1. June 1st was the start of Hurricane Season. Preparation may be needed for those fulltime residents. The following was done by Bill Smith as an update to the hotels/motels that can accommodate folks in the case of mandatory evacuation. Please remember that all mobile/ manufactured home communities are MANDATORY evacuations. Thank you to Mr. Smith!

\*Listed below are some hotels/motels we contacted about accommodating people in case of a mandatory evacuation.

North of Doral

 Hampton Inn 392184 US #19 (north of Klosterman Rd. on west side of #19) Tarpon Springs Ph. 727-945-7755 Room rates range from \$99 per night to \$130 per night Continental breakfast included.



2. Quality Inn

38724 US #19 Just north of Klosterman Rd. on west side of #19)

Tarpon Springs

Room rates range from \$79 per night to \$109 per night (some suites available) Continental breakfast included.

3. Innisbrook Resort

Room rates: \$109 two people; \$200+ for suites accommodating 4 or more people.

Breakfast not included - several restaurants available on grounds.

\*\*Special: Once an area evacuation is declared, Innisbrook will institute a program for "evacuees" that includes a lower rate. Units in Innisbrook are spread out among several two story buildings. Grounds include: several restaurants and snack shops, six pools, tennis courts and four golf courses. Buildings are very well constructed.

In closing and in an attempt to be of service, if you haven't already provided a copy of your mobile home title(s) or title number(s) to the Business Office, please do so. In a catastrophic event, your personal records could be lost or destroyed. Since there is no policy as to how an address is entered into the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles database, it can be difficult for them to locate some title information in a timely manner. For example, U.S. Highway 19 N., US HWY 19 North. We can put all title information onto a spreadsheet and back it up at the Management Company for you. This may be beneficial if such an event were to occur.

- Guy Garvey, musician. "Just start scribbling. The first draft is never your last draft. Nothing you write is by accident."
- Polly Stenham, playwright. "I'm very fidgety, and I seem to work best when my hands are occupied with something other than what I'm thinking about. During rehearsals, I find myself drawing little pictures or symbols that are somehow connected to the play."
- Tamara Rojo, ballet dancer. "An idea never comes to me suddenly; it sits inside me for a while, and then emerges."
- Mark-Anthony Turnage, composer. "If you get overexcited by an idea, take a break and come back to it later. It is all about developing a cold eye with which to look over your own work."
- Fyfe Dangerfield, musician. "For me, the image of the tortured artist is a myth—you don't need to be miserable to write songs. In fact, if I am feeling down, the last thing I want to do is write; though it's important sometimes just to sit down and get on with it, however you're feeling. Your creativity is like a tap: if you don't use it, it gets clogged up."
