<u>Memorial Day Holiday</u> – The Business Office will be closed Monday, May 25, 2020 for the Memorial Day Holiday.

May 10th - Happy Mother's Day to all our mothers!

Park Patrol – Park Patrol has a new phone number; this one is much easier to remember. It is 727-400-1928.

<u>Parking</u> – The business office continues to get complaints about residents and their guest parking on the grass. This is a violation, please refrain from parking on the grass. The park allows parking on the street up until 11:00 so as a last resort, if there is no room in your driveway, park on the street.

<u>Pets & Support Animals</u> – PLEASE HELP us keep cost down! During my COVID-19 "Safer at Home" period, I began reviewing the pet and support animal information we have on file. So many residents have not provided their pet or animal's recent vaccination documentation. Looking on the positive side, I am sure the vaccinations have been updated because we all care of our pets. Residents have probably forgotten they need to provide Clearwater Cascade with a copy of the paperwork they received from their vet. How can you help save money? By providing a copy of your pets most recent vaccination. Otherwise, we will need to spend money and time generating letters not to mention the required postage to send letters and *...continued on page 6*



request this information so our files will be up to date.

Access Control System – A new Access Control System has been installed on all common areas doors, except the laundries. Soon residents will be notified to come to the office and obtain their entrance pass cards. Entrance pass cards will have resident's photo and homesite information, in addition to their individual code. The code will register each of us when we enter a facility. Should something happen in one of our facilities, the business office will be able to print a report of who entered the facility during the time of the event. That will enable us to contact those persons and inquire if they witnessed anything. This is an exciting improvement to Clearwater Cascade and will be a big help in keeping people who don't belong here, out!

<u>Storage Compound</u> – Effective June 1, 2020, fees for storing a vehicle or vessel in the storage compound will increase to \$100 per month, each.

<u>**Rules Reminder**</u> – Section XVII, item 14 of the Rules and Regulations– "The Co-op patrol is sanctioned and empowered by the Board of Directors to check on any unusual activities within the co-op at night. They can easily be identified while driving the co-op truck or golf cart or by their uniform. They are authorized to enforce the rules and notify the violators of said infractions. They will file a written report with the business office defining the infraction and, if necessary, they are instructed to alert the local police of any perceived serious situation."



Oiy's Fried Rice Recipe

Equipment

- A rice Cooker, or whatever else you normally use to cook rice
- A frying pan, 10 inch round by 2 1/2 inch deep, or whatever else you think might work
- Measuring cups and spoons
- Knives
- Cutting boards
- Bowl
- Spatula

Ingredients



- 3 cups uncooked rice, long grain Jasmine preferred (don't use low quality rice, it makes a difference)
- 2 boneless/skinless chicken breasts chopped fine, again stick to a quality brand.
- 1 large yellow onion, chopped
- 2 cloves of garlic, peeled and smashed
- 1 tablespoon ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon MSG, monosodium glutamate, also sold as Accent`
- 1/4 cup soy sauce, later add more to taste if necessary
- 4 large eggs, whipped together in a bowl, you will be scrambling them for the recipe
- 4 stalks of green onion chopped fine, use the whole onion including the bulb
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil

Process

- 1. Add the rice to the cooker and 3 1/2 cups of water; follow the directions for your particular cooker
- 2. Add oil to frying pan, heat for 2 minutes under medium heat
- 3. Add the yellow onion and garlic, sauté for a minute
- 4. Add the finely chopped chicken breasts; cook until done, about 4 minutes
- 5. Push the chicken to the edge of the pan forming a hole in the middle of the pan
- 6. Add the eggs cook scrambled until done, about 2 minutes*
- 7. Add the salt, sugar, MSG and pepper, then mix well
- 8. Add the cooked rice and soy sauce and mix everything together well for about 2 minutes
- 9. Add the green onion and mix well again
- 10. Taste and adjust seasonings and soy sauce if desired.
- 11. *the eggs may be scrambled separately and added if you like them a little more fluffy.




