

### FLORIDA IS A UNIQUE STATE IN WHICH TO GARDEN. IT CAN BE FRUSTRATING BUT ALSO REWARDING FOR GARDENERS.

### The Spring Vegetable Garden

n early to mid-March, once the threat of freezing temperatures is greatly reduced, warm-season crops can be planted in the garden. But, remember if you plant early...you may need to protect young seedlings if the temperatures drop.

Warm-season vegetables...those that will produce through mid-June (some longer) are:

Beans (bush and pole), corn, cucumbers, eggplants, melons, peppers, potatoes, yellow squash, tomatoes and zucchini.

Herbs:

Basil, dill, fennel, marjoram, Mexican tarragon, oregano and parsley.

Garden Tip: Rosemary is a great year round herb to plant in the garden...even if you don't cook with it. It doesn't freeze, it's fragrant and it makes a great looking landscape plant.

Planting seeds is most economical, but to harvest tomatoes before summer's heat and humidity arrive, you'll need to start your seeds in pots the first two weeks in January, and bring them indoors to protect them from cold weather. If you're just getting started now, buy already established plants from a local nursery and plant directly into the garden.

Garden Note: You can still plant cool-season varieties such as: broccoli, carrots, lettuce and radishes that should produce into May (better to get them planted by February 15th). But,



into May (better to get them planted by February 15th). But, if you have limited garden space, you may want to stick with warm-season varieties for a longer harvest time.

To extend the tomato season into summer, try the new heatresistant varieties available such as: Solar Set and Sunmaster, or plant some cherry tomato varieties which will do better during the hot months. My favorites are chocolate cherry, black cherry and sun gold.

### **Tomatoes In The Florida Garden**

By James M. Stephens

The tomato, a relative of pepper, potato, and eggplant, is not only the most important commercial vegetable in Florida, but also is the most popular garden vegetable. It can be grown successfully by many methods of culture: in baskets, in solution, on stakes, on the ground, mulched, unmulched or in a greenhouse.

### <u>VARIETIES</u> <u>Staking (Indeterminate) Large Fruit</u>

`Floradel' — once a leading vine-ripe commercial variety; seeds hard to find. Fruit large red. Resistant to Fusarium wilt (1); gray leafspot; and graywall.

`Tropic' — another hard one to find, but worth looking for. Fruit large red. Resistant to Fusarium wilt (1); vert. wilt; gray leafspot; graywall.

`Manalucie' — another old commercial standard staking type. Large red fruit. Resistant to: Fusarium wilt (1); early blight; gray leafspot; graywall; leaf mold.

'Better Boy' — nationwide favorite that does well in Florida. Resistant to Fusarium wilt (1); vert. wilt, and root-knot nematodes.

`Bonnie Best' — grows better in North Florida than South Florida. Medium size red fruit. Likes cages.

'Manapal' — old Florida variety. Medium size red fruit.

'Bragger' — Has produced good yields of 1-pound fruits in organic amended soils.

### Indeterminate (Small fruit)

'Red Cherry' — fruits are  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches diameter. 'Sweet Chelsea' — vines vigorously; fruits profusely ( $1\frac{1}{4}$  inch).

'Sweet 100' — beautiful 'hands' of fruit that are 1 inch or less in diameter.

'Sweet Million' — Fruits similar to cherry types, but produced in extra-long clusters.

### Bush-type to Semi-vining (Determinate) Large Fruit

'Walter' — old standard, large red fruit, resistant to: Fusarium (1 and 2), gray leafspot, graywall.

`Suncoast' — New deep red inside and out, large fruit; resistant to Fusarium (1 and 2), vert. wilt, gray leafspot. A University of Florida release.

'Floramerica' — Award winner. Large red fruit. Resistant to Fusarium wilt (1 and 2), gray leafspot, gray mold, crown rot.

`Flora-dade' — Recommend this one. Big red fruit; resistant to Fusarium wilt (1 and 2), vert. wilt, gray leafspot.

### **HOW DO WE COME UP WITH SOME QUICK CASH?**

**Executives:** 20th Century Fox's TV division (per-Murdock)

**Background**: No one at Fox expected much from M\*A\*S\*H when the Korean War sitcom debuted on CBS in 1972. The executives simply wanted to make a cheap series by using the M\*A\*S\*H movie set again, so it was a surprise when it became Fox's only hit show. A few years later, the company was hard up for cash. When M\*A\*S\*H's ratings started to slip after two of its stars left, Fox execs panicked.

**Decision**: They decided to raise cash by selling the syndication rights to the first seven seasons of M\*A\*S\*H on a futures basis: Local TV stations could pay in 1975 for shows they couldn't broadcast until October 1079, four years away. Fox made no guarantees that the show would still be popular; the \$13,000 per episode was nonrefundable. But enough local stations took the deal so that Fox made \$25 million. They celebrated...

Impact...but prematurely. When M\*A\*S\*H finally aired in syndication in 1979, it was one of the most popular shows on TV (it ranked #3 that year). It later became one of the most successful syndicated shows ever, second only to I love Lucy. Each of the original 168 episodes grossed over \$1 million for the local TV stations. Fox got nothing.
