage in both communities. When lawns and other outdoor plants are watered, to the point that water is running down the street into the storm drain, this is a waste of a precious natural resource as well as a lack of concern for fellow ...continued on page 6

residents who pay through their monthly condo fee for the water used in the communities. When water restrictions are put in place by Pinellas County, usually this time of the year and other times, when rain is in short supply, residents are required to follow county regulations regarding the use of water to ensure that there is a sufficient supply for everyone in the County. Residents need to follow the restrictions and if water is running down the street, it indicates that the ground can no longer absorb it and the water should be turned off. It is better to water several times than try to get it done all at once and waste water. I have been called out several times with what residents believe is a water leak only to find that someone's lawn or plants are being over watered and I then have to ask them to stop. I ask all residents to show respect for their fellow residents and our precious natural resources and use water responsibly.

TRASH/RECYCLING/YARD WASTE COLLECTION UPDATE IN BRIAR CREEK

SANITATION COLLECTION UPDATE – ESSENTIAL SERVICES ONLY

Due to Executive Order 20-91 issued by the Governor on April 1, 2020, and the Public Health Emergency caused by COVID-19, the City of Safety Harbor has reduced staffing levels in order to maintain proper social distancing as recommended by the CDC. Only essential services are being provided at this time.

Until the order is lifted, the following services are being amended by the Public Works, Sanitation Division, BEGINNING Monday, April 13, 2020.

Spring Clean-Up for the month of April will be suspended.

Sanitation crews will ONLY service garbage and recycling CANS/TOTERS, bulk pick-up will be suspended. This enables pick-up to be completed almost entirely by automated trucks and a single person. Bags or items placed outside of the cans/toters will NOT be collected.

Wednesday Yard Waste Collection will be suspended. Special Pick-Ups will be suspended.



SLOW THE SPREAD

Listen to and follow the directions of your STATE AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

Those of you who know me also know that I enjoy cooking. On that note, since everyone has to cook a little more than usual these days anyway, I thought you might like to try a new recipe or two. They are both simple and quick to make and very tasty. In each case, you can freeze extra meals with what you have left and just reheat a meal on a day that you don't feel like cooking.

Bon appetit!

HOMEMADE BEANS

(my grandmother's recipe)

400F for $\frac{1}{2}$ hr, then 350F for 3-4 hours until beans are dark and soft <u>1 lb Thompson's White Pea Beans (</u>can substitute navy beans if you have to)

- Boil beans with 1 tsp salt until skin is loose when you blow on a few beans in a spoon the skin peels back. Approx 1 hour
- Keep covered with water while cooking.

Transfer beans & water to granite roasting pan or equivalent then add:

- 1/3 cup regular molasses (not blackstrap or cooking)
- 1 tsp dry mustard
- salt & pepper to taste
- $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ lb bacon cut in 1" pieces
- 1 med onion cut in quarters
- ¹/₄ cup brown sugar

Mix gently. Bake in oven and keep beans covered with liquid. At end of baking time, the liquid should be thicker.





PULLED BEEF OR PORK

- Fairly lean roast SAUCE:
- 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce can of Hunts tomato sauce
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup ketchup
- 1 cup coarsely chopped onion
- 1/3 cup white vinegar
- 1/3 cup packed brown sugar

- 1 tsp chili powder
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 2 tbsp regular molasses
- (not blackstrap or cooking)
- 2/3 cup water
- 1. Place roast in crock pot/slow cooker.
- 2. I double the recipe for the sauce because the meat absorbs lots. In a large bowl mix all ingredients. Pour all the sauce over the roast.
- 3. Cook on LOW for 8 hours or on HIGH for 5 hours. Depending on the type of slow cooker and heat options, you may need to adjust the time and temperature.
- 4. When done, pull meat apart using two forks.
- 5. Serve on a large bun or with mashed potatoes.

N.B.: If you don't have a slow cooker/crock pot, you can also bake in the oven at 300F for 6 hours.



This reminder of water restrictions comes from our Board of Directors; they would also like to remind you that at no time should the water run in the streets.

Safety Harbor's Water Restrictions

Updated August 1, 2017

or Pinellas County Utilities customers, lawn watering is limited to a twiceper-week schedule using potable, well, lake or pond sources as follows:



- Addresses ending in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, 9): Wednesday and/or Saturday
- Addresses with mixed or no addresses, such as common areas associated with residential subdivisions: Tuesday and/or Friday
- Lawn irrigation is prohibited between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Handwatering and micro-irrigation of plants (other than lawns) can be done on any day at any time, if needed.

New lawns have a 60-day establishment period. On days 1-30, they may be watered any day of the week. During days 31-60, they may be watered three days per week. Even-numbered addresses may water only on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday. Odd-numbered addresses may be watered only on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday.

Customers are encouraged to follow these tips provided by UF/IFAS Pinellas County Extension:

- Water only when plants or lawns start to wilt.
- Consider using soil moisture sensors in line with your irrigation system to automatically gauge water needs and operate sprinkler timers.
- If mowing is necessary, increase mowing height to the highest setting to reduce stress on lawns. The lower the cut, the less drought resistant the lawn will be over time.
- Make sure irrigation systems are operating at peak performance by checking and clearing filters in the system.
- Clean and properly direct sprinkler heads.
- Do not use fertilizer during dry conditions because it increases a lawn's thirst for water.
- Remove weeds to lessen competition for available water.
- Use mulch to keep moisture near roots of plants.



D ue to COVID-19 "social distancing" recommendation, we have postponed distribution of the BC neighborhood survey until we are all safe to interact again. (Thank you to the 35 residents who already completed the survey!) In the interim, we thought we would give you some interesting information about the evolution of Briar Creek.

The original BC Phase 1 model homes were on display in February 1977. Warren Hughes, President of Dynamic Realty developed Briar Creek. Greg A. Knutsson, executive vice president of Briar Creek described in the St. Petersburg Times, that Briar Creek was "a project that shook up the industry." Howard and Lee Hetzler were the first settlers. **Does anyone have stories about them?**

The ad to buy homes in BC stated: "Look what a \$39



maintenance fee buys! A 6000 sq ft clubhouse, pool, heated whirlpool, 6 lighted shuffleboard courts, street lights, underground utilities, city sewer and water, lawn mowing, professional management, 2 laundry areas."

The elevation in Briar Creek ranges from 15 to 45 feet above sea level with 5.3 units per acre. The lots ranged from \$5,995 to \$8,995 with the homes starting at \$18,900 furnished and a **free decorator service**. There were no white homes, the units were soft colors to blend in with the trees and grass. A special strain of bug-proof St. Augustine called Floratam was used to sod all the lots. If you have ever noticed the stone accenting the clubhouse, it was handpicked at Candy Mountain, NC.

The first Dial Directory was published in January of 1978. October 1978 was the first annual Trash and Treasure sale that netted \$516.22. The 1979 Tash to Treasure netted \$872.95. It just keeps getting better and better. The Monthly Media began on March 1, 1979 with Ellie Coxen as Editor.

The first coffee hour was held on July 27, 1977 on Wednesday morning so the neighbors could get to know each other and learn what is going on in the park. The first social event was a covered dish supper with music, cards and dancing. On August 31, the BC Social Club was inaugurated with Howard Johnson as the President. Social Club activities included: Pancake Breakfast, Halloween Party, Christmas Tree Trimming party, first New Year's Eve party, Cards and Games, Square Dancing instructions, All States Dinner, monthly educational movie that can "increase our store of knowledge on many subjects." They had an evening coffee for those who work during the day.

Make it a good day in the neighborhood!!

Information in this article is from BC Phase 1 Volume 1 Scrapbook. It is being rebound and then will be returned to the library. We look forward to continuing the Briar Creek story in the monthly media with the assistance of the Phase 2 historian Karen Johnson.
