#### SANITATION & RECYCLING RATE INCREASES <u>CITY OF SAFETY HARBOR</u> <u>EFFECTIVE DATE: JANUARY 1, 2020</u>

#### Background

In preparing the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget for Briar Creek#1 last summer I was in contact with June Solanes, Finance Director for the City of Safety Harbor, to find out if there would be any increase in rates for Sanitation and Recycling. At that time I was informed that there were significant increases to both Sanitation and Recycling. The City Commission contracted with Stantec Consulting Services to conduct a study of the City's rate structure for Sanitation due to a 6.00% increase in the cost to dispose of waste at the County's Waste-to-Energy facility and a \$200,000.00 increase in the cost to drop off recycling at the City of Clearwater.

Objectives of the study were to conduct a Revenue Sufficiency Analysis for the next five years. The results of the rate study were presented at the December 2nd workshop of the Commissioners and the Directors of Public Works and Finance. The study presented two options:

<u>OPTION#1</u> – Eliminate Recycling and send everything collected to the Waste-to-Energy Facility at the County. Combine Sanitation and Recycling rates into one combined rate. This

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Option would increase the rate by 5.25% on January 1, 2020 and annual increases of 5.25%. In this Option pickups would remain the same – for Briar Creek Monday's and Thursday's.

 $\underline{OPTION\#2}$  – Continue with the current system – Sanitation pickup on Monday and Recycling pickup on Thursday. This Option would increase the rate by 6.00% on January 1, 2020 and annual increases of 6.00%. This Option would also combine Sanitation and Recycling rates into one combined rate.

The results of the study were presented twice at City Commission Meetings – First at the December 16th meeting and finally at the January 6th meeting.

I attended the January 6th meeting and at that meeting there were discussions/opinions from all the City Commissioners and the Mayor and in addition there were several opinions and questions from Residents of Safety Harbor. A few of the concerns/opinions voiced at that meeting:

- How much of the material collected from Recycling actually gets recycled as there is lot of contamination in what is collected for Recycling. The contamination is due to items put in Recycle Bins that are not able to be recycled. Example: pizza boxes as they have **food left on them and any other items that have food remaining on them.**
- It was pointed out by June Solanes, Finance Director that it costs \$110.00 per ton to send it to the Recycling Facility as opposed to \$40.00 per ton to send it to the Waste-to-Energy Facility. She also expressed a concern as to what future recycling costs would be.
- Commissioner Cliff Merz's concern is the amount of material being brought to the Recycling Center that is being rejected and then having to be sent to the Waste-to-Energy Facility to be disposed of at an additional cost.
- Several Residents voiced their opinion that if it costs more to recycle that it is OK as they don't want to regress back to just disposing of all trash.
- Other residents stated that the City should educate the Public on what can and cannot be recycled as this may cut down on the amount of contamination.

These discussions lasted over two hours and at the end the Commissioners voted to:

- Continue Recycling with an increase of 6.00% as of 1/1/2020 and additional 6.00% increases annually for the next five years.
- Eliminate the separate rates for Sanitation and Recycling and go to one rate.
- Over the next twelve months study and quantify the amount of contaminated recycling that goes to the Recycling Facility that then needs to be then transferred to the Waste-to
- Energy Facility.
- Increase education to the residents concerning proper Recycling and what can and cannot be recycled in an effort to cut down on the amount of contaminated recycling.
- Look at this subject again in the next year and probably every year to evaluate the current system.

## **........**

I want to let everyone know that your current monthly maintenance fee of \$170.00 includes the increase in Sanitation and Recycling Rates so this will not affect you financially. Additionally, pickup for both Trash and Recycling will remain the same: TRASH WILL BE PICKED UP ON MONDAY AND RECYCLING WILL BE PICKED UP ON THURSDAY.

I have been in contact with the City's Director of Public Works and she is working on a new enhanced Guideline for Recycling. If you need a **recycling container** you can pick one up at the Sanitation Department which is located at 1200 Railroad Ave in Safety Harbor.

REMEMBER IF YOU IN DOUBT – THROW IT OUT RATHER THAN PUT IT IN THE RECYCLING BIN!


## **BUNCO PHASE II**






