Homeowners Association

he meeting of the HOA took place on Tuesday, March 10, 2015. We have only one (1) more meeting for the season which will take place Tuesday, April 14, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. in the Manor House.

Membership

Do you know that the Homeowners Association has the power to negotiate your rent increases? Without the numbers in membership the owners' (Equity Lifestyle Properties) will know that it is obvious that people in our community aren't aware of how important their participation is. For instance, there are no caps or limits regarding rent increases in the Florida Statutes.

Our membership numbers are at its lowest since I have lived in the park. As a member of the Board for eight (8) of the 11 years I have lived here, I can attest to the fact that over the years the selected rental committees have worked their hardest in trying to keep the increases to a minimum through negotiations with the owners. These negotiations are not an overnight or one meeting discussion. It is months' of gathering information from taxes, through what the rates are at comparable parks. It is a process of letter writing, meeting with ELS managers (from Tampa). This process will start again about mid-2016. A rental committee will be selected for this process at the beginning of 2016. Only through your participation we can show Equity Lifestyle Properties that we are united. The Community Manager does not set your rental increases. Remember Equity Lifestyle Properties is a powerful corporation that is a business to make as much money as they can. Let's not have them do it on our backs.

We not only negotiate the rent, we also are the liaison between management and problems within the park. We are here to make sure that they are staying within Florida Statute 723 by maintaining the property to the best that it should be. We meet and discuss possible upgrades and safety corrections. We presently have a manager who does care, and has gotten more done in her year and half here than any other manager has been able to accomplish.

The Board asks everyone to please consider joining the Homeowner's Association and to help strengthen YOUR community!

Manor House: Please remember that when anyone uses the Manor House for any functions, private parties and etc., they also must set things back up the way they were. Also we need to at least to look under the tables for any leftover food as we only have someone clean once a week and if food lies on the floor it could cause critters we don't want to see.

<u>Pool</u> – Last month there was a problem with the hot tub. Apparently a filter for the heater could not be found, but it was found, shipped and fixed. The fence around the pool has been power washed.

<u>Fire Hydrant</u> – After speaking the Chief of the Largo Fire Department we were told that our community (as many others) are up to code from when this community was established as far

as the number of Fire Hydrants that are in our park. He did inform us that when going into our type of community they send trucks that contain water on board. There are no local or county laws that would enforce the owners to upgrade to the present City Codes.

SAFETY DATA BASE: We are getting many others interested in our Safety Data Base that is held by the Homeowners Association. This is not for Association members only. It is for all residents of our community.

This would be your Plan B. We now have over 50 people in the data base that will only be used if you have an emergency. It gives us the information of the person you would want contacted if something should happen to you. This is not for single people only, couples should also participate. The Manager's Office closes on Fridays around 4 p.m. and does not open until Monday morning (if a holiday, Tuesday morning) and therefore there is no way to get the records for your next of kin or your designated person. We would also like everyone to be aware of the activity on your street. Even though you might not know your neighbor, be mindful if something looks amiss. We ask everyone to seriously think about "how will your "person" be contacted if you are not conscious. This data base will be kept with the HOA and is confidential and will not be used in any other way.

<u>Safety</u> – A quick reminder to be watchful of your surroundings and neighbors. If you see something that doesn't look right please call the police first. If it is a non-emergency contact the office during work hours or me (Linda-330-6059) in the evenings and on weekends. There have been many cases of things being stolen within the park. Please be sure to lock bikes and golf carts up at night. The Largo Police Dept. has suggested that we mark under the seats of both the bikes and golf carts "Down Yonder and your lot number". This way if they are found they can return it to you.

Volunteers are always welcomed and needed for many aspects of the functions that the organizations have during the year. Anyone interested in giving a helping hand please contact either myself or any board member of the HOA, the Community Association or Ladies Auxiliary. We are also looking for late night people to take one week a month to lock up the Manor House and Pool. Please call me or contact our manager if you are able to do this.


