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# FROM THE BOARD

### Town Hall Update



resident request was made at the Town Hall in early November regarding the merging of two lots and the requirement to pay two Maintenance Fees. The Board reviewed and researched the request. The response given to the residents follows.

November 25, 2019

To: Margaret Thompson Debra Parkinson Units 320/321

To begin, we would like to thank you Debra and Peg for your detailed presentation of this concern and for allowing the Board time to research and consider your request. We have reviewed your request by researching our governing documents, confirming with Pinellas County and considering the ramifications of a decision. Our responses follow.

1. We do not use garbage pickup, water services etc. allotted to two homes so why should anyone have to pay double Maintenance if it is only one home?

Response:

- •We have many residents who are only here in the Park part of the year. They also pay for services not being used.
- •There are several residents who own more than one lot. They could be vacant lots or homes that cannot be rented for a period of one year. They do not use services but are required to pay Maintenance on each lot
- •To approve this request would require giving consideration to all of these scenarios as well.
- 2. The County Property Appraiser has confirmed that on record, these two lots are considered to be one property.

Response:

• That is correct. However, the request was made and approved for Tax Roll purposes/ Homestead reasons only. The lots have not and cannot be merged without a 100% membership vote. ...*continued on page 6* 



3. While the lots combined allowed for a larger home, the two lots individually may not have been large enough to put a home on either lot.

Response:

• Correct. Perhaps not for a double wide, but a single wide may well have fit.

#### Facts to consider

- As mentioned, to merge lots would require a change to our governing documents. In this case, it is a change to the Prospectus. That change requires a 100% membership vote. Maintenance fees pay for the park infrastructure, not just services used on individual lots. Some residents choose not to use certain, or any, amenities but all must be maintained. The fee is established by cost analysis divided by the number of membership certificate holders. Changing the number of lots would require restructuring fees and higher payments for all residents.
- The original purchase investment by a resident of two lots is valued at 70,000.00. Merging into one lot makes the investment valued at only 35,000.0

In view of these considerations the Board has determined that two lots = two Maintenance fees and we cannot reduce your Maintenance obligations to only one.

Again, we would like to thank you for your professional presentation of this concern and regret we cannot offer a more positive outcome for you.

Our Committee is responsible for one bulletin board outside on each mail station the one on the side. We will post miscellaneous ads for residents only.

Any death notice posting requests should be made to me (Linda Whalen) via email at lswhalen@att.net or by phone at 727 244 4034, by a family member. Small but dignified notices will be posted as promptly as possible on the main bulletin board.

For miscellaneous ads, the Office has been and will continue to be the point of contact for posting them on the bulletin board on the side of each mail station. Once contacted, Bobbi Villar in the Office will get in touch with the Committee Chairperson to get the ads posted on the outside Boards. Here's our protocol for ads on these 2 bulletin boards:

- 1. Print on 2 3x5 cards or papers of that same size, in order to accommodate as many ads as possible.
- 2. Any pictures should be pasted to and fit on the same card/paper.
- 3. No full letter size ads will be considered for posting there. Absolute largest is 4 1/4" x 5-1/2" and they will be posted only if there is room for that size.
- 4. Please put your name, phone #, Lot #, and date requested on each posting. Information not needed for the ad can go on the back of the card for management purposes.
- 5. Take the 2 completed ad copies (appropriate size) to the Park Office and let them know you would like them posted on the outside boards near each mail station.
- 6. After 30 days on the Boards, ads will be considered outdated and will be removed right around that 30 days end.
- 7. At that time, if your ad is still relevant, please submit a new posting.
- 8. Please consider using the larger bulletin boards in the Clubhouse when possible. The outside Boards are much smaller and do not offer as much space.



For those residents that have been gone a while, here are some suggestions to improve your time at Clearwater Cascade:

- 1. On your phone, add a contact: "CC Pool Codes" where you can save the new code(s) when changed. You'll have the info on hand if you carry your phone.
- 2. Use your cell phone to take a picture of any bulletin board information you may want to remember later, and then transfer the info to your calendar at home.
- 3. Be sure to have on hand, a copy of the latest Park phone directory and monthly Chronicle (our newsletter). The office has copies of the latest directory and the newsletter will be delivered to your home at the beginning of each month.
- 4. Become familiar with the Clearwater Cascade website at: www.clearwatercascade.com.
- 5. Sign-up for and/or use OneSource for things like financial reports and minutes.

ASK MIKE By Mike Hoit

Recently, I received an inquiry about a walking lane or sidewalk along Orleans Way, the entrance into Clearwater Cascades. The intent was to make walking along the thoroughfare safer during the darker night-time hours. After a bit of investigation I found that the only option that would pass Pinellas County scrutiny would be a sidewalk. And that would be an expensive option, especially on the heels of our water project, and would trail a list of expensive projects already on the the blackboard.



Some other options have been suggested; more signage, solar lights and reflective paint walk lanes on the roadway. The walk lanes, while a nice idea, wouldn't work because the road lanes must be a minimum of 10' wide and Orleans Way is just that. A walk lane would reduce the road lane below the minimum. Solar lights might be an option, certainly less expensive than a sidewalk. Perhaps the Board could look into this option. Finally, more signage warning walkers to walk on the left and drivers to watch out for walkers in the roadway. Really!! Do we need more signs on Orleans Way. If you have other ideas, let me know. As an alternative for now I would like to pass on these tips to make walking on Orleans Way safer for everyone.

- 1. Walk facing traffic. Not only does it make good sense, it's the law. Florida law says "Walk on the left, facing traffic".
- 2. Cross the roadway safely. If you need to cross, stop, check for traffic and walk straight across to reduce the time you are in the traffic lane. Don't stroll across on the diagonal.
- 3. Walk on the road single file. Walking abreast promotes conversation and you are less likely to observe oncoming traffic. (If you must walk abreast, make sure you're the one closest to the curb.)
- 4. Be visible. Unless you're a Ninja on a clandestine operation, don't go walking in dark clothing. Light colored clothing, reflector vests or shoes with reflective strips will make you more visible to motorists.
- 5. Pay attention. Put the cellphone away and turn down/off the music player. Distracted walking, like distracted driving, can lead to trouble.
- 6. Keep a short leash. If you are walking a pet along a roadway, keep them on a short leash. Animals darting into traffic can be dangerous for them and you. Even though pedestrians have the right-of-way I always say that motor vehicles have the right-of-weight. Don't assume that drivers are watching out for you, watch out for yourself. Enjoy your walk, follow these simple rules and stay safe.
