# Help for Severe Aortic Stenosis



Severe aortic stenosis is a narrowed aortic heart valve that doesn't open and close properly, reducing blood flow to the rest of the body.

TAVR is a minimally invasive alternative to open-heart surgery used to treat failing aortic heart valves in patients with severe aortic stenosis. Morton Plant Hospital was chosen as the first hospital in Tampa Bay to offer the TAVR procedure for patients with severe aortic stenosis who were at an intermediate or high surgical mortality risk. Our team has completed more than 700 TAVR procedures over the last five years.



# Ancient 'lunch box' found in Alps

rcheologists have discovered a 3,500-year-old wooden "lunch box" high in the Swiss Alps, according to Fox News. Although objects made of wood or leather rarely survive intact over long periods of time, similar finds have been made in the Alps, including 5,300-yearold mummified remains of Otzi the Iceman, which were found in two containers made of birch bark.

The box was discovered in melting ice near the top of a mountain. A chemical analysis showed that its contents contained traces of grains—possibly wheat and rye—that could have been the ingredients in a porridge. The findings could help scientists explore where and how cereals spread across ancient Europe to become an important food crop.

## New moon around a distant star

stronomers have discovered thousands of exoplanets—worlds outside our solar system—but now many believe they've discovered the first moon circling another planet around another star, according to the BBC News website.

NASA's Kepler Space Telescope searches for exoplanets by looking for slight dips in a star's brightness when a planet crosses in front of it. Hunting for exomoons means looking for a dimming of starlight before and after a planet produces its drop in the light. One promising signal was observed during three such transits around a star some 4,000 lightyears from Earth. Dubbed Kepler 1625b, the moon looks to be approximately the size of the planet Neptune, orbiting a planet the size of Jupiter but with 10 times Jupiter's mass.

Scientists will look for evidence from the Hubble Space Telescope to confirm the findings.

## Overcome the power of negative thinking

Being creative calls for positive thinking, but optimism isn't always easy. Negative thoughts can creep into your mind when you least expect them. The trick isn't to fight them, but to manage them so they don't paralyze you. Here's what to do:

• **Identify the triggers.** When you have a negative thought, stop and ask yourself what's bringing it on. You may be tired or stressed out, or you may be affected by someone else's perspective. If you can locate the cause, the thought itself won't have as much power over you.

• Focus on the now. Worrying about the past or the future isn't productive. When you start chastising yourself for prior mistakes or seeing disaster around every corner, stop and take a breath. Ask yourself what you can do at that moment to succeed. Giving yourself something to do will distract you from destructive thoughts.

• **Replace the negative.** If you find yourself plagued by a recurrent worry, train yourself to think of something else. Memorize a short poem, phrase, or meditation that you can repeat to yourself when you have negative thoughts. Your conscious mind can concentrate on only one thought at a time, and driving the negativity away will free you up to move forward again.

# Get past the obstacles when you paint

Just because you're not Picasso doesn't mean you can't find satisfaction and enjoyment in art. A course in drawing or painting can get you started, but when you're searching for ideas or subjects to work on, consider some of these approaches:

• Seek inspiration. Spend time looking at art—paintings, sculpture, drawings—for ideas. Listen to music to stimulate your creative juices.

• **Start small.** If you're hesitant, or blocked, don't tackle a big art project. Start with something small and easy. Work on one section of your painting, and don't think about the rest of the project. You'll make progress and your success may give you the momentum you need to continue.

• Switch things around. If you usually paint or draw horizontally, switch to vertical. Instead of painting what you see, paint what you feel. If you draw with your right hand, try switching to your left. A small change can make a big difference.

• **Try an exercise.** Find inspiration in a common phrase such as, "Once in a blue moon." Draw or paint your interpretation of that saying. What kind of rare occurrence springs to your mind? How would the world look under blue moonlight? Choose other clichés and catch-phrases to illustrate, and you'll keep your perceptions sharper.

# **Driverless cars coming to a street near you?**

Drivers can't wait for self-driving cars, according to a survey by Bosch Mobility Solutions. Out of 1,000 U.S.-based new car buyers 18 years or older, 52 percent said they expect to own a self-driving vehicle within the next 10 years. Only 14 percent said they'd never buy a self-driving car, and 14 percent were undecided.



Although 72 percent of survey participants signaled worries about lack of control in a vehicle they don't drive themselves, 61

percent said they believe self-driving cars could lead to a decrease in traffic accidents, and 55 percent highlighted more free time and less stress as a benefit to driverless cars.

# Why kids stay home longer

T's not just a stereotype: More and more young Americans are living with their parents, the U.S. Census Bureau reports. According to a recent study, one in three Americans age 18-34 were living in their parents' home in 2015—some 24 million people. In 1975, the figure was closer to one in five.

One reason: Young people are delaying marriage longer than their older counterparts did. Eighty percent of Americans were married by age 30 in 1975, but nowadays that 80 percent figure isn't reached until age 45.

Younger Americans are also dealing with high student loan debt, which makes staying at home a convenient way for them to pay bills and save to rent an apartment or buy a house.

# Coffee + nap = more energy

Ant to take a nap that will leave you refreshed and ready to go again? Try drinking a cup of coffee first.

It sounds counterintuitive, but that's the advice from the Health.com website. The reason why it works: The caffeine in a cup of coffee takes about 30 minutes to kick in. After a 30-minute nap, you'll wake up just as the caffeine takes effect.



Research backs the idea up. In 1997 the journal Psychophysiology reported that sleepy adults who drank 200 mg of caffeine (twice the amount in 8 ounces of brewed coffee) and then took a short nap performed better on a simulated driving test than people who got only the caffeine.

Keep your naps short—15-30 minutes—and take them at least six hours before your regular bedtime so the caffeine doesn't keep you up at night. If you're sensitive to caffeine, try green tea instead.
