

on January 5th. Please be sure to remove all your holiday decorations from the lawn.

Tampa Bay Plumbers has cited many additional areas of original valves in the north part of the park. The areas are marked with stakes spray-painted white.

We continue to monitor the condition of the water in the channel between FSE and Pointe West. In early December, the City of Largo was out with a huge dredging tractor/machine and I have requested a timeline for future work. I will keep you informed as that schedule becomes known. The channel (between Pointe West and Four Seasons) is the responsibility of City of Largo. The larger canal is maintained by Pinellas County.

Please take particular note that STOP SIGNS have been placed at each exit of the park as you drive on to 101st Street. Placement of these new signs was required by City of Largo as part of the permit process for the Sealcoat project done by Asphalt Maintenance Company during the summer. Please be sure to observe all stop signs in the park, particularly now that many residents are walking and riding bikes. Make sure the lights on your golf carts and bikes are in good, working order. And, if you notice a street light out in your area, jot down the number on the pole and give Desiree a call. She will notify Duke Energy for repair.

The current FSE Rules & Regulations are being reviewed under the direction of the ROC Board.

We appreciate that many of you have taken care of your planters, removed weeds, power-washed your coaches and painted. All of this makes our park more attractive to our current residents and potential buyers. Carport clutter must also be kept to a minimum. It is incumbent for each owner to maintain his/her own home for the benefit of the entire community.

For those owners who wish to have Alexander's (or any individual/other company) care for your planter and/or flower beds while you are away, I am requesting that you deal directly with Alexander's and contract with them. The FSE office will not be responsible for any contractual agreements between a home owner and Alexander's (or any individual/other company). WHERE IN THE WORLD HAVE YOU BEEN?

Jackie and I enjoyed a magnificent trip to Guanacaste, Costa Rica this past summer. Bill and Jan Vendl, our good friends from Long Beach, CA, joined us. We've known each other since the mid-60's when we served together in the Coast Guard for a number of years in Yorktown, VA. We shared a lot of memories, old stories and catching up over the last few years.

We started off with a great flight on Jet Blue from Buffalo to our connecting flight out of JFK in NYC direct to Liberia airport in Costa Rica. Jackie and I haven't flow in quite a while, so we were surprised when all we got to eat for the eight hour total flight was some pretzels, cookies and drinks. I guess the days are gone when they gave you a sandwich, chips, a piece of fruit and drink. Oh well!

We stayed at a real gem of a hotel, the RIU PALACE, 2 years old, a 5-star all-inclusive (room, food, drinks, entertainment, activities, no tipping), aimed at the couples market, on the Pacific shore.

Our suite was modern, clean, king sized bed which was made up within 15 minutes after we went to breakfast. Each suite has its own hydrotherapy bath, a refrig. (which was serviced every morning with beverages and other goodies) and a bar which had vodka, scotch, rum and brandy. If you want additional types of liquors, all you needed to do was ask. Gourmet eating 24 hours a day; a main buffet restaurant; 4 specialty restaurants; a 24/7 restaurant/bar; 5 other bars; and 24 hour room service. Tried a few new drinks (chocolate martinis/ lumumbas, etc) and new foods. (In spite of that, I gained only 3 pounds and Jackie only 2 pounds).

The live entertainment was very professional with a different stage show every evening - "Grease", "Michael Jackson Tribute", Las Vegas, etc. There were 3 pools with the usual water activities. One of the pools had a bar that served both shore side or you could swim up and have your drinks in the pool. We did leave the property to take a non-Disney "Jungle Cruise" and viewed some of the local fauna and animals in the wild. We saw various tropical birds, crocodiles (both adults and babies), two species of monkeys (the black howlers and the white faced), some very large and some small iguanas. Visited a sugar cane plantation (tasted the raw sugar and pressed 2 canes with the help and strength of an oxen and collected a big pitcher of juice, we also tasted the sugar through the various stages of processing). Went to another area and made our own tortillas from scratch. We ended our day by visiting a small colonial village called Santa Cruz. There we watched them make some very beautiful pottery.

No language problem since most of the staff is multi-lingual. And whereas in the USA we blame things on the illegal Mexicans, the Costa Ricans blame the illegal Nicaraguans. There is also a casino, discotheque, small shopping village and convention center as part of the resort. The RIU resort chain is international and we look forward to staying with them again soon. All-







There are also recycling bins in the Clubhouse (under the new counter by the front door) for eyeglasses, cell phones, flags, and Labels for Education. Recycle containers are also by the soda machine in the clubhouse and in the pool area. We will pick up trash and recyclables EVERY MONDAY AND THURSDAY. Please rinse any jars, bottles, and cans. 


