The Federation of Manufactured Home Owners Organization has strived to balance the interest of shareholders with those of home-owning renter in ROC'S. There are disputes between ROC and HOA that Chapter 723 applies to Homeowners renting in ROC'S while Chapter 718 or Chapter 719 applies to shareholders and their boards. Chapter of the State statutes such as Chapter 617 apply to all HOA'S that are non-profit.

ithout an HOA, there is no representation of the homeowner to ROC and the park

The FMO as an organization encourages all Homeowners, regardless of their shareholder or non-shareholder status, to work together to ensure that manufactured home community life is still worth living. Whether you are a Homeowner who rents a lot in an ROC, or a shareholder in the ROC, remember that your lives will be far more pleasant through cooperation than they will be through confrontation.

our Seasons Estates ROC, Inc. was awarded for the second time in the last three years as one of three "Associations of the Year" by the Suncoast Community Association Institute (CAI). A plaque is hanging on the clubhouse wall. It takes teamwork for these accomplishments!

The winter mowing schedule is in effect – There were 3 cuts in January, so the February date is February 14.

The new coach at #480 is for sale and another new coach for #483 arrived in January. Be advised – pricing is at dealer cost. Anyone interested in the new coaches should contact Desiree, our licensed dealership agent. A sign has also been placed at lot #366 stating that it is available for anyone to put their new home there. Two new privately owned homes at #352 and #345 are in place and near completion.

observe all stop signs – for everyone's safety.

I continue to work with Matthew Gredzlo, Pinellas County canal rep, regarding the growth in the canal and along the banks. He sprayed the canal near the first of the year. Some rains helped push algae which attaches to hydrilla downstream. We continue to remove any dead trees and invasive plants throughout the park which helps to lessen the likelihood of necessary plumbing or sewer pipe repairs while also beautifying the park's environment. Please notify the office if you see anything that needs our attention. Brian Anderson, City of Largo Public Works Department, was out in the first part of January to perform two cleanup visits on the channel. I hope to get some clarity from that point on regarding whose stewardship that maintenance falls upon after that. A work in progress.

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It is important for all our residents to let Desiree know when you leave the Park and, of course, when you return. This updates our computer system for necessary mailings and other park information. And for the safety of all residents it is imperative that we know which units are occupied or unoccupied.

It is always helpful to know when guests are visiting. If they are using the pool, please be sure that they are wearing green identification bracelets. And a reminder to all: if you are the last person out of the pool, remember to put the rope back across the pool. We could be cited if the pool is empty and the rope is not in place – should a Department of Health inspector make a surprise visit.

If you notice a street light out in your area, jot down the number on the pole and give Desiree a call. She will notify Duke Energy for repair. We still have one light pole in the middle circle waiting to be replaced by Duke Energy after being damaged and removed during the summer.

For those owners who wish to have Alexander's (or any individual/other company) care for your planter and/or flower beds while you are away, I am requesting that you deal directly with Alexander's and contract with them. The office also has other names that perform these tasks that can be provided with the caveat the office is not "recommending anyone" but offering a list for your choice & consideration. FSE office will not be responsible for any contractual agreements between a home owner and Alexander's (or any individual/other company). You must deal directly with the company (or the individual) – phone 727-535-7314 or info@alexanderspm. com. Ryan Hudson is our representative and is usually in the Park on our mowing days.

We also continue to appreciate your cooperation on our trash/recycling pick-up days. Trash in a covered trash receptacle will keep the streets clean & animals /birds under control. An instructional flyer will be left at your coach's door when a proper trash receptacle is not implemented. Our Maintenance Team is doing a great job – thanks, Joe, James and Leo.

For those residents that make a purchase of any major appliance, be advised that the store/company from which you purchased that new appliance will usually take the older appliance with them when the new one is delivered at no cost.

id you ever consider how much your thought life affects your standing with God? The Bible talks about our thinking. Some places in the Bible talk about our bad thinking and some places talk about our good thinking. A battleground is our mind because that's one place where we are attacked by the devil. Satan knows that if he controls our thinking, then he can control our whole being.

In the Bible's the book of Proverbs, King Solomon gives us instruction concerning our spiritual life, and other areas too. He makes a timeless statement that is a principle of God. Proverbs 23:7 "for as he <u>thinketh</u> in his <u>heart</u>, so is he...." Solomon makes this statement in the middle of speaking about moral, ethical, and spiritual precepts. A non-perishable food item will be your admission to our Music & Friends nights! Please be generous.

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



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
