


articles in the Monthly Media but because of sudden changes and updates some activities cannot be planned in between publication dates.



MATT AND GRACIE SMITH #638

There are very few families left in Doral Village who were there in the beginning when we became a resident owned village.

Doral Village transitioned from being a village owned by one man, Gordon Marsden, to one owned by the people who live in it. This change happened in 1986. It was a huge undertaking for the residents back then and I'm sure we are all thankful for the work they put in. Matt's family is one of these founding fathers. In fact, Matt has been visiting Doral Village since 1973 when he was a teenager. He remembers the transition days. He remembers US19 being a 2-lane road, not the fast and furious 8 lane highway it is now. Matt's maternal grandparents, Ed and Myrtle Baker first moved into Doral Village in 1972. They bought # 319. Back then Doral as we know it didn't exist. It was owned by a real estate company owned by Mr. Marsden, and it was called Doral Mobile Home Villas. In fact, Matt has some wonderful photos of Doral being developed. Back then Sections 6,7 & 8 didn't exist. His grandparents came originally from Detroit, Michigan. They had one daughter, Marie who was born and raised in Detroit MI. She was also related to Marsha Dixon. Marie was in her late 40s when her parents moved to Doral Village. She was a regular visitor from then on with her husband and children. Marie was married to Bernard Smith. They snow birded for several years after her father passed, and they always stayed with her mother. In 1999, after her mother had passed Marie and Bernard sold #319 (to Betty McNeill) and purchased # 638. This is the home Matt and Gracie now live in. Bernard passed away in 2007. Marie, who was well known in Doral Village, served her time on the RO board and was a very active member of the Doral community until her death in 2018.

Matt is now the 3rd Generation of his family to live in Doral Village. Matt was born in Detroit, Michigan in 1958. He was raised and went to school there and as soon as he left school he went straight to work at General Motors. He started his career as an auto worker in 1976 in Detroit. He worked there for 15 years at Fisher Body Livonia. He then transferred to GM in Tennessee where he met his wife Gracie. He worked there another for another 15 years. He retired early at 48 years old. Matt has 2 children from a previous marriage.

Gracie was born in 1957 in Erie, PA and moved to Bowling Green, Kentucky when she was very young. She grew up there and her family still lives there. Bowling Green is a historic town, once the Provisional Capital of Confederate Kentucky in the American Civil war. It boasts a famous Corvette Museum, right next door to the factory where these iconic cars are made. Does anyone remember the song Bowling Green by the Everly Bros released in the late 1960s? She worked for GM in Spring Hill, Tennessee. She worked at the Saturn car factory. That's where she and Matt met. She retired in August 2009 after working in the auto industry for 22 years. Once they both retired, they spent 2 months at a time snow birding to Doral and




